1. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – confirmation of.**

4. **Starting of D.M.(Medical Oncology) course at Nizam Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam’s Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector’s report (August, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam’s Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for consideration of starting of D.M.(Medical Oncology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D.M. - (i) None of the teaching faculty possesses requisite concerned super-speciality qualification, resultantly teaching complement is incomplete.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

6. **Increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance verification regarding.**

Read: The compliance verification inspection report (July, 2004) together with compliance and inspection report (July, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Microbiology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (July, 2004) together with compliance and inspection report (July, 2003) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (Microbiology) course at Rangaraya Medical College, Kakinada affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions from 2(two) to 4(four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

7. **Increase of seats in M.D.(Psychiatry) course at S.V. Medical College, Tirupati affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The compliance verification inspection report (July, 2004) together with the compliance and inspection report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S. V. Medical College, Tirupati for increase of seats in M.D.(Psychiatry) course.

- (i) There is no Associate Professor in Unit-I, resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
- (ii) None of the Assistant Professors are eligible to become postgraduate teacher.
- (iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

8. **Starting of M.D.(TB & Resp. Diseases) & D.T.C.D. courses at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat affiliated to Sardar Patel University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat affiliated to Sardar Patel University for consideration of starting of M.D.(TB & Resp. Diseases) & D.T.C.D. courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (July, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D. (TB & Resp. Diseases) & DTCD courses at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following-

- (i) Promotion of Prof. & HOD is not as per MCI norms.
- (ii) Both the Assistant Professors do not possess requisite postgraduate degree.
- (iii) Teaching complement is incomplete.
- (iv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

9. **Starting of M.D.(Anatomy) course at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad, Gujarat affiliated to Sardar Patel University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

- (xvi) Number of books in departmental library is 60 as against 80 required as per MCI norms.
- (xvii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**14. Starting of M.D.(Paediatrics) course at Rajiv Gandhi Medical College, Thane affiliated to University of Mumbai.**

- (i) HOD does not possess the requisite required experience of five years as Advisor.
- (ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**47. i) University of Bombay/Mumbai – Recognition of M.D.(S.P.M.) qualification in respect of students being trained at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai.**

**ii) University of Bombay/Mumbai & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik – recognition of D.P.H. qualification in respect of students being trained at L.T.M. Medical College, Mumbai.**

Read: The compliance verification report (July, 2004) together with compliance & inspection report (March, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at L.T.M. Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rajah Muthiah Medical College, Annamalainagar for purpose of recognition of D.L.O. qualification granted by Annamalai University.

- (iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions prospectively in MD(Radio-Diag.) course from the ensuing academic session.

**51. University of Delhi - Approval of Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for the award of D.G.O. qualification.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (April, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for purpose of approval of the college for the award of D.G.O. qualification granted by University of Delhi.

- iv) Unit II & Unit III are not as per MCI norms in terms of teaching faculty.

The Committee decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in term of teaching faculty and defer the consideration of the matter till the compliance is received from the institution authorities.

- iv) Other deficiencies/observation are in the inspection report.

**81. Increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification for issuance of LOP regarding.**

Read: The compliance verification report (August, 2003 & August, 2004) together with compliance and inspection report (July, 2002) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Pathology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August, 2003 & August, 2004) together with compliance and inspection report (July, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD(Pathology) course at Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions from 2(two) to 4 (four) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.



**82. Increase of seats in M.D.(Radiotherapy) course at Cancer Institute, Adyar, Chennai affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr.MGR Medical University, Tamilnadu u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956- compliance regarding.**

Read: The compliance together with the inspection report (May, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Cancer Institute, Adyar, Chennai for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Radiotherapy) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the inspection report (May, 2004) and noted that the Units even now are not as per MCI norms in terms of bed strength as unit I has 73 beds and Unit II has 60 beds; decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of beds strength.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of bed strength and defer the consideration of the matter till the compliance is received from the institution authorities.

**83. Starting of M.D.(Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) course at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur affiliated to Manipur University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-compliance regarding.**

Read: The compliance together with the inspection report (March, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal, Manipur for consideration of starting of M.D.(Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance as communicated in letter dated 17.6.2004 together with the inspection report (March, 2004) and noted that Assoc. Prof. shown as Professor possesses required academic eligibility, so also the other two Asstt. Profs. In term of communication dated 12.5.2000 and 11.1.2000 from the Council are academically eligible. However, the department does not have Assoc. Prof., hence teaching complement is incomplete.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in term of teaching faculty as per MCI norms and defer the consideration till the compliance is received.

**84. Starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course at N.K.P. Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur affiliated to Nagpur University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read: The Central Govt. letter dated 8/7/2004 with regard to permission for starting of MD (Pharmacology) course at N.K.P. Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Central Govt. letter dated 8/7/2004 with regard to permission for starting of MD (Pharmacology) course at NKP Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur and decided that the recommendations of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 25.2.2004 recommending Letter of Permission restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year from the year 2004-2005, be construed as from the year 2005-2006.

**85. Starting of M.D.(Tuberculosis & Resp. Diseases) & DTCD courses at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune (Deemed University).**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune for consideration of starting of M.D.(Tuberculosis & Resp. Diseases) &DTCD courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Tuberculosis & Resp. Diseases) & DTCD courses at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical

College for Women, Pune u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student in each course per year.

The Committee further decided to draw the attention to the observations made by the Council Inspector in the inspection report.

**86. The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of MD (Pathology) qualification.**

Read: The Inspection report (September, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Pathology) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Inspection report (September, 2004) and decided not to approve P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of MD (Pathology) qualification because –

- i) There is no regular Dean.
- ii) Additional faculty for PG not available.
- iii) No class room for clinical pathology. It is shared with Community Med. Deptt.
- iv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**87. Gulbarga University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications - Consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read: The compliance verification report (August, 2004) along with compliance and Council Inspector report (Nov., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (August, 2004) along with compliance and Council Inspector report (Nov., 2003) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 15.12.2004 recommending not to approve Vijayanagar Institute of Medical Sciences, Bellary for the award of M.S.(Orthopaedics) & D.Ortho. qualifications because –

- i) Promotion of Professor & HOD is not as per MCI norms.
- ii) Asstt. Profs. in Unit I & II do not possess requisite recognised postgraduate qualification.
- iii) As such teaching complement incomplete in both the units.
- iv) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**88. Marathwada University/Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University – Approval of S.R.T.R. Medical College, Ambajogai for the award of M.S.(Anatomy)qualification.**

Read: The Inspection report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at S.R.T.R. Medical College, Ambajogai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification earlier granted by Marathwada University and now by Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the inspection report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend that S.R.T.R. Medical College, Ambajogai be approved for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification granted by Dr.Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

89. **i) Madurai University, Madurai Kamraj University – Recognition of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli granted by Madurai University and Madurai Kamraj University.**  
**ii) Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli for the award of M.D. (Microbiology) qualification.**

Read: The compliance together with the inspection report (September, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Tirunelveli Medical College, Tirunelveli for purpose of i) Recognition of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Madurai University and Madurai Kamraj University and ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Microbiology) qualification granted by Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the inspection report (September, 2004) and decided not to recommend i) Recognition of M.D.(Microbiology) qualification granted by Madurai University and Madurai Kamraj University and ii) approval of the college for the award of M.D. (Microbiology) qualification granted by Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai because –

- i) Staff is deficient by one lecturer and one tutor (additional component for PG).
- ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

90. **Rajasthan University – Approval of J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification.**

Read: The Inspection report (September, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Inspection report (September, 2004) and decided to recommend that J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer be approved for the award of M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Rajasthan University restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year.

91. **Manipur University- Recogniton of MS (Anatomy) qualification in respect of students being trained at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal granted by Manipur University.**

Read: The Council Inspector' report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for purpose of recognition of MS (Anatomy) qualification in respect of Regional institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal granted by Manipur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector' report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend that MS (Anatomy) qualification granted by Manipur University in respect of students being trained at Regional institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal be recognised and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 5 (five) students per year.

- 92 **University of Bombay/Mumbai – Recognition of Diploma in Marine Medicine Qualification in respect of students being trained at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai for purpose of recognition of Diploma in Marine Medicine Qualification earlier granted by Bombay University and now by Mumbai University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided not to recommend recognition of Diploma in Marine Medicine Qualification earlier granted by Bombay University and now by Mumbai University in respect of students being trained at Institute of Naval Medicine, INHS, Asvini, Mumbai because –

- i) Teaching staff does not possess requisite prescribed academic eligibility except one Asstt. Prof. & one Lecturer.
- ii) Teaching complement is incomplete.
- iii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**93. Manipur University- Recogniton of MD (Microbiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal granted by Manipur University.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for purpose of recognition of MD (Microbiology) qualification in respect of Regional institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal granted by Manipur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend that MD (Microbiology) qualification granted by Manipur University in respect of students being trained at Regional institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal be recognised and included in the first schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**94. Manipur University- Recogniton of MD (Radio-Therapy) qualification in respect of students being trained at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal granted by Manipur University.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for purpose of recognition of MD (Radio-Therapy) qualification in respect of Regional institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal granted by Manipur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend that MD (Radio-Therapy) qualification granted by Manipur University in respect of students being trained at Regional institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal be recognised and included in the first schedule to the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**95. Permission to make admissions after the last date of admissions to PG courses in respect of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot – reg.**

Read: The matter with regard to admissions made in postgraduate courses in respect of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter with regard to admissions made in postgraduate courses in respect of Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot and decided to review the earlier decision in consonance with the judgement of the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the case of Madhu Singh.

The Committee further decided to seek a clarification from the institution as to why the admissions were made by the concerned college prior to the requisition made to the Council seeking permission for the same.

**96. Equivalence of DNB qualifications with MD/MS and DM/M.Ch. courses.**

Read: The report of the sub-Committee with regard to Equivalence of DNB qualifications with MD/MS and DM/M.Ch. courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered and approved the report of the sub-Committee with regard to Equivalence of DNB qualifications with MD/MS and DM/M.Ch. courses.

The Committee further decided to place the recommendations of the Committee to General Body of the Council and send a circular to all the medical colleges/PG institutions, and also to DME, & Secretary Health of each State requesting them to ensure faithful observance of the circular by the Medical Colleges/P.G. institutions under their authority.

**97. Starting of M.S. (Ophthalmology) & DO courses at Padmashree Dr.D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

To consider the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padmashree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Navi Mumbai (Deemed University) for consideration of starting of M.S.(Ophthalmology) & DO courses.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Sept., 2004) and noted that the promotion of 2<sup>nd</sup> Professor is not as per MCI norms - resultantly there is no Assoc. Prof. in unit- I and hence teaching complement is incomplete.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units as per MCI norms in terms of teaching faculty and defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

**98. Starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course at Padmashree Dr.D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune for consideration of starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions to 3(three) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the Act, 1956.

**99. Increase of seats in M.S. (General Surgery) course at Padmshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College for Women, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at Padamshree Dr. D.Y.Patil Medical College for Women, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 in commensurate with the clinical workload restricting the number of admissions from 4 (four) to 6(six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

**100. Rajasthan University – Approval of J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification granted by Rajasthan University

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided not to approve J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification because –

- i) Prof. & HOD does not possess requisite recognised postgraduate qualification.
- ii) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions prospectively in M.S.(Anatomy) course from the ensuing academic session.

**101. Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Recognition of M.D.(Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) qualification in respect of students being trained at Christian Medical College, Vellore**

Read: The compliance along with the inspection report (April, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Christian Medical College, Vellore for purpose of recognition of M.D.(Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance along with the inspection report (April, 2004) and noted that the distribution of teaching faculty in both the units is not as per MCI norms as there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.

The Committee further decided to advise the institution authorities to re-organise the units in terms of teaching faculty and defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

**102. Rajasthan University – Approval of J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend that J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer be approved for the award of M.D.(Anaesthesia) qualification granted by Rajasthan University restricting the number of admissions to 4 (four) students per year.

**103. The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai – Approval of P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of MD (Community Medicine) qualification.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Community Medicine) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (September, 2004) and decided not to approve P.S.G. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Coimbatore for the award of MD (Community Medicine) qualification because –

- i) There is no full time regular Dean of the college.
- ii) Promotion of 2nd Assoc. Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
- iii) No separate examination hall is available.
- iv) Practical room shared with Pathology Deptt.
- v) Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

**104. University of Delhi – Approval of Army Hospital, Delhi Cantt. for the award of MD(General Medicine) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) together with compliance submitted by the Hospital authority on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Army Hospital, Delhi Cantt. for approval of the college for the award of MD(General Medicine) qualification.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) and decided to recommend that Army Hospital, Delhi Cantt. be approved for the award of MD(General Medicine) qualification granted by University of Delhi restricting the number of admissions to 5(five) students per year.

**105. NTRUHS- Exams – P.G. Degree & diploma courses/exam in respect of those candidates who completed their studies (academic terms) but could not clear their final examinations.**

Read: The letter dated 21/7/2004 received from the Registrar, NTR University of Health Sciences regarding permission of MCI for the candidates who completed their studies (academic terms) but could not clear the final examination and after substantial gap of time have sought to appear for the university examination. The Executive Council of the University vide their resolution dt. 23.6.2004 have decided for "one year retraining" in the parent institution before permitting them for final examination and have sought approval of MCI for the same.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 21/7/2004 received from the Registrar, NTR University of Health Sciences regarding permission of MCI for the candidates who completed their studies (academic terms) but could not clear the final examination and after substantial gap of time have sought to appear for the university examination. The Executive Council of the University vide their resolution dt. 23.6.2004 have decided for "one year retraining" in the parent institution before permitting them for final examination and have sought approval of MCI for the same and decided that the procedure as contemplated by the Executive Council of the University is not prescribed by the Medical Council of India. As such the question of approval of the same by the Council does not arise.
