The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the adjourned Item Nos. 171 to 220 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 27th October, 2014.

171. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medical College, Ernakulam under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (11th September 2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medical College, Ernakulam under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (11th September 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Malankara Orthodox Syrian Church Medical College, Ernakulam under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of patients in OPD have decreased from 42,643 in 2011 to 42,061 in 2013.
2. Total number of patients has decreased from 6,192 in 2011 to 5,548 in 2013.
3. Total number of normal deliveries has decreased from 1,709 in 2011 to 1,600 in 2013.
4. The stipend paid by State Govt. to Residents is Rs. 32,000; Rs. 33,000 & Rs. 34,000 per month respectively to I / II / III year Residents. However, the stipend paid by the Teaching Institute to Residents is Rs. 20,000 per month to I year & Rs. 25,000 per month to II / III year Residents.
5. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1.
6. Shortage of Senior Resident: 2. Dr. Deepa Bavan was shown as SR and she had experience of 2 years only and hence, she cannot be considered as SR.
7. Average bed occupancy of 3 random days was 66.8%.
8. No speciality clinics are run except Infertility clinic which is run occasionally.
9. Dr. Preetha George, Asst. Prof. in Unit I was absent on the day of Assessment; Resultantly, there are only 2 Faculty & the Faculty complement was incomplete. Hence, it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
10. On the day of Assessment, Gynaec OPD was only 24. Only 1 major & NIL minor operations were carried out.
11. Multipara monitors are not available. Cryo cautery was nonfunctional.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Stipend being paid by the Institution is Rs. 25,000 per month, which is not as per Govt. rates being paid in the State.
6. There is no Senior Resident in the Department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr. D. Selvam, Lecturer was absent on the day of Assessment. Consequently, there are only 2 Faculty in the Department. Hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.

Registers at Casualty showed more than 90 admissions per day; out of all entries, 40-50% are not found in other Departments & Registers like plaster treatment, Anaesthesia given, IPD, Operation done, etc. In Casualty, on the day of Assessment, 1 patient was found to be admitted at 10:00 a.m., who was not an emergency patient.
7. Hip & Knee Arthroplasty sets are not available.
8. Latest editions of books are not available in Departmental library.
9. Departmental Museum is small. Number of specimens, charts & diagrams are less.
10. Specialty clinics are not functioning.
11. Bed occupancy in female ward is 50%. On randomly checked days, it was observed that more than 85% of patients were of nontraumatic, minor insignificant diseases and unnecessarily long stayed patients. In male ward, On randomly checked days, it was observed that more than 50% of patients were of nontraumatic, minor insignificant diseases and unnecessarily long stayed patients.
12. Radiological & Biochemical investigative workload from the Department is inadequate. Patients sent to Radiology Department are nonsignificant orthopaedic cases and no fracture cases.
13. OPD: On the day of Assessment, total patients sitting in waiting room at 10:30 a.m. were only 15-20; however, OPD register showed entry of 49 patients for which no explanation was given by Authorities. Out of total 88 patients shown in the register till 3 p.m., 25-30% of patients were not found. There was no single entry for plaster application and plaster removal on the day of Assessment at 3 p.m.
14. On random checking, it was observed that 30-50% of cases at OPD were fracture cases; However, on cross checking with other Departments, record of only 3-5% were found.
15. No information is given about stipend paid by State Govt. to Residents. The Teaching Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 8,000 per month to Residents, which is inadequate and not as per the Regulations.
16. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. Sudeep Shetty, Assoc. Professor, Unit-II is not recognized. Consequently, there are only 2 Faculty at Unit-II, which cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
17. Total IPD of the Department of Orthopaedics during the last year was 26330, which means 87 admissions per day as against 90 beds, which is not possible.
18. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

100. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at MNR Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy (A.P.) under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

Read: the Assessment Report (15/09/2014) on the physical and other teaching facilities available at MNR Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy (A.P.) under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (15/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at MNR Medical College & Hospital, Sangareddy (A.P.) under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. On the day of Assessment, only 2 Senior Residents were present; Resultantly, there is deficiency of 1 Senior Resident.
2. Stipend being paid to the Students at the rate of Rs. 20000 per month is not at par with the Government rates.
3. No reference of the publications cited have been given.
4. Total IPD for last year in the Department of OBG was 8029, which means 26 admissions per day against 80 beds, which is actually not feasible.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Item Nos. from 101 to 171 were adjourned for next meeting on 14/11/2014.

172. Amendment in the Regulations "Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000" – reg.

Read: the letters dated 14/08/2014 and 12/09/2014 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi regarding amendment to the PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 for making mandatory rural posting in PHC/ Sub centre as an integral part of Postgraduate course curriculum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letters dated 14/08/2014 and 12/09/2014 received from the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi regarding amendment to the PG Medical Education Regulations, 2000 for making mandatory rural posting in PHC/ Sub centre as an integral part of Postgraduate course curriculum and decided that in order to take a proper decision on the matter, certain clarifications are required from the Ministry of Health & FW, Govt. of India:

The clarification may please be provided on the following points:

1. Whether the Central Government envisages a postgraduate degree course of 3 years or 4 years including one year rural scheme after completion of MD/MS course or during the course?
2. Whether the programme of Postgraduate course incorporating the rural posting applies to both Govt. and Private Medical Colleges?
3. During the 1 year rural posting that is proposed to be incorporated into the PG course, which Authority shall pay stipends to the doctors during rural posting?

The Secretary I/c, MCI is hereby requested to seek these clarifications and place them before the PG Committee after they be received.
