1. **Minutes of the BOG's meetings dated 7<sup>th</sup> July - Confirmation of.**

The Board of Governors confirmed the minutes of the meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2011.

2. **Personal hearing to Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society's Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Vidyagiri, Satara.**

Read: the matter with regard to personal hearing to Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society's Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Vidyagiri, Satara.

The Board of Governors considered the personal hearing to Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society's Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Vidyagiri, Satara with regard to Establishment of New Medical College in the name of Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Khatav, Satara by Shri Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society, Kolhapur and passed the following order:-

**"ORDER**

Pursuant to the order of the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi dated 14.7.2011 passed in the Letters Patent Appeal (L.P.A) no. 544 of 2011, We, the Board of Governors in Supersession of the Medical Council of India, gave a hearing to the representatives of Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society (hereinafter Society) in terms of section 3B of the Indian Medical Council (Amendment) Act, 2010 on its application under section 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 for establishment of a new medical college in the name of Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Khatav, Satara by the said Society on 18.07.2011. at 10.45 A.M.

The Society was represented by Shri Abhinav Mukerji, learned Advocate alongwith Shri Nitin P.B. Pawar, Director of Society. It is relevant to mention here that the date and hearing of time was mutually agreed and modified having regard to the exigencies of the situation.

The Board of Governors in terms of the order dated 17.6.2011 by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Special Leave Petition No. 16233 of 2011 passed the order No. MCI-34(410/2011-Med/24115 dated 13.7.2011 and the order contained following deficiencies and the same is reproduced herein for the sake of ready reference:

*"Sir,*

*I am directed to inform you that an assessment to assess the physical and other teaching facilities available for grant of Letter of Permission for establishment of a new medical college in the name of Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Khatav, Satara by Shri Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society, Kolhapur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 was carried out on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2011. The assessment report dated 29<sup>th</sup>& 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2011 was considered by the Undergraduate Medical Education Committee & Board of Governors and noted the following deficiencies:-*

- “1. Seating capacity of Lecture theatre is 100 each against the prescribed norms of 120.
2. Central Library - an area of 1600 sq. mtr. has been earmarked, however presently only 2000 sq.ft is available.  
  
Seating capacity – 100 against requirement of 200.  
Books available – 848 against requirement of 1400  
Journals – no specific mention.
3. Hostel -  
  
Students capacity – 100. However, the assessors have commented that the hostel accommodation is being shared with Ayurveda College.  
Resident capacity – Nil against required 42.  
Nurses capacity – Nil against required 35.
4. Beds -  
  
Medicine & allied – 114 against requirement of 120.  
  
No beds in TB & Chest, Skin & V.D. and Psychiatry against the requirement of 8 beds in each.
5. OPD attendance -  
  
Average 332 against requirement of 400.  
On day of assessment 252.
6. Bed Occupancy -  
  
Daily average mentioned as 77%  
On the day of assessment – 21%
7. Clinical Workload – no cesarean sections are being done. On the day of assessment no major surgical operation done and no normal deliveries.
8. Laboratory work – No Histopathology/Cytopathology work being done.
9. Intensive Care units -  
  
PICU/NICU – 1 bed less.  
  
On the day of assessment not a single patient in any ICU.  
  
No facility for central AC/central oxygen/suction.  
  
No case in labour room.  
  
Assessors comment – facilities & equipments in ICUs not adequate.
10. Radiology -  
  
One static unit of 500 mA is deficient.  
  
Ultrasound – one unit is deficient.
11. Blood bank:  
  
No facility.
12. CSSD:

*Sterilization facility is there but there is no central sterilization department.*

*Assessor comment - Sterilization facilities & staff - inadequate.*

13. *Teaching faculty:*

*In the departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Bio-chemistry, Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine & Community Medicine – No faculty present except for one tutor.*

*Among other departments, there were one assistant professor in Medicine, two Asst. Prof. in General Surgery, One Asst. Prof. in OBG and One Tutor each in Paediatrics & ENT. However, none of these doctors had any appointment letters.*

14. *Nurses -*

*Nursing Supdt. Nil against two.*

*DNS Nil against one.*

*ANS Nil against four.*

*Nursing sister Nil against 27.*

*Nurses 29 against 141.*

*Further, the essentiality certificate dated 23/12/2010 issued by the State Govt. of Maharashtra is not as per format prescribed in the "Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999" and also the Affiliation Certificate issued by the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik is provisional and conditional.*

*In view of the above, the Board of Governors decided to return the application as disapproved for Establishment of new medical college in the name of Institute of Medical Sciences and Research, Khatao, Satara by Shri Chatrapati Shivaji Education Society, Kolhapur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956, for the academic year 2011-12.*

*As per the aforesaid decision of the Board of Governors, the application, in original, for establishment new medical college in the name of Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Khatao, Satara by Shri Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society, Kolhapur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 is being returned herewith as there is no provision to keep the proposal pending in the Council office. However, you are free to establish afresh for the next academic year 2012-13.*

*A copy of the assessment report is enclosed herewith."*

The Hon'ble High Court in its Order of 14.07.2011 desired that the Board of Governors should afford an opportunity of hearing and thereafter pass a speaking order.

As stated above a hearing was given on 18.7.2011 in terms of provisions contained in Section 3 B of I.M.C. Act, 2010.

The representative of the Society submitted that the medical college has been established in a rural area and for the said reason, a sympathetic consideration should be given. A detailed written representation was submitted on 18.7.2011 and the summary of the written submissions which is placed as Annex 1 was also read out by Mr. Nitin Pawar, Director of Society on 18.7.2011.

We have given due consideration to the submissions and also gone through the detailed written representations. We are of the unanimous opinion that the Society has failed to meet the requirements of the Regulations and therefore, the letter of permission cannot be granted for reasons recorded herein below:

## **I. TEACHING FACULTY**

The Assessment Teams consisting of Dr. A. K. Agarwal, Dean/Principal, Maulana Azad Medical College, New Delhi; Dr. K.K. Deepak, Professor of Physiology, All India Institute of Medical Sciences, New Delhi, and Dr. C. Mohanty, Professor of Anatomy, Institute of Medical Sciences, Banaras Hindu University, Varanasi inspected the College on 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2011 and they have noted in their Assessment Report that in the departments of Anatomy, Physiology, Biochemistry, Pathology, Microbiology, Pharmacology, Forensic Medicine, no faculty was present at the time of inspection except for one tutor. It was also noted by the Assessment team of the eminent professors that in other departments also, there was one Assistant Professor in Medicine, two Assistant Professor in General Surgery, one Assistant Prof. in OBG and one Tutor each in Pediatrics and ENT. It was also noted by the Assessment team that none of these doctors had any appointment letters.

Shri Pawar submitted and referred to his letter dated 29.6.2011 annexed as Annexure 12 to the representation that the inspection was without giving them prior intimation and therefore, teaching staff could not be physically available as they were attached to some other colleges. Shri Pawar referred to page 103 and 104 annexed as annexure-13 of the representation to contend that the Society has appointed 31 faculty members and 17 tutors and 18 Senior Residents and 24 junior residents and 175 nursing staff.

We have considered the submission and took note of the papers shown to us. The admitted position of the Society reflected from the letter dated 29.6.2011 bearing reference no. SCSES/IMS&R/MYN/14/2011-12 that the Society has not even appointed teaching staff and admission to the said effect has been made in the said letter that teaching staff are attached to some other colleges and is placed at Annex 2. The same is reproduced here for the sake of ready reference:

It is relevant to point out that as per the "Establishment of Medical College Regulation, 1999" it is mandatory that the faculty has to be full time and working in a given college. It is also relevant to point out that if a faculty is found in more than one medical college as per Regulation 8(3) (1) (d) of the Establishment of Medical College Rules, 1999 the College will not be considered for renewal of permission and the permission can be denied for a period upto two years.

So far as the list of appointment of 31 faculty members annexed in the representation is concerned, and as per the records provided to the Council, joining report of many faculty Members is not provided. Further, many Faculty Declaration Forms were found to be incomplete. With regard to tutors, residents, nursing staff, only the number of persons employed is mentioned in foot note of annexures.

It appears to us that no appointment whatsoever has been made and for the said reason only, necessary details as required in prescribed declaration forms have not been provided. Thus, there is not only violation of Regulation but the college fails to meet barest of faculty requirements.

## **II. CLINICAL MATERIAL**

### **A. OPD Attendance**

On the day of assessment, the Assessment team noted attendance of 252 out patients against the requirement of 400 outpatient as laid down by the Medical Council of India.

In the representation submitted during the course of hearing on 18.7.2011, the Director of the Society submitted that the OPD attendance on the day of Assessment i.e. 29<sup>th</sup> June till 5. 30 P.M. was 307. An explanation was offered that awareness camps, health camps about the availability of Hospital facility are being resorted by the Management for increase in the number of OPD attendance.

We are of the view that the number of OPD patients are admittedly less than the requirements laid down by the Council under the "Requirement to be fulfilled by the Applicant Colleges for obtaining Letter of Intent and Letter of Permission for Establishment of the New Medical Colleges and Yearly Renewals under section 10-A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956".

The permission cannot be granted in anticipation that by spreading awareness, the OPD attendance will rise in future. The Regulation envisages that on the date of inspection the College must possess all the requisites mentioned in the Regulations. The permission can be granted to a college to admit the students only when it is having adequate clinical materials and not otherwise.

### **B. Bed Occupancy**

On the day of Assessment, the Assessment team noted bed occupancy of 21 per cent against the claim of the College that it is having 77%.

As per submission made by the representative in hearing that the bed occupancy has gone upto 64 per cent on the date of assessment and not 21%. In order to substantiate its claim, the Society has filed photocopy of purported I.P.D. records.

We have perused the I.P.D. records. From perusal of I.P.D. records, it is observed that records of indoor patients of 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2011 did not contain complete address nor phone number of patients. The signature column of I.P. records is also blank.

The representative has not placed any other material to contradict the conclusion of the assessment team. We have no reason to disbelieve the Assessment Report which has found that the bed occupancy is to the extent of 21 per cent only.

The Assessors in their Report have noted that no cesarean sections were being performed on the day of assessment. Further, the Assessor have noted that on the day of assessment no major surgical operation was done and no normal deliveries had taken place. The Society in its representation has submitted that ante natal camps are being organized and this would help to increase ante natal registration.

We have noted that the number of surgeries and the number of deliveries per day in the representation is Nil. Further, surgical operation and normal deliveries was not done on the day of assessment.

Hence, there is inadequate clinical material in the Hospital.

### **C. Radiology:**

The Assessors in their Report mention that "one static unit of 500 mA is deficient".

The Society during the personal hearing informed that they have placed an order for static unit of 500 mA and it would be delivered within 3 weeks.

We are of the view that as per the representation submitted on 18/07/11, order has been placed for Static X-Ray Unit by the Society. However, it has not been commissioned yet and was not functional in the College. In view of the above, deficiency of one X-Ray unit of 500mA has not been rectified.

### **Intensive Care units**

#### **PICU/NICU**

The Assessment Report states that there is 1 Bed less in the ICU, and on the day of assessment there was not a single patient in any ICU.

The College in its representation has stated that 2 more beds are provided in Intensive care units - PICU/NICU and the total bed strength is 6. They have also stated that free Medical camps were being organized, which would help them to increase patients inflow.

We are of the view that while the bed strength of ICU is mentioned, there is no mention about the patients in ICU. The requirement of the Regulation is that the hospital attached to the college at the time of grant of letter of permission must be in a position to provide adequate clinical workload and we in anticipation of future increase in workload cannot permit the college to start the teaching of M.B.B.S. course.

### **D. Labour Room**

It is stated in the Assessment Report that there is no case in labour room.

The College in its representation has stated that 3 labour rooms are functional and labour for patients are conducted. It was also submitted that Society is also organizing free medical camps which would help the Society to increase patient's inflow.

We have noted that the number of deliveries that were conducted are not mentioned and only empty assurance has been given.

### **E. Laboratory work**

The assessors report stated that no Histopathology/Cytopathology work was being done.

The Society in its representation has stated that equipments are being purchased for Histopathology /Cytopathology work. At present, the said facility is being done at local pathology lab. However, the provision is made to start the said facility in the Hospital.

We are of the view that the equipment are still under purchase. Histopathology and Histology Department are not fully functional. At present investigations are referred to the local pathology lab outside the college campus which is not permissible as per the MCI norms.

#### **F. Central Sterilization Service Department**

It is stated in the assessment report that Sterilization facility is there but there is no Central Sterilization Service Department.

It is stated in the representation that the provision for Central Sterilization Service Department is made. Some machineries have been purchased and installed and further it was stated that purchase of some machineries have been ordered.

We are of the view that the equipment required for CSSD are in the process of being purchased and few machineries have been ordered. However, there is no functional Central Sterilization Service Department available as on date. Hence, the deficiency pointed out by Assessor has not been removed.

#### **G. Blood Bank**

It is stated in the assessment report that there was no facility for blood bank.

The college in its representation submitted that the facility for the blood bank is being availed from the local blood bank. The college also stated that they were taking steps to get permission for installing new blood bank in their hospital from the State Blood Transfusion Council, Maharashtra State, Mumbai.

We are of the considered view that ideally there should be a blood bank facility inside the hospital itself and they have as per record not even applied for licence for blood bank.

### **III. NURSING STAFF**

The Assessors in their Report had noted that against the requirement of 2 posts of Nursing Superintendent, 1 post of Deputy Nursing Superintendent, 1 post of Assistant Nursing Superintendent and 27 post of Nursing Sister, there were none on the said positions. Further, against the requirement of 141 Nurses, there were only 27 Nurses.

The College has in its representation stated that 2 Nursing Superintendent, 1 Deputy Nursing Superintendent and 4 Assistant Nursing Superintendent and Required Nursing Staff (Nursing sister and Nurses) have been appointed.

We note that neither the names nor the Joining Report in respect of Nursing Superintendent, Deputy Nursing Superintendent Assistant Nursing Superintendent, Nursing sister and Nurses have been furnished during the course of hearing or alongwith representation.

### **IV. ACCOMODATION REQUIREMENT**

#### **A. Accommodation facility for students (Hostel)**

The assessors have commented that the hostel accommodation is being shared with Ayurveda college.

The college in its representation has stated that this was a temporary arrangement as the hostel is owned by their education society. They have also stated that there were 21 excess rooms available in girls hostel which would accommodate 63 girls students and 16 excess rooms were available in boys hostel which would accommodate 48 boys students.

We note that the construction work for the hostel was not yet complete as per the letter from the Architect dt.16.7.11 which is reproduced as annexure 3 of the written representation. Further, the hostel was shared with Ayurvedic college which is not permissible under the MCI norms. Hence, presently required accommodation facility for students is not available.

**B. Accommodation facility for Residents**

The assessors have said in their report that while 42 rooms were required for accommodation as on the date of inspection, there was no such facility available.

The Society in its written representation has stated that accommodation facility for 50 residents had been provided in rented premises and 30 residents doctors had their own accommodation in Mayani area. They were also making provision for 50 resident doctors in the hostel building that was being constructed.

We are of the view that the rental accommodation, own accommodation outside the campus and building under construction cannot be taken into account under Regulation. Only fully furnished accommodation is required to be taken into account. Hence, presently required accommodation facilities for the resident doctors are not available.

**C. Accommodation facility for Nurses**

In the assessors report, it is stated that there were no facility for accommodation for nurses against the requirement of 35.

The representation submitted by the college states that accommodation facility for 35 nurses had been provided in rented premises; as also provision for 40 nurses was being made in the hostel building which was under construction.

We are of the view that the rental accommodation, own accommodation outside the campus and building under construction cannot be taken into account. Only fully furnished accommodation is required to be taken into account. Hence, presently required accommodation facilities for the nurses are not available.

**V. TEACHING FACILITIES**

**A. Lecture Theatre**

It is stated in the Assessors Report states that seating capacity is 100 against the prescribed norm of 120.

The college in its representation has stated that the seating capacity for 120 students are being made and the area of lecture theatre was 1200 sq.ft.

We note that as per the representation submitted and in terms of the letter of Architect reproduced as Annexure I to the representation, the work of extension of the present class rooms with 100 students to accommodate 120 students was still in progress. Hence presently Lecture theatre with the required 120 capacity is not available.

**B. Central Library**

It is stated in the assessors report that an area of 1600 sq.mtr had been earmarked, however presently only 2000 sq.ft. is available.

The Society in its representation has submitted that the present arrangement is made for Central library in the area of 3750 sq.ft. and the order for furniture had been placed for the same. However, central library would be shifted in an area of 1600 sq.mtr which is earmarked and under construction.

It is noted in the assessors report that the library had seating capacity for 100 students against the requirement of 200 students.

The Society in its representation submitted that arrangements are being made for 200 students.

We note that as per letter by the Architect submitted by the college authorities dt.16.7.11, the Central library with 1600 sq.mtr is planned as a separate building which is still under construction and the requirement to accommodate 200 students in the library has not been fulfilled. Hence, presently required facilities with prescribed norm are not available.

## **VI. ESSENTIALITY CERTIFICATE & CONSENT OF AFFILIATION**

The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi in its order dated 10.06.2011 inter alia directed that:

*"Subject to the condition that the petitioner will not claim any equities on the basis of the this order it is directed that the petitioner's application will be again place before the Under Graduate Committee of the MCI within a period of one week from today. The said application will be considered by the Committee without raising an objection that the Essentiality Certificate and the Consent or affiliation were not submitted by 30<sup>th</sup> November 2010. Further steps shall be taken and the petitioner application shall be process in accordance with the law within further period of three weeks thereafter."*

In this regard, vide MCI letter dated 13<sup>th</sup> July, 2011 it was communicated to the Society that "the Essentiality Certificate dated 23/12/2010 issued by the State Govt. of Maharashtra is not as per format prescribed in the "Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999" and also the Affiliation Certificate issued by the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik is provisional and conditional."

The Society in its representation has submitted that they had enquired on 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2011 with the Secretariat of Medical Education & Drugs Department, Govt. of Maharashtra and their observation is that the Essentiality Certificate dated 23.12.2010 issued by the State Govt. of Maharashtra is as per format prescribed in the Establishment of Medical college Regulations, 1999 except the name of addressee, as they have issued Essentiality Certificate in the same format in the past and the same had been accepted by the MCI.

As regards, the Consent of Affiliation, the Society in its representation has submitted that it has been re-issued by the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and the same was submitted in MCI on 1.3.2011.

We note that in the Essentiality Certificate as furnished by the applicant refers to the following "Adequate clinical material as per the Medical Council of India norms will be made available by the Institution".

Further, the State Government undertaking in the Essentiality Certificate is "It is further certified that in case, the applicant fails to create infrastructure for medical college, as per MCI norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State Government may think to take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the college with the permission of the Central Government. In that case, the college will be owned and manage by the Government of Maharashtra."

We are of the view that the Essentiality Certificate submitted by the State Government on the above two counts is not as per the desired format of the Essentiality Certificate prescribed under Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999.

The relevant part of Essentiality Certificate in the Regulation is as under:

*"Adequate clinical material as per the Medical Council of India norms is available."*

*"It is further certified that in case the applicant fails to create infrastructure for the medical college as per MCI norms and fresh admissions are stopped by the Central Government, the State*

*Government shall take over the responsibility of the students already admitted in the College with the permission of the Central Government."*

We note that in the Consent of Affiliation issued by the Maharashtra University of Health Sciences it is made conditional and is subject to the fulfillment of following deficiencies pointed out by Local Inquiry Committee:-

1. The specialist should be appointed in various disciplines.
2. Clinical material, Central Laboratory, operation theatre should be available as per MCI norms.

We are of the view that addition of conditions in Consent of Affiliation is also not as per the desired format regarding the Consent of Affiliation prescribed under Establishment of Medical College Regulations, 1999.

## VII. DECISION

In view of the gross deficiencies in terms of faculty, clinical material, infrastructure, nursing staff and other aspects, as discussed above, we are of the considered opinion that letter of permission for establishment of a new medical college at Shree Chhatrapati Shivaji Education Society's Instt. of Medical Sciences & Research, Dist. Satara u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 cannot be granted to the Society for the academic year 2011-12. However, it is open to the Society to apply afresh for the next academic year 2012-13".

### 3. Approval on the minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Committee appointed by the BOG on 28.6.2011.

Read: the matter with regard to approval on the minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Committee appointed by the BOG held on 28.6.2011.

The Board of Governors confirmed the minutes of the meeting of the Postgraduate Committee appointed by the BOG held on 28.6.2011 with the modifications. The minutes issued separately.

With these changes Postgraduate committee minutes of 28<sup>h</sup> June 2011 were approved.

### 4. Increase of seats in MBBS course from 100 to 150 at MVJ Medical College & Research Hospital, Bangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 for the academic year 2011-2012.

Read: the matter with regard to Increase of seats in MBBS course from 100 to 150 at MVJ Medical College & Research Hospital, Bangalore, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act 1956 for the academic year 2011-2012.

Due to paucity of time the matter was deferred for the next BOGs meeting.

Due to paucity of time the matter was deferred for the next BOGs meeting.

### 6. Discharge of Ist year MBBS students who has admitted at Sagar Medical College, Sagar for the academic year 2009-10 after the deadline 20.10.2009 as permitted by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India - Withdrawal of discharge notice - Regarding.
