4. **To note the LOI/LOP issued by Central Govt. Ministry of Health & F.W. for starting/increase of seats of postgraduate courses in various Medical Colleges u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Letter of Intent /Letter of Permission issued by Central Govt. Ministry of Health & F.W. for starting/increase of seats of postgraduate courses in various Medical Colleges u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

5. **Starting of MD (Anatomy) course at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for starting of MD (Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Anatomy) course at NDMVP Samaj's Medical College, Nashik under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Rathod Sanjay M, Professor & HOD is not as per MCI norms. Resultantly, there is no Professor in the Deptt.
2. There is shortage of 2 (two) Associate Professors and 1 (one) Tutor.
3. Resultantly, the teaching complement is incomplete.
4. There is no trolley table, no dissecting microscope and no meat cutting machine for their body sections (transverse & vertical) for gross anatomy sectional study.
5. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

6. **Starting of MD(Pathology) course at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital Jaipur under University of Rajasthan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Sitapur, Jaipur under University of Rajasthan for starting of MD (Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD (Pathology) course at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital Jaipur under University of Rajasthan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Dr. Narayani Joshi, Prof. & HOD, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Facilities for immunohistochemistry and electron microscopy are not available.
4. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

7. **Starting of MD (Anatomy) course at S. Nijalingappa Medical College, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.**

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at S.Nijalingappa Medical College, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi

University of Health Sciences for starting of MD (Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Anatomy) course at S.Nijalingappa Medical College, Bagalkot under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Dr. G.B. Rairam, Professor & HOD and Dr. G.V. Patil, Asstt. Prof. don't possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
2. Promotion of Dr. Mahesh Wagle, Associate Professor is not as per MCI norms.
3. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
4. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

8. Starting of MD(TB & Chest Disease) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MD (TB & Chest Disease) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(TB & Chest Disease) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. Central & departmental library – inadequate.
4. There is no ward side lab.
5. There is no departmental research lab.
6. The department does not have TB Health Education Officer, TB Health Visitor & Chest Physiotherapist.
7. Diagnostic facilities for fungal culture & sensitivity are not available.
8. DMC-Cum-DOT Centre – Though Deptt. is having Designated Microscopy Centre Under Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme, but facility for DOT Centre is not present in Institute for training of P.G. Students.
9. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
10. The Institution is running DNB courses.
11. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

9 Starting of MS(Obst. & Gynae.) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MS (Obst. & Gynae) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MS(Obst. & Gynae.) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under

Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. Central & departmental library – inadequate.
4. There is no Central Research Laboratory.
5. Beds are not as per MCI norms (2 units & 120 beds).
6. There is no ward side lab.
7. There is no departmental museum.
8. Teaching space in the OPD is inadequate.
9. There is no space for teaching faculty and the departmental office.
10. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
11. The Institution is running DNB courses.
12. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

10. Starting of MD (Microbiology) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Mulund, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Mulund, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for starting of MD (Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Microbiology) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Mulund, Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. Administrative Block is incomplete - staff room, record room, office of superintendent, student room and cafeteria are not available.
4. Central library is inadequate.
5. Central photographic section, statistical unit and research section lacking.
6. Other departments – Medicine, Surgery, Pathology, Biochemistry, Paediatric, have less space for accommodation of staff and other clinical work and are not as per MCI norms.
7. No separate microbiology department. All investigations of Microbiology are carried out in a small laboratory inside pathology department. No separate sections of Bacteriology, mycology, serology, T.B., Virology, immunology and parasitology.
8. Space for faculty members & departmental office is not available.
9. Departmental library not available.
10. Seminar room, museum, are not available.
11. No hostels for postgraduate students.
12. No audio-visual AID available.
13. Number of samples required for bacteriological examination are very less (2/day) due to lack of diagnostic facility.
14. Only a few microbiological investigations are carried out. Mycological, Parasitological examination are not done. CSF and stool samples are not tested.
15. Culture examination of common bacteriological infection not carried (typhoid fever, cholera, diphtheria).
16. High titre sera not available for diagnosis.
17. Stock culture not available.
18. No quality control and assurance.
19. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.

20. BOD, Incubator, Laminnal workflow station, Refrigerated centrifuge, ELISA reader and washer, Anaerobic Jar, Binocular Microscope, Colony counter, Photoelectric pH meter, Distillation plant and Deep fridge are not available.
21. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
22. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

11. Starting of MD (Paediatrics) & D.C.H. courses at Navodaya Medical College, Raichur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The communication received from the Principal, Navodaya Medical College, Raichur with regard for starting of MD (Paediatrics) & DCH courses at Navodaya Medical College, Raichur.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that at its earlier meeting held on 28.11.2008 while considering the Council Inspector's report (Nov.,2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Navodaya Medical College, Raichur for starting of M.D.(Paed.) & DCH courses under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore it was decided as under:-

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) and noted that Dr. Lakshmikanth J, Assoc. Prof., Unit –B does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification and his promotion is also not as per MCI norms. Resultantly, teaching component of Unit-B is incomplete; and also noted that the promotion of Dr. P.S. Patil, Professor & Incharge of Unit-C is not as per MCI norms – but even without him teaching complement of Unit-C is complete; however, as the teaching complement of Unit-A & Unit-C is complete, hence, decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Paediatrics) & D.C.H. courses at Navodaya Medical College, Raichur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 2(two) students per year in each course, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.”

This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide Council letter dated 20.12.2008.

In view of above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee decided that any rectification with regard to the existing teaching faculty has to be submitted through the Central Govt. and the institution may be informed accordingly.

12. Starting of MS (Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses at NKP Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (October, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at NKP Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for starting of MS (Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that at its meeting held on 13.12.2008 while considering the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (October,2008) in the matter of starting of MS (Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses at NKP Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik had decided as under:-

“The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (October,2008) and observed that the postgraduate qualification of Dr. Sunil Vare, Professor & Head is not a recognized qualification as the

qualification of M.S.(Ortho.) of Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad is recognized from 1994 while he has acquired the qualification in 1990.”

In response to above, the Dean, Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad in his letter dated 18.12.2008 has stated that M.S.(Ortho.) course at Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad had commenced in the year 1981 and the course came to be recognized in November, 1984.

It was also observed that the Postgraduate Committee in similar such cases has recommended that such courses be recognized from the date when the 1st batch appeared in the relevant examination.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided that the qualification of M.S.(Ortho.) possessed by Dr. Sunil Vare from Govt. Medical College, Aurangabad is a recognized qualification for the purpose of I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee also observed that Dr. Anil Golhar, Professor & Incharge of Unit-II, Dr. Sunil Mankad, Professor of Unit-II and Dr. Rajendra Patil, Asstt. Prof. of Unit-II do not possess recognized postgraduate qualifications. However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teachers mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MS(Ortho.) & D.Ortho. courses at NKP Salve Institute of Medical Sciences, Nagpur under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year in each course till the first batch admitted appear in the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

13. Starting of MD(Anatomy) course at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College & Hospital Jaipur under University of Rajasthan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Sitapur, Jaipur under University of Rajasthan for starting of MD (Anatomy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and noted that Dr. Basanti Lal Dalal, Professor does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification. However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Anatomy) course at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Hospital, Sitapur, Jaipur under University of Rajasthan u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 4 (Four) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

14. Starting of MD(General Medicine) course at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam for starting of MD (General Medicine) course under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (General Medicine) course at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session

2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 4 (Four) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

15. Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) & DA courses at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec, 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam for starting of MD (Anaesthesia) & DA courses under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec, 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Anaesthesia) & D.A.courses at PES Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Chittor, Kuppam under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Promotion of Dr. K.V. Srinivasan, Professor & HOD is not as per MCI norms.
2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

16. Starting of MD(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at Govt. Medical College, Kota under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Govt. Medical College, Kota under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences for starting of MD(Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and noted that Dr. Vijay Paliwal, Asstt. Professor, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification. However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Dermatology, Venereology & Leprosy) course at Govt. Medical College, Kota under Rajasthan University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

17. Starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Ayanavaram, Chennai under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Ayanavaram, Chennai under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University for starting of MD (Anaesthesia) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Anaesthesia) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Ayanavaram, Chennai under the Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.

2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. There is no Central & Departmental library.
4. Teaching aids are not available.
5. Radiological facilities are very basic (No CT & MRI).
6. There is no Microbiology & Biochemistry Department.
7. Pathology department needs upgradation.
8. Blood Bank facilities need upgradation.
9. There is no postgraduate hostel.
10. There is no Central Research Laboratory.
11. Central supply of oxygen and suction are not available.
12. Medical Record Section is not computerized.
13. There are only 3 (three) operation theatres in the institute.
14. ICU, NICU & PICU are not available.
15. Space for departmental office and teaching faculty is not available.
16. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
17. Clinical material is inadequate.
18. Monitoring Aids, Cardiac Defibrillators & Respirators are not available.
19. Anaesthetic arrangements for diagnostic and therapeutic nerve blocks are not available.
20. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
21. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

18. Starting of MD(Paediatrics) course courses at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri (E), Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri (E), Mumbai for starting of MD (Paediatrics) course under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MD(Paediatrics) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Andheri (E), Mumbai under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. There is no Central & Departmental library.
4. There is no departmental research laboratory.
5. There is no Blood Bank.
6. Investigative facilities namely radiological, pathological, biochemical and microbiological are inadequate.
7. Medical Record Section is not computerized.
8. ICU, NICU, PICU & ICCU are not available.
9. Resultantly, infrastructure and instrumentation are inadequate.
10. Clinical material is inadequate.
11. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

19. Starting of MS(Ophthalmology) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MS(Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of MS(Ophthalmology) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. There is no Dean.
2. There is no teaching faculty.
3. There is no central research laboratory.
4. Central library is inadequate.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that M.D.(General Medicine) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 4 (Four) students per year.

The Postgraduate Committee further decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally under A.P./Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 4 (Four) to 10 (Ten) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend that M.D.(Forensic Medicine) qualification earlier granted by Andhra University, Andhra Pradesh University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada and now by N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Rangraya Medical College, Kakinada be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admission to 1 (One) student per year.

45. Shivaji University – Approval of Dr. V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the award of MD(SPM) qualification & recognition of DPH qualification.

Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik – Approval of V.M. Medical College, Solapur for the award of DPH qualification.

Read: The compliance verification report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council inspector report (May, 2007) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at the college as well as the Council Inspectors report (Jan., 2005) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Dr. V.M. Medical College, Solapur for purpose of i) recognition of DPH qualification and approval of the college for the award of MD (SPM) qualification granted by Shivaji University and (ii) approval of the college for the award of DPH qualification under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council inspector report (May, 2007) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at the college as well as the Council Inspectors report (Jan., 2005) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities compliance

verification inspection report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council inspectors' report (Jan.,2005 & May, 2007) and decided to recommend that;

1. Dr. V.M. Medical College, Solapur be approved for the award of MD(SPM) qualification granted by Shivaji University restricting the number of admission to 3 (Three) students per year and DPH qualification be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the IMC Act,1956 restricting the number of admission to 3 (Three) students per year.
2. Dr. V.M. Medical College, Solapur be approved for the award of DPH qualification granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik restricting the number of admission to 3 (Three) students per year.

46. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – restarting of M.Ch. (Paed. Surgery) qualification at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore.

Act,1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Anand Alladi, Professor & HOD is not as per MCI norms.
2. Beds are not as per MCI norms.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

47. Bangalore University and Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore - Recognition of M.D. (Psychiatry) qualification in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore.

Read: The compliance verification report (January, 2009) togetherwith the compliance and the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 97) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore for purposes of recognition of M.D.(Psychiatry) qualification granted by Bangalore University.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council Inspector's report (Oct., 97) and decided not to recognize M.D.(Psychiatry) qualification granted by Bangalore University in respect of students being trained at Bangalore Medical College, Bangalore because of the following reasons:-

1. Promotion of Dr. H. Chandrasekhar, Professor and Dr. N.R. Prashanth, Professor are not as per MCI norms.
2. Resultantly, teaching faculty is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

48. Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narkatpally.

Read: The compliance verification report (January, 2009) together with the compliance and the Council inspector report (July, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narkatpally for purpose of recognition of MS (Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (January, 2009) together with compliance and the Council inspector's report (July, 2008) and decided to recommend that M.S.(Ophthalmology) qualification granted by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narkatpally be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 2 (Two) students per year.

6. There is no Blood Bank.
7. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
8. Instrumentation is inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

51. Starting of MD (Physiology) course at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences, Karimnagar for starting of MD (Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector's report (Dec.,2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Physiology) course at Prathima Instt. of Medical Sciences, Karimnagar under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 2 (Two) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

52. Starting of MD (TB & Chest Disease) course at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under Bharath University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

2. Resultantly, teaching complement is incomplete.
3. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

53. Increase of seats in MD (Obst. & Gynae.) course at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur under Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur under Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University for increase of seats in MD (Obst. & Gynae.) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MD (Obst. & Gynae.) course at Thanjavur Medical College, Thanjavur under Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical University u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 1 (One) to 5 (Five) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

54. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at M.V.J Medical College & Research Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Jan., 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at M.V.J. Medical College & Research Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences for increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Jan.,2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at M.V.J. Medical College & Research Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 4 (Four) to 6 (Six) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in

the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

55. Starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at ESI – PGIMSR, ESI Hospital, Basaidarapur, New Delhi under Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University for starting of MS (Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

7. Office accommodation for teaching faculty is inadequate.
8. The department does not have a museum, ward side lab or research lab.
9. Resultantly, infrastructure is inadequate.
10. Instrumentation inadequate.
11. The institution is running DNB courses.
12. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

56. Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Sri Guru Ram Das Institute of Medical Sciences, Sri Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (Dec., 2008) together with the Council Inspector's report (Nov., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sri Guru Ram Das Instt. Of Medical Sciences, Sri Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot for starting of MD(Microbiology) course under u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (Dec.,08) together with Council inspector's report (Nov.,2008) and noted that promotion of Dr. Sarabjit Sharma, Professor is not as per MCI norms. However, the teaching faculty complement other than the teacher mentioned above is adequate and complete and hence decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Sri Guru Ram Das Instt. of Medical Sciences, Sri Amritsar under Baba Farid University of Health Sciences, Faridkot u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 3 (Three) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

57. Starting of MD (Radiology) course at R.D. Gardi Medical College, Ujjain under Vikram University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at R.D. Gardi Medical College, Ujjain under Vikram University for starting of MD (Radiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MD (Radiology) course at R.D. Gardi Medical College, Ujjain under Vikram University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 because of the following reasons:-

1. MRI & DSA are not available.
2. Resultantly, instrumentation is inadequate.
3. Dr. D.P. Sinha, Professor & HOD, does not possess recognized postgraduate qualification.
4. Resultantly, teaching complement is inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies/observations as pointed out in the inspection report.

58. Starting of M.S.(Ophthalmology) & D.O. courses at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance verification report (Jan., 2009) together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar for starting of M.S(Ophthalmology) & D.O. courses u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (Jan., 2009) together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of MS (Ophthalmology) & D.O. courses at Mata Gujri Medical College, Kishanganj under B.N. Mandal University, Bihar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 3 (Three) students in each course per year till the first batch admitted appear in the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

59. Increase of seats in M.S. (General Surgery) course at Kamineni Instt. of Medical Sciences, Nalgonda under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Jan., 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Kamineni Medical Institute of Medical Sciences, Nalgonda under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for increase of seats in MS(General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Jan.,2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Kamineni Medical Institute of Medical Sciences, Nalgonda under NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 from 4 (Four) to 10 (Ten) students per year till the first batch admitted against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

60. Starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956- Consideration of compliance regarding.

Read: The matter with regard to starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that at its meeting held on 27.2.2003 while considering the compliance together with Council Inspector's report (April,2002) on the

physical and other teaching facilities available at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad for starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course had decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course and further decided to recommend to the Govt. of India disapproval of the proposal for starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course.

This decision of the Postgraduate Committee was communicated to the Central Govt. vide Council letter dated 31.3.2003. Thereafter, as no compliance was received from the college, the Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 22.05.2004 had decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the scheme for starting of this course.

A compliance was received from the Principal, Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad vide letter dated 23.02.2008.

In view of the decision taken by the Postgraduate Committee as stated above, the college authorities vide MCI letter dated 05.05.2008 were advised to apply afresh to the Central Govt. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 in the format of scheme.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided that as it was decided earlier to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the scheme and it has been communicated to the Central Govt., the institute has to apply afresh through the Central Govt. for starting of M.D.(Pharmacology) course us/ 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

61. Starting of M.D.(S.P.M.) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The matter with regard to starting of M.D.(S.P.M.) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter along with the compliance for starting of M.D.(S.P.M.) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad and observed that “the Postgraduate Committee at its earlier meeting held on 02.09.2003 while considering the compliance verification inspection report (May,2003) along with compliance and Council Inspector’s report (May,2002) had decided to reiterate its earlier decision taken at its meeting held on 27.02.2003 recommending to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(S.P.M.) course because the deficiencies pointed out earlier were still persisting. The Committee further decided to recommend to the Govt. of India for disapproval of the proposal for starting of M.D.(S.P.M.) course and the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies in accordance with the Council Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The above decision was communicated to the Central Govt. vide Council letter dated 29.09.2003 and accordingly the Central Govt. vide their letter dated 30.10.2003 had disapproved the scheme.”

In view of the above and the Central Govt. letter dated 30.10.2003, the Postgraduate Committee decided that the institute has to apply afresh through the Central Govt. for starting of M.D.(S.P.M.) course us/ 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

62. Starting of M.D(Pathology) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad affiliated to N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The matter with regard to starting of M.D.(Pathology) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad under N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the matter along with the compliance for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course at Deccan College of Medical Sciences, Hyderabad and observed that “the Postgraduate Committee at its earlier meeting held on 1st & 2nd July,2003 while considering the compliance verification inspection report (May,2003) together with compliance and Council Inspector’s report (April, 2002) had decided to recommend to the Central Govt. not to issue Letter of Intent for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course because the deficiencies pointed out earlier were still persisting. The Committee further decided to recommend to the Govt. of India for disapproval of the proposal for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course and the institution is free to apply afresh after rectification of the deficiencies in accordance with the Council Regulations on Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000.

The above decision was communicated to the Central Govt. and accordingly the Central Govt. vide their letter dated 18.08.2003 had disapproved the scheme.”

In view of the above and the Central Govt. letter dated 18.08.2003, the Postgraduate Committee decided that the institute has to apply afresh through the Central Govt. for starting of M.D.(Pathology) course u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act,1956.

63. Starting of MD (Psychiatry) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector’s report (Jan, 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences for starting of MD (Psychiatry) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s report (Jan, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Psychiatry) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 2 (Two) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

64. Starting of MD (Community Medicine) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector’s report (Jan., 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences for starting of MD (Community Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector’s report (Jan, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Community Medicine) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 4 (Four) students per year till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

65. Starting of MD (TB & Resp. Medicine) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector’s report (Jan., 2009) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of

Health Sciences for starting of MD (TB & Resp. Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council Inspector's report (Jan, 2009) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(TB & Respiratory Medicine) course at Burdwan Medical College, Burdwan under West Bengal University of Health Sciences u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 2 (Two) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

66. Starting of MD(Microbiology) course at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under Bharath University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under Bharath University for starting of MD (Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance together with the Council Inspector's report (Dec., 2008) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for starting of M.D.(Microbiology) course at Sree Balaji Medical College & Hospital, Chennai under Bharath University u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2009-2010 restricting the number of admission to 3 (Three) students per year, till the first batch admitted appear in the final examinations of the said courses. The institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualifications at the time of first available examinations as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

67. Increase of seats in M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course at Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow under Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

Read: The Council Inspector's report (Oct., 2008) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow under Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University) for increase of seats in M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that on 21.09.2001, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow was permitted to increase seats in M.Ch.(Surgical Gastroenterology) course from 1 (One) to 2 (Two) which was supposed to apply for recognition of the qualification as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 and get inspected by MCI for recognition of the increased intake of 1 (One) to 2 (Two) seats in the year 2005.

The institution may be asked to clarify why they have not applied for recognition of the qualification in the year 2005 for the increased intake from 1(One) to 2 (Two) and why they are admitting every year 2 students. Moreover, it was also noted that beds are not as per MCI norms.

68. Increase of seats in MS(ENT) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi under Amrita Vishwavidyapeetham (Deemed University) u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 – Withdrawal of application regarding.

Read: The letter dated 30/12/2008 received from the Principal, Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi regarding withdrawing their application for increase of seats in MS(ENT) course.

The members of the Postgraduate Committee observed that in its letter dated 30.10.2008 received vide fax, the Principal, Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi has stated that they are withdrawing their application for increase of seats in MS (ENT) course.

In view of above, the members of the Postgraduate Committee decided to return the application to the Central Govt. recommending disapproval of the Scheme for increase of seats in M.S.(ENT) course at Amrita School of Medicine, Kochi received u/s 10A of the IMC Act, as there is no provision u/s 10A of the Indian Medical Council Act, 1956 or the regulations framed therein to keep the application pending in the Council office.

69. Starting of DM(Cardiology) course at J.L.N. Medical College & Hospital, Ajmer (Rajasthan) – regarding.

Read: The matter with regard to starting of DM(Cardiology) course at J.L.N. Medical College & Hospital, Ajmer for the academic year 2009-2010.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that the Central Govt. vide their letter dated 06.02.2008 forwarded the request of J.L.N. Medical College & Hospital, Ajmer for starting of D.M.(Cardiology) course at their college for the academic year 2009-10.

The Central Govt. vide another letter dated 15.05.2008 again forwarded the request of the college for consideration of starting of D.M.(Cardiology) course at J.L.N. Medical College & Hospital, Ajmer for the academic year 2008-09 in place of 2009-10.

The Postgraduate Committee of this Council at its meeting held on 12.06.2008 considered the letter of the Central Govt. and decided to return the application recommending disapproval of the scheme to the Govt. of India for necessary action at their end as the last date for forwarding the application by the Central Govt. to MCI is 15th November.

The above decision was communicated to the Central Govt. vide letter dated 14.06.2008.

In reference to the above, the Central Govt. vide letter dated 19.11.2008 has again forwarded the request received from the college authorities vide letter dated 14.10.2008 for starting of D.M.(Cardiology) course at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer for the academic year 2009-10.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to carry out the inspection for starting of D.M.(Cardiology) course at J.L.N. Medical College, Ajmer u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 for the academic year 2009-10.

70. Nagarjuna University/Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada – Recognition of MD (SPM/Community Medicine) and DPH qualifications in respect of students being trained at Guntur Medical College, Guntur.

Read: The Council inspector's report (December, 2008) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Guntur Medical College, Guntur for purpose of recognition of MD (SPM/Community Medicine) and DPH qualifications earlier granted by Nagarjuna University and now by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the Council inspector's report (December, 2008) and decided to recommend that MD (SPM/Community Medicine) and DPH qualifications earlier granted by Nagarjuna University and now by Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956 restricting the number of admissions to 1 (One) student per year in each course.

71. Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore – Approval of Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur for the award of M.S. (Anatomy) qualification.

Read : The compliance verification report (October, 2008) together with the Council Inspector's report (March, 2003) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur along with institution letter dated 23.12.2008 for purpose of approval of the college for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore.

The Postgraduate Committee considered the compliance verification inspection report (October, 2008) together with the Council Inspector's report (March, 2003) along with institution letter dated 23.12.2008 and compliance verification inspection report (5th & 6th December, 2008) for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree and observed as under:-

“The members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council considered the compliance verification inspection report (5th & 6th December, 2008) along with Council Inspectors report (26th & 27th October, 2008) and decided as under:-

1. (a) The shortage of teaching faculty is 13.79% (shortage of 20 out of 145)
 - i) Professor -1 (Microbiology)
 - ii) Associate Professor - 5 (1-Physiology, 1-Biochemistry, 1-Microbiology, 1-Orthopaedics, 1- Radiodiagnosis)
 - iii) Assistant Professor - 12 (1 Lect (Bio), 2-Pharmacology, 1- Pharm.Chemist, For. Med.-1, Statistician- 1 RHTC-1, UHC-1, TB & Chest-1, Psychiatry-1, 2-Orthopaedics)
 - iv) Tutor - 2 (1-Physiology, 1-Comm. Med.)
- b) The shortage of Residents is 19.77% as under (shortage of 17 out of 86)
 - i) Sr. Resident 9 (2-Surgery, 1-Orthopaedic, 1-OBG, 2-Anaesthesiology, Radiodiagnosis-3)
 - ii) Jr. Resident 8 (1-Medicine, 1-Dermatology, 1-Psychiatry, 1-Surgery, Orthopaedics-2, 2-OBG)

Observations :

1. Bed occupancy on the day of Inspection is 35.49%.
2. Total OPD attendance on the day of Inspection is 345.
3. No normal delivery and LSCS is on the day of Inspection.
3. RHTC, Tikota belongs to State Govt. of Karnataka and the college is allowed to utilize its facilities which is not as per Regulations. No Lecturer-cum-Medical Officer having M.D. (PSM) qualification is available at RHTC, Tikota or at UHC.
4. Only 12 quarters are available within the campus for teaching faculty against the requirement of 58 as per Regulations.
5. CT Scan is non-functional.
6. There is no CSSD.

7. *Number of books in the departmental libraries of Skin & V.D. and ENT are inadequate.*
8. *Other deficiencies pointed out in the inspection report.*

The members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council observed that the periodical inspection to assess the teaching and training facilities available at the institute for continuance of recognition of MBBS degree was carried out on 15 and 16 November, 2006 and 26/27th October, 2007 wherein similar deficiencies of teaching faculty, inadequacy of clinical material, non-availability of functional unit of TB & Chest and other deficiencies of infrastructure have been observed.

In view of above, the members of the Adhoc Committee appointed by the Hon'ble Supreme Court and of the Executive Committee of the Council decided to issue a show cause notice to the authorities of Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur as to why the recognition for the award of MBBS degree should not be withdrawn u/s 19 of the IMC Act, 1956 and further decided that the institute be asked to submit its compliance within a period of 1 month as the institute has failed to rectify the deficiencies of teaching faculty, clinical material, non-availability of TB & Chest unit and other deficiencies of infrastructure, inspite of repeated opportunities have been given to the institute over a period of more than two years . Copy of the letter be also marked to Secretary (Medical Education), DME of the concerned State Govt., Registrar of the University to which the college is affiliated and also to the member of the MCI representing the State where the college is located."

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to reiterate its earlier decision not to approve Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur for the award of M.S.(Anatomy) qualification granted by Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Bangalore and further decided to direct the institution authorities to henceforth stop admissions in M.S. (Anatomy) course from the academic session 2009-2010.

72. Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Lucknow – Recognition of M.Ch. (CTVS) qualification in respect of Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow – regarding amendment in the notification of Government of India.

Read: The letter dated 06.12.2008 from the Dean, Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow with regard to recognition of M.Ch. (CTVS) qualification in respect of Sanjay Gandhi Postgraduate Institute of Medical Sciences, Lucknow with effect from July, 1994 instead of May, 1995.

The Postgraduate Committee observed that Dr. Abha Chandra, Professor (CTVS) at Sri Vanketeswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati vide her letter dated 18.08.2008 had informed that she was the candidate for CTVS examination held in July, 1994 appeared from SGPGI, Lucknow. She requested the Council to amend its notification of M.Ch. (CTVS) qualification of SGPGI, Lucknow which was recognized with the provision when granted on or after May, 1995.

The Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 02.09.2008 considered the letter dated 18.08.2008 from Dr. Abha Chandra and decided to obtain the clarification from the Dean, SGPGI, Lucknow regarding the year of commencement of the course.

The reply of the Director, SGPGI, Lucknow dated 03.09.2008 furnishing the details of M.Ch.(CTVS) qualification in respect of date of starting the course and date of examination of first batch was considered by the Postgraduate Committee at its meeting held on 22.09.2008 and the Postgraduate Committee directed the office to obtain clarification from the institute that though the permission was given to start the course in 1992, under what circumstances the course was started in the year 1990 and the students admitted therein.

The above decision was communicated to the college authorities vide Council letter dated 27.09.2008. In reply the Dean, SGPGI, Lucknow vide his letter dated 06.12.2008 has stated as under:-

“In this connection, it is to state that initially the Institute had started DM(Genetics), DM(Immunology), DM(Endocrinology), M.Ch.(Urology), M.Ch.(Neurosurgery) and along with M.Ch.(CVTS) courses in 1990 in anticipation with the approval of Medical Council of India. Subsequently, the inspections were held and Medical Council of India had recognized these courses with effect from starting of the course.

The Medical Council of India recognized the M.Ch.(Cardiovascular and Thoracic Surgery) qualification granted by SGPGI under section IMC Act,1956 when granted or on after May,1995.

Three students namely, Dr. Amit Das, Dr. Saunak Shah and Dr. Abha Chandra, passed their final examinations in 1992, 1993 and 1994 and they were given provisional degree certificate after completion of their courses by SGPGI. Their final degrees were awarded in the first Convocation of the Institute in 1994 prior to May,1995.”

The Postgraduate Committee observed that the above stated communication of the Dean, SGPGI, Lucknow does not explain as to how the students were admitted for M.Ch.(CVTS) course prior to the date on which the LOP for starting the course was granted.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided that the application of Dr. Abha Chandra for considering herself as a teacher couldn't be accepted. The office of the Council was directed to inform all the authorities accordingly.

73. Admission made in various Postgraduate medical courses after the last date i.e. 10th June, 2008 for the academic session 2008-09.

Read: The letter dated 5/12/2008 received from the Principal, J.J.M. Medical College, Davangere stating that Dr. Doshi Manali Deepak admitted in Post-graduate diploma course in Dermatology and Venereology (D.D.V.L) for the academic year 2008-09 on 23-04-2008 vide receipt No. 992530 in which the date of admission printed by mistake as 13-06-2008 in the list sent by this office vide this office letter No. JJMMC/1352/2008-09 Dated. 24-06-2008.

The Postgraduate Committee noted that at its meeting held on 22.09.2008 it was decided to initiate action u/s 10B of the I.M.C. Act,1956 against the students who were admitted in various postgraduate medical courses at J.J.M. Medical College, Davangere after the last date i.e. 10.06.2008 (by the order of the Hon'ble Court) for the academic year 2008-09. The Committee noted that in that list the name of Dr. Doshi Manali Deepak was also there.

Now the Principal, JJM Medical College, Davangere vide his letter dated 05.12.2008 has stated that Dr. Doshi Manali Deepak admitted in postgraduate diploma course in Dermatology & Venereology (DDVL) for the academic year 2008-09 on 23.04.2008 instead of 13.06.2008 which was printed by mistake. In favour of this statement, the Principal has also produced the money receipt No. 992530 dated 23.04.2008 of Dr. Doshi Manali Deepak amounting of Rs. 21,470/-.

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee decided to revoke the discharge notice issued in respect of Dr. Doshi Manali Deepak as the date of admission order and money receipt was 23.04.2008 for admission to the said course.
