Apology for absence was received from Dr. N.B. Singh and the leave of absence was granted to the members by the Committee.

1. **Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Committee – confirmation of.**

Minutes of the Postgraduate Committee meeting held on 11.2.2005 were confirmed with the following modifications in the decision against Item No. 68, which reads as under :-

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance verification (February,2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (October, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) & DCH courses at Padamshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions from 2(two) to 3(three) students in each course per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said courses.”

The Postgraduate Committee noted the work output report of the requests received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the year 2004 and 2005.

4. **Starting of M.D.(Pathology) course at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar affiliated to Bhavnagar University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – compliance verification regarding.**

Read : The compliance verification inspection report (February, 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) on the physical and other

teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (February 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (July, 2002) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D. (Pathology) course at Govt. Medical College, Bhavnagar affiliated to Bhavnagar University u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions to 2(two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

5. **Starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gyane.) course at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh under Panjab University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (February, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Chandigarh under Panjab University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gyane.) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (February 2005) and decided to advise the Institution authorities to reorganize the units in terms of teaching faculty of the Dept. of Obst. & Gynae. in consonance with the Regulations of the Council on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the compliance is received from the Institution authorities.

6. **Increase of seats in M.S.(Ophthalmology) & D.O. courses at Arvind Eye Hospital, Madurai affiliated to The Tamilnadu Dr.M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – Consideration of Central Govt.'s letter regarding.**

Read : The Central Govt.'s letter dated 04.10.2004 together with report of the personal hearing with regard to increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) & DO course at Arvind Eye Hospital, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Central Govt.'s letter dated 04.10.2004 together with report of the personal hearing with regard to increase of seats in MS(Ophthalmology) & DO course at Arvind Eye Hospital, Chennai and decided to reiterate its earlier decision of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 25.02.2004 restricting the number of admissions from 4 (Four) to 6 (Six) for degree and 4 (Four) for DO course per year prospectively till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examination of the said course.

7. **Increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The compliance verification inspection report (May, 2004) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kurnool Medical College, Kurnool for consideration of increase of seats in M.S.(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (May, 2004) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (August, 2003) and decided to verify the compliance by way of an inspection.

**8. Starting of D.M.(Neurology) course at J.N.Medical College, Belgaum affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956-consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read : The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (February, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at J.N. Medical College, Belgaum for consideration of starting of D.M.(Neurology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (February, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of D. M. (Neurology) course at J. N. Medical College, Belgaum affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10 A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admission to 1(one) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

**9. Starting of DM(Neurology) course at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (February, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore for consideration of starting of DM(Neurology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (February, 2005) and decided to recommend to Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of DM(Neurology) course at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore affiliated to Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following deficiencies :

- (i) Instrumentation is inadequate in terms of Multislice C.T. Scan and MRI is not available.
- (ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.

**10. Starting of DM (Nephrology) course at T.N. Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956- consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read : The compliance verification report (March, 2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (May,2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at T.N. Medical College, Mumbai affiliated to Mumbai University for consideration of starting of DM(Nephrology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (March, 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) and decided to reiterate its earlier decision of the Postgraduate Committee taken at its meeting held on 30.06.2004 recommending to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of DM (Nephrology) course at T.N. Medical College, Mumbai because the compliance verification report is unsatisfactory as the promotion of Professor & HOD is not as per MCI Norms.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of DM (Nephrology) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulation on Post Graduation Medical Education, 2000.

**11. Starting of Diploma in Public Health (D.P.H.) course at B.J.Medical College, Ahmedabad affiliated to Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The compliance verification report (March, 2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities

available at B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad for consideration of starting of Diploma in Public Health (D.P.H.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (March 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of Diploma in Public Health (D.P.H.) course at B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad affiliated to Gujarat University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956. prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions to 3(three) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

**12. Starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Govt. Medical College, Rajkot under Saurashtra University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read : the compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Rajkot under Saurashtra University for consideration of starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered compliance together with Council Inspector's report (August, 2004) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for Starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course at Govt. Medical College, Rajkot affiliated to Saurashtra University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following deficiencies :-

- i) Teaching complement in Unit II is incomplete as there is no Associate Professor.
- ii) Resultantly the teaching faculty is inadequate even for Undergraduate purpose.
- iii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the Inspection Report.

The Committee further decided to recommend that in view of the above, the Govt. may consider disapproving the proposal for starting of M.D.(Obst. & Gynae.) course. However, the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies, in accordance with the Council's Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education, 2000.

**13. Increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) & DA courses at Himalayan Instt. of Medical Sciences, Dehradun under H.N.Gerhwal University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (March, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Himalayan Instt. of Medical Sciences, Dehradun under H.N.Gerhwal University for consideration of increase of seats in M.D.(Anaesthesia) & DA courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Compliance verification (March, 2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (Anaesthesia) & DA courses at Himalayan Instt. of Medical Sciences, Dehradun affiliated to H.N.Gerhwal University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admissions from 2 (two) to 3 (three) students in each course per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears for the final examinations of the said courses.”

**14. Starting of various PG courses at Dr.Panjabrao Alias Bhausabeh Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati under Amravati University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – Consideration of request regarding.**

Read : The matter togetherwith the recommendations of Executive Committee with regard to entertaining the applications for starting of Postgraduate Courses at Dr. Pajabrao Alias Bhausabeh Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter and the decision of the Executive Committee taken in its meeting held on 31.01.2005 of issuing a Show Cause Notice to Dr. Panjabrao Alias Bhausabeh Deshmukh Memorial Medical College, Amravati for derecognition of MBBS course U/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and, therefore, decided not to entertain the applications received U/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for starting of following courses at the said college:-

- i) M. D. (General Medicine)
- ii) M. S. (Orthopaedics)
- iii) M. D. (Obst. & Gynae)

. The Postgraduate Committee further decided to return the applications to the Central Govt.

**15. Starting of M.D.(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD courses at Kameneni Instt. of Medical Sciences, Narketpally under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (March, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kameneni Instt. of Medical Sciences, Narketpally under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for consideration of starting of M.D.(Radio Diagnosis) & DMRD u/s 10A of IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered compliance together with Council Inspector's report (March, 2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Radio-diagnosis) & DMRD courses at Kameneni Instt. of Medical Sciences, Narketpally under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following deficiencies :-

- i) The promotion of Professor & HOD is not as per MCI Norms as the teaching experience gained at Safdargunj Hospital and IHBS is not countable.
- ii) Other deficiencies pointed out in the Inspection Report.

**16. Starting of MD(Anatomy) course at Pt. Deean Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot under Saurashtra Universtiy u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (March, 2005) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot under Saurashtra University for consideration of starting of MD(Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (March 2005) and decided to recommend to the Central Government to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Anatomy) course at Pt. Deean Dayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot under Saurashtra Universtiy u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956. prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2005-2006 restricting the number of admission to 2(two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11 (2) of the Act, 1956.

**17. Bundelkhand University - Recognition of M.D.(Paediatrics) and D.C.H. qualification in respect of students being trained at M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi – Notification amendment regarding.**

Read : The letter dated 13.8.2002 from Principal, M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi with regard to recognition of MD(Paediatrics) with effect from MD1982 and DCH from 1981.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 13.08.2002 from Principal, M.L.B. Medical College, Jhansi and noted that MD (Paediatrics) and DCH qualifications granted by Buldelkhand University in respect of students being trained at MLB Medical College, Jhansi are recognized by the Council and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 with the following proviso :-

*“The Postgraduate qualifications shall be recognized on or after 1983 and 1982 respectively.”*

The said degrees were awarded by the University i.e MD (Paediatrics) in 1982 and Diploma in 1981 as conveyed vide Principal's letter dated 13.08.2002.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee recommends that MD (Paediatrics) and DCH qualifications awarded by Buldelkhand University be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 - MD from 1982 and DCH from 1981.

**18. Madras University and The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai- Approval of Stanley Medical College, Chennai for the award of MD(Pharmacology) qualification.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (March, 2005) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Stanley Medical College, Chennai for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD(Pharmacology) qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now by the The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (March, 2005) and decided to recommend that Stanley medical College, Chennai be approved for the award of MD (Pharmacology) qualification earlier granted by Madras University and now by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**19. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Permitting intake in M.D.(General Medicine) course in respect of students being trained at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (February, 2005) on physical and other teaching facilities available at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore together with previous inspection reports and compliance for purpose of permitting of intake in MD(General Medicine) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore as well as the inspection report (21-22 March 2005) carried out for undergraduate purposes

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (February, 2005) together with previous inspection reports, compliance and the inspection report (21-22 March 2005) carried out for undergraduate purposes and decided to permit the authorities of Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore prospectively with annual intake capacity of 3 (three) students for MD (General Medicine) course under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

**20. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Permitting intake in M.S.(ENT) and DLO courses in respect of students being trained at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (February, 2005) on physical and other teaching facilities available at Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore togetherwith previous inspection reports and compliance for purpose of permitting of intake in MS(ENT) and DLO qualifications granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore as well as the inspection report (21-22 March 2005) carried out for undergraduate purposes.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (February, 2005) together with previous inspection reports, compliance and the inspection report (21-22 March 2005) carried out for undergraduate purposes and decided to permit the authorities of Kempegowda Institute of Medical Sciences, Bangalore prospectively with annual intake capacity of 1(one) student per year in each course for MS (ENT) and DLO under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

**21. Delhi University - Approval of University College of Medical Sciences, Delhi for the award of MD (Forensic Medicine) qualification- consideration compliace verification regarding.**

Read : The compliance verification report (March, 2005) togetherwith compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2001) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at University College of Medical Sciences, Delhi for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Forensic Medicine) qualification granted by Delhi University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (March, 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (April, 2001) and decided to recommend that University College of Medical Sciences, Delhi be approved for the award of for the award of MD (Forensic Medicine) granted by Delhi University restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**22. University of Delhi - Approval of Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for the award of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification – consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read : The compliance togetherwith Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Army Hospital Delhi Cantt., Delhi for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification granted by University of Delhi.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2003) and decided to defer the consideration of the matter till its next meeting.

**23. Sardar Patel University – Recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification in respect of students being trained at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad – consideration of compliance verification reprot.**

Read : The compliance verification report (February 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (August 2004) on standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad for purpose of recognition of M.S.(Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Sardar Patel University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (February 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (August 2004) and decided to recommend that MS (Orthopaedics) qualification granted by Sardar

Patel University in respect of students being trained at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the IMC Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1 (one) student per year.

**24. Sardar Patel University – Recognition of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Pramukhswami Medical College, Karamsad – consideration of compliance verification regarding.**

Read : The Council Inspector report (December, 2004) of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Sree Sidhartha Medical College, Tumkur for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (December, 2004) and decided to seek the details of teaching experience of the Professor & HOD Dr. B. K. Jena in the prescribed proforma.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to defer the consideration till the information is received.

**73. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of M.S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore for the award of D.G.O. qualification in respect of increased intake capacity.**

Read : The compliance verification report (March, 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at MS Ramiah Medical College, Bangalore for purpose of approval of the college for the award of DGO qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore in respect of increased intake capacity.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (March, 2005) together with compliance and Council Inspector's report (May, 2004) and noted that M. S. Ramaiah Medical College, Bangalore is already approved for the award of DGO qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore with the intake capacity of 2 seats and the matter is now for consideration of approval of the college for the award of DGO qualification with increased intake of 4 (four) seats; decided to approve the college for the award of said qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Committee further decided to direct the college authorities to prospectively restrict the number of admissions to 3 (three) students per year as the incharge of the Unit - III does not possess requisite recognized postgraduate qualification.

75 **Recognition of MS(Orthopaedics), MD (Obst. & Gynae.), MD(Anaes.), MS (Ophth.), MD(Paed.), MD(Radio-Diag.) and MD (Dermatology STD & Leprosy) qualifications granted by University of Mumbai in respect of Institute of Naval Medicine, Asvini, Mumbai.**

Read : The compliance togetherwith Inspection reports regarding recognition of above courses granted by University of Mumbai in respect of Institute of Naval Medicine, Asvini, Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Inspection reports and noted that the information as desired in the prescribed proforma has not been supplied; decided to obtain the same and deferred the consideration till the information is received.

The Committee decided that the recommendations of the Committee be communicated to the concerned authorities immediately as the academic session for the year 2005-06 shall be commencing from 2<sup>nd</sup> May.
