Apology for absence was received from Dr.M.M. Deka, member, Postgraduate Committee.

**82. To consider the letter received from Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh regarding excess admission made in MD(Physiology) course for the academic session 2007-2008 at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh.**

Read: the letter dated 26/3/2008 received from the Dean, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh regarding excess admission made in MD(Physiology) course for the academic session 2007-2008 at J.N. Medical College, Aligarh.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 26/3/2008 received from the Dean, Aligarh Muslim University, Aligarh and noted that the institute has admitted 5 students instead of 4 in the year 2007-08 and they have requested to regularize the seat by reducing 1 seat in the coming year. Taking into consideration all the aspects, the Postgraduate Committee decided to obtain legal opinion in the matter.

**83. Neutralisation of excess seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack, Orissa.**

Read: the letter dated 9/1/2008 received from the Director of Medical Education & Training, Govt. of Orissa regarding neutralization of excess seats in MD(Paediatrics) course at S.C.B. Medical College, Cuttack.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 9/1/2008 received from the Director of Medical Education & Training, Govt. of Orissa and noted that during the year 1999 to 2005, an excess admission of 40 (forty) students were made in MD (Paediatrics) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack. In order to regularize they have suggested 4(four) seats at the same college may be kept vacant against 14 (fourteen) annual intake for next 10 years. They have further suggested that 2(two) seats from All India Quota and 2 seats from State Quota are to be curtailed.

Taking into consideration all the aspects, the Postgraduate Committee decided to obtain legal opinion in the matter.

**84. Proposal from Indian Society of Hematology & Transfusion Medicine (ISHTM) to include DM(Hemato-Patho.) degree in the list of DM degrees, regulated under PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 of MCI.**

Read: the letter dated 21/4/2008 received from President, Indian Society of Hematology & Transfusion Medicine (ISHTM), New Delhi to including DM (Hemato-Patho.) degree in the list of DM degrees, regulated under PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 of MCI.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 21/4/2008 received from President, Indian Society of Hematology & Transfusion Medicine (ISHTM), New Delhi and decided to constitute a Sub-Committee of the following members to go into the details and submit the report at the earliest:-

**85. Declaration of MD(CHA) affiliated to University of Delhi equivalent to MD(PSM)**

Read: the letter dated 6/2/2008 received from Director, National Institute of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi regarding equivalency of MD(CHA) qualification to MD(PSM).

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 6/2/2008 received from Director, National Institute of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi and decided to refer the matter to the Teachers' Eligibility Qualification Sub-Committee.

**86. Hoping for favourable action for our genuine and long pending requests – Reminding – request letter please.**

Read: The report of the Sub-Committee regarding the request received from N.R.I. Professionals Association for favourable action.

The Postgraduate Committee approved the following report of the Sub-Committee comprising of Dr. D.K. Sharma and Dr. B.P. Dubey regarding the request received from N.R.I. Professionals Association:-

*“The present Committee came to be constituted by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee of the Medical Council of India for evaluating a requisition which has been submitted by N.R.I. Professionals Association wherein amongst other things they have sought –*

1. *“Relaxation of the rules of the Council so as to make NRI specialists' doctors who worked in teaching hospitals in developed countries, eligible for promotion as Associate and Professors in Private Medical and Dental Colleges in India, thus recognizing their valuable services and supreme sacrifices, thus honouring their enriched subjects' teaching knowledge.”*

*With reference to above, the Committee is of the considered opinion that the eligibility with reference to teaching posts in the cadre of Assistant Professor, Associate Professor, Professors in various subjects and specialities is governed by a regulation titled Teachers' Eligibility Qualifications regulation notified by the Medical Council of India in terms of provisions at Section 33 of the I.M.C. Act, 1956. The said regulation is mandatory in nature and binding in character. It is not open for the Council to make any exception and or relaxation from the binding provisions of the said regulation. As such it is neither open nor permissible for the Council to deviate in any manner whatsoever from the position incorporated in the binding regulation.*

2. “Council may recommend to the UGC/Medical Universities/AIU/HRD Ministry/NAC/Deemed Universities to approve the resolution unanimously and accept the retirement age for such precious non and para-clinical professors to retire at 68 or 75 years age by giving them special grade rank or Emiritus status as done in U.S.A., U.K., European, Gulf and Commonwealth Countries Universities and thus help immensely in filling up all the existing lacunae, shortage vacancies in our medical and dental institutions in India.”

The present policy decision by the Council in regard to validity of a teacher to be computed for the said purpose by the Council is upto 65 years of age. The definition of word teacher as propounded by the Council is he/she ought to be “Full Time”. The Council per se is not vested with the authority and of the jurisdiction for the purpose of prescribing the “service conditions” including the age of superannuation for the medical teachers.

It is also pertinent to note that medical education is a ‘subject’ included in the ‘Concurrent List’, of the Constitution of India, wherein it is open both for the ‘Centre’ as well as the ‘State’ to regulate the matter through appropriate legislations the age of superannuation. Therefore, in case of Central Govt. managed institutions it is prescribed by the Govt. of India and in State managed institutions by the concerned State Govt. As of now, the age of superannuation for medical teachers in the country is variable in as much as in the State of Kerala the age of superannuation is 55 years as against 58 years in the State of Maharashtra, 60 years in the State of Rajasthan and 65 years in the State of Madhya Pradesh. Therefore, the question of Medical Council of India prescribing the age of superannuation is out of context and also outside the ambit and purview of the authority and jurisdiction of the Council.

As of now, the Council also does not have authority like the UGC to provide for the scheme of Professor Emiritus because it is not vested with the authority of providing ‘Developmental Grants’ to the medical institutions in the country, as is vested with the UGC vide speaking provisions to that effect under the governing University Grants Commission Act, 1956.

3. “Appoint only medical doctors specialists only as Professors and Heads of the Departments and University examiners for following para-medical and allied medical courses as done in foreign countries like U.K., U.S.A., Europe, Australia and Gulf Arab nations in order to maintain high international academic standard caliber.”

In this connection, the Committee would like to emphasise that in teaching institutions each ‘Department’ is required to be headed by a person not below the rank of Professor with certain permissible exceptions which have been catalogued in the Graduate Medical Education Regulations, 1997 of MCI. So also the eligibility for the appointment of examiners is categorically prescribed therein. As the matter is regulated through the provisions incorporated in the governing regulation, it is not open for the Council to deviate from the same in any manner for whatsoever reason. The exceptions as such are not permissible.

The Committee has further taken note of the fact that the question of equivalence of the postgraduate degrees as contemplated has already been dealt by the Govt. of India. In this connection, it is necessary to place on record that the Postgraduate Committee at its meeting dated 17.07.2007 vide item No. 48 while considering the communication dated 27.06.2007 and 12.07.2007 from the Deputy Secretary to the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & F.W. regarding recognition of postgraduate medical qualifications granted by medical institutions abroad u/s 13 of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 (Outside the scheme of reciprocity) had considered a report submitted by the Committee headed by Dr. Ved Prakash Mishra, the then Chairman of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee with Dr. D.K. Sharma, Chairman, Registration & Equivalence Committee and Dr. C.V. Bhirmanandham, Chairman, TEQ Sub-Committee of the Council wherein amongst other things it was brought out that the Govt. of India in writing seeking inclusion of the postgraduate medical qualifications granted by medical institutions outside India unilaterally and also explicitly restraining MCI from physical verification of the facilities at the concerned institutions would not be prudent to concede to the unilateral recognition of postgraduate medical qualifications granted by foreign countries and incorporation thereof in Part-II of Schedule-II without physical verification thereof because the same would be prejudicial to the legitimate interests and credibility of the desired standards of postgraduate medical education in the country. The said decision of the Postgraduate Committee was approved by the General Body of the Council and Govt. of India was informed accordingly. However, the Govt. of India have issued a notification dated 07.03.2008 whereby they have included all the postgraduate medical qualifications conferred by the institutions in the countries namely U.S.A., Canada, U.K., Australia and Newzealand which are registerable with the concerned registering Councils in the said countries as the valid qualifications included in Part-II of Schedule-II appended to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

Notwithstanding the fact that the Postgraduate Committee of the Council need to reiterate their stand which has been adopted by them as the same is judicious and is in the interest of the

*standards and credibility of the postgraduate medical education in the country, however, to that extent, the requisition made by the NRI Professionals Association stands fulfilled.”*

The Postgraduate Committee observed that Item No.87 to 102 of the agenda have already been considered in the Postgraduate Committee meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> June, 2008.

**103. Mandatory Rural Service for MBBS doctors intending to pursue PG Medical course-Implementation of the recommendations of High Powered Committee.**

Read: The letter dated 6/6/2008 received from the Central Govt. regarding Mandatory Rural Service for MBBS doctors intending to pursue PG Medical course.

This item has been considered alongwith item No.138.

**104. Nagpur University & RTM University, Nagpur – Recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur.**

Read: The Council Inspector’s Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur for purpose of recognition of MS (Pharmacology) qualification earlier granted by Nagpur University and now by RTM University, Nagpur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (Pharmacology) qualification earlier granted by Nagpur University and now by RTM University, Nagpur in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**105. Nagpur University & RTM University, Nagpur – Recognition of MD (Physiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur.**

Read: The Council Inspector’s Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur for purpose of recognition of MS (Physiology) qualification earlier granted by Nagpur University and now by RTM University, Nagpur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (Physiology) qualification earlier granted by Nagpur University and now by RTM University, Nagpur in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**106. Inspection of standard of examination and other teaching facilities available for purpose of recognition of PG qualifications-request regarding**

Read: The letter dated 05.03.2008 from the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Department of Health & Family Welfare) regarding recognition of Master of Public Health (Field Epidemiology ) qualification of students being trained at national institute of Communicable Diseases, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 05.03.2008 from the Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Department of Health & Family Welfare) and observed that the course of Master of Public Health (Field Epidemiology) is not included as a subject in the Schedule of the subjects in which the postgraduate courses can be started as mentioned in Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to ask the institution authorities as to how a course which is not included in the schedule to the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000 was started for further consideration in the matter.

**107. Saurashtra University – Recognition of MD (DVL) qualification in respect of students being trained at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot for purpose of recognition of MD (DVL) qualification granted by Saurashtra University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (DVL) qualification granted by Saurashtra University in respect of students being trained at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student per year.

**108. The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Mohan Kumarmangalam Medical College, Salem.**

Read: The compliance verification (May, 2008) togetherwith the Council Inspector's Report (August, 2005) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Mohan Kumarmangalam Medical College, Salem for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(General Surgery) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification (May, 2008) togetherwith the Council Inspector's Report (August, 2005) and decided to recommend that MS (General Surgery) qualification granted by The Tamilnadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Govt. Mohan Kumarmangalam Medical College, Salem be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**109. Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Pimpri, Pune – Recognition of MD (Physiology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Padmshree Dr. DY Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Padmshree Dr. DY Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune for purpose of recognition of MD (Physiology) qualification granted by Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Pimpri, Pune.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (June, 2008) and decided not to recognise MD (Physiology) qualification granted by Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Pimpri, Pune in respect of students being trained at Padmshree Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College, Pimpri, Pune because of the following:-

1. Dr. N.V. Bansod, Assoc. Prof. does not possess requisite recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.D.(Physiology) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**110. Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai – Recognition of MS (ENT) qualification in respect of students being trained at Dr. DY Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai for purpose of recognition of MS (ENT) qualification granted by Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (June, 2008) and decided to recommend that MS (ENT) qualification granted by Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (one) student per year.

**111. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and MGM University of Health Sciences (Deemed University) – Recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification in respect of students being trained at MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai for purpose of recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and MGM University of Health Sciences (Deemed University).

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (Pharmacology) qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and MGM University of Health Sciences (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**112. Saurashtra University – Recognition MD(Skin & VD) qualification in respect of M.P.Shah Medical College, Jamnagar – consideration of compliance regarding.**

Read: The compliance verification report (May, 2008) togetherwith the Council Inspector's Report (December,1998) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at M.P.Shah Medical College, Jamnagar for purpose of recognition of MD (Skin & VD) qualification granted by Saurashtra University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (May, 2008) togetherwith the Council Inspector's Report (December,1998) and decided to recommend that MD (Skin & VD) qualification granted by Saurashtra University in respect of students being trained at M.P.Shah Medical College, Jamnagar be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**113. Datta Meghe instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University)/RTM Nagpur University – Recognition of MD (DVL) qualification in respect of students being trained at JLN Medical College, Swangi, Wardha.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at JLN Medical College, Swangi, Wardha for purpose of recognition of MD (DVL) qualification granted by Datta Meghe instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University)/RTM Nagpur University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and noted that Dr. Sanjiv Choudhary, Asstt. Prof. is not having prescribed postgraduate qualification; however, even without him the teaching complement is complete and decided to recommend that MD (DVL) qualification granted by Datta Meghe instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University)/RTM Nagpur University in respect of students being trained at JLN Medical College, Swangi, Wardha be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year.

**114. Nagpur University & RTM University, Nagpur – Recognition of MD (Anaesthesia) & DA qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur for

purpose of recognition of MD (Anaesthesia) & DA qualification earlier granted by Nagpur University and now by RTM University, Nagpur.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (Anaesthesia) & DA qualifications earlier granted by Nagpur University and now by RTM University, Nagpur in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 4(four) students for degree and 2 (two) students for diploma course per year prospectively from the academic session 2009-10 commensurating with the number of available PG teachers.

**115. Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai – Recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Dr. DY Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai for purpose of recognition of MD (Pharmacology) qualification granted by Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided not to recognise MD (Pharmacology) qualification granted by Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Dr. D.Y. Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai because of the following:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Manish Hathial, Assoc.Prof. is not as per MCI norms.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. There is no Pharmaceutical Chemist in the department.
4. Instrumentation is inadequate.
5. In library, new edition of reference/text books needs to be purchased.
6. No research activity and publication in last 3 years.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.D.(Pharmacology) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**116. Veer Narmad South Gujarat University – Recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Surat.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Surat for purpose of recognition of MD (Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD qualification granted by Veer Narmad South Gujarat University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (May, 2008) and decided not to recognise MD (Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD qualifications granted by Veer Narmad South Gujarat University in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Surat because of the following:-

1. Prof. & HOD does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. There is a shortage of one Tutor.
3. PTCA is not available.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) & DMRD courses from the academic session 2009-2010.

**117. Manipur University – Approval of Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for the award of MD (General Medicine) qualification in respect of increased intake.**

Read: The Council Inspector's Report (April, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal for purpose of approval of the college for the award of MD (General Medicine) qualification granted by Manipur University in respect of increased intake.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's Report (April, 2008) and noted that Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal already stands approved for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification with 4 (four) seats and now the matter is under consideration for approval of the college against the increased intake; decided to recommend that Regional Institute of Medical Sciences, Imphal be approved for the award of M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Manipur University against the increased intake restricting the number of admissions to 6 (Six) students per year.

**118. Sant Gadge Baba Amravati University, Amravati – Recognition of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Sh. Vasantnao Naik Govt. Medical College, Yavatmal.**

**137. University of Mumbai & Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nasik – Recognition of MD (Obst. & Gynae.) qualification in respect of students being trained at Bombay Hospital Institute of Medical Sciences, Mumbai.**

3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.D. (Obst. & Gynae.) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in M.D. (Psychiatry) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**143. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Recognition of MD (Psychiatry) & DPM qualification in respect of students being trained at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore.**

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (Psychiatry) & DPM courses from the academic session 2009-2010.

3. Glucoma and skin cases are very rare.
4. No surgical retinal work is carried out.
5. There is no Eye bank in the department.
6. Number of medical retinal work is also less.
7. Neuro-Ophthalmology & Ophthalmoplasty clinics are non-existent.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MS (Ophthalmology) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (Forensic Medicine) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**152. Ranchi University – Recognition of M.Ch. (Neurosurgery) qualification in respect of students being trained at Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi.**

Read: The Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Rajendra Institute of Medical Sciences, Ranchi for purpose of recognition of M.Ch. (Neurosurgery) qualification granted by Ranchi University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector report (June, 2008) and decided to advise the institution authorities to reorganize the unit in terms of bed strength & teaching faculty as per MCI norms.

The Committee further decided to defer the consideration of the matter till the information is received.

1. There is shortage of 3 Assoc. Profs., 1 Asstt.Prof.-cum-Medical Officer of Urban Health Center and 4 Tutors in the department.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is grossly inadequate even for UG.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (SPM/Community Medicine) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**154. Himachal Pradesh University – Recognition of MD (Radio-therapy) qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla.**

Read: The Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Shimla for purpose of recognition of MD (Radio-therapy) qualification granted by Himachal Pradesh University.

3. Resultantly, both the units are incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (Pediatrics) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

Even without them the teaching complement is complete and decided to recommend that DMRD qualification granted by Datta Meghe instt. of Medical Sciences (Deemed University) / RTM Nagpur University in respect of students being trained at JLN Medical College, Swangi, Wardha be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**159. Rajasthan University – Recognition of MD (TB & Res. Dis.) qualification in respect of students being trained at Govt. Medical College, Kota.**

Read: The Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Kota for purpose of recognition of MD (TB & Res. Dis.) qualification granted by Rajasthan University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (June, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (TB & Res. 1. Dr. B.K. Goyal, Dean is above 65 years of age and hence cannot be considered as per regulations.

2. Dr. Inder Talwar, Prof. & Head, Dr. D.B. Modi, Assoc.Prof., Dr. Sunila Jaggi, Asstt.Prof. and Dr. Vasundhara Smriti, Asstt.Prof. do not possess requisite recognized postgraduate qualification.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**161. Marathwada University/Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University – Approval of SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai for the award of MD (Microbiology) qualification.**

Read: The Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai for purpose of recognition of MD (Microbiology) qualification earlier granted by University of Mumbai and now by Marathwada University/Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University.

**162. Dr. D.Y. Patil University, Navi Mumbai – Recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification in respect of students being trained at Dr. DY Patil Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Navi Mumbai.**

Read: The Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. D.Y. 1. Dr. Prakash Samant, Assoc.Prof. cannot be considered as he does not have the relieving order from the previous institute.
2. Dr. Bhushan Patil shown as Asstt.Prof. does not possess the prescribed academic qualification.
3. The promotion of Dr. Ashit Rao, Assoc.Prof. is not as per MCI norms. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
4. There is no ward side laboratory and not Lab. Technican. There is no Research Lab. in the department.
5. The Occupational therapy and Physiotherapy section attached to the hospital is also not upto the mark and very congested. It is not fully equipped also.
6. There is no fracture clinic in Emergency or in OPD. There is no minor operation theatre in the Outpatient department.
7. There is no incinerator in the hospital.
8. There is no publication of the department.
9. The standard of examination was also not upto the mark of MS Orthopaedics, although the clinical material was sufficient. There is no regular teaching and there is no schedule exists in the department.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in MS (Orthopaedics) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

**163. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and MGM University of Health Sciences (Deemed University) – Recognition of DO qualification in respect of students being trained at MGM Medical College, Navi Mumbai.**

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in DO course from the academic session 2009-2010.

Taklikar, Lecturer do not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

In view of above, the Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admission in DPH course from the academic session 2009-2010.

1. O.T. days are now 4 per week.
2. Operation workload is less (8 major and 8 minor procedures per week)
3. Average OPD attendance is 75.
4. One post of Sr. Resident is vacant.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the inspection report.

2. Clinical Material is inadequate in terms of bed occupancy and Lab. Investigations are as under:-

3. The institution does not have separate departments of Psychiatry and skin & V.D. These specialities are sections/divisions of department of medicine. These specialities do not have their separate departmental libraries. The head of department of Medicine is also the head of these specialities which is not as per MCI norms.
4. Hostel accommodation for students is inadequate as it is available for 216 students only against the requirement of 300.
5. Non-teaching staff in the library is inadequate.
6. Number of available journals are only 45 against the requirement of 100.
7. Central Animal house with required facilities are not available. No animal is regularly maintained in the animal house.
8. No Lecturer cum medical officer having MD(PSM) is available at RHTC. Infrastructural facilities are inadequate at RHTC. No audio-visual aids are provided.
9. At UHC – No Lecturer-cum-Medical Officer for MD(PSM) qualification is posted. Record for investigations are not maintained properly.
10. Registration counter for OPD is not computerized.
11. The indoor registration counter is not computerized and not cross linked with the outdoor registration.
12. The Medical Record department is not computerized. ISD classification of record is not being followed.
13. Only one mobile x-ray unit is available which is inadequate as per MCI norms.
14. Canteen for patients, staff and students is not available.
15. In Pathology department, the up-keeping of the museum is not satisfactory.
16. Service laboratory for Serology, virology, parasitology, mycology and tuberculosis are not available in the Department of Microbiology.
17. Catalogues are not available in the museum of Deptt. of Forensic Medicine.
18. Number of books in the departmental library in TB & Chest, Psychiatry, ENT, Paediatrics is inadequate as per MCI norms.
19. Other deficiencies/remarks are in the main report.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to recommend to the Council for withdrawal of recognition of M.S. (Ortho.) & D. Ortho. qualification at S.S. Medical College, Rewa granted by A.P. University u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Committee further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.S. (Ortho.) & D. Ortho. qualification from the academic session 2009-2010.

**168. D.D.U. University, Gorakhpur – Recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification in respect of B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur – regarding amendment in the notification of Government of India.**

Read: The letter of the Principal, B.R.D. Medical College, Gorakhpur dated 05.06.2008 regarding the amendment in notification of M.S. (General Surgery) qualification.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the letter dated 5.6.2008 from the Principal, BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur and noted that the Principal of the Institute has requested for correction in the year of examination of First Batch of MS (Surgery) at BRD Medical College, Gorakhpur, DDU, Gorakhpur University, Gorakhpur on or after 1982 instead of on or after 1983 as notified and recommended by MCI & Govt. of India respectively.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to make the above mentioned necessary corrections and send a communication to Govt. of India for corrections in the Gazette of India in respect of recognition of medical qualification of MS (General Surgery) on or after 1982 instead of on or after 1983.

**169. Chhatrapati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow – Recognition of M.Ch (Urology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Chhatrapati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow.**



Read: The Council inspector report (June, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Chhatrapati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow for purpose of recognition of M.Ch. (Urology) qualification granted by Chhatrapati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector report (June, 2008) and decided to recommend that M.Ch. (Urology) qualification granted by Chhatrapati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow in respect of students being trained at Chhatrapati Sahuji Maharaj Medical University, Lucknow be recognized and included in the 1<sup>st</sup> Schedule to the I.M.C. Act,1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (two) students per year.

**170. Nagpur University and Maharashtra University of Health Sciences – Recognition of DA qualification in respect of students being trained at Indira Gandhi Medical College, Nagpur.**
