The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Prof.(Dr.) DhrubaJyoti Borah, Member and Dr. (Mrs.) Rani Bhaskaran, Member.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 10th December, 2014.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Dean, Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon appeared in person and attempted to give a plausible explanation to the submissions made by MCI in letter No.MCI-46(22)/2014-Med./145590 dated 17/12/2014. The explanation given by the Dean was considered by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee and it was decided to deduct the excess period from the experience given to different Faculty Members prior to the date of first LoP.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the adjourned Item Nos. 3 to 129 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 10th December, 2014 along with the recommendations of the Sub-Committee at its meeting held on 17/12/2014.

3. Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/09/2014) and compliance dated 17/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05/09/2014) and compliance dated 17/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment including proof of payment of Stipend at Govt. rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16/ Receipt from Postgraduate Students).

4. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (06/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (06/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment including proof of payment of Stipend at Govt. rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16/ Receipt from Postgraduate Students).

5. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is discrepancy in the salaries of Professors & Asso. Prof. Dr. G. Sajjan as Professor is drawing Rs. 50, 000 p.m., which is less than Dr. G. Deshpande, Asso. Prof. who is drawing Rs. 61, 000 p.m.
2. Dr. R.G. Yariwal, Asso. Prof. & Dr. B.A. Sasnur, Asso. Prof. were absent on the day of Assessment.
3. All patients attending O.B.G. & Paediatrics OPD are enrolled in a single register. There is also a register maintained by O.B.G. Doctors & one by ANM. There is substantial mismatch between the 3 registers. It appears that the total number of patients attending O.B.G. OPD may vary from 50 – 150, which is a wide variation. Rectification of data retrospectively cannot be accepted.
4. Anaesthesia records of major cases do not tally with records of specimens received in Pathology department. E.g., Anaesthesia record shows 10 Gynaec major cases from 22/01/ 2014 to 25/01/2014 but total Gynaecological specimens received in Pathology for the whole month of January are 8 only. There is gross variation with OT records. 1400 major cases in a year are incompatible with existing records.
5. Bed occupancy is 50%. On the day of Assessment, there were 29 patients on 60 Obstetric beds in 2 wards. Over the last 1 week, the average of 28 patients were available in the ward every day.
6. Only 2 bottles of whole blood were issued for the whole hospital on inspection day.
7. No new books were purchased in preceding 3 years. No foreign journal was subscribed in preceding 3 years. There are a few sporadic copies of foreign journals in the departmental library without any back issues.
8. No proof of payment of Stipend has been submitted.
9. Dr. G. Deshpande has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with benefit of 2 publications; however, one of them is a case report, which cannot be considered and the other is in unspecified internet journal, which is non-indexed. Hence his promotion is not as per the Regulations.
10. Recording of births leave a lot to be desired. Upto April 2014, they are serially numbered but after that, there is no serialling. No proof of sending birth intimation to Registrar of Births & Deaths was provided. Rectification of data retrospectively cannot be accepted.
11. Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification only. There is no Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department/ Dean of having worked as Junior Resident in OBG Department for a period of 3 years and there is no proof of payment of Salary (Bank Transfer and Form-16) during the period of JR ship.
12. Full references of publications have not been provided. All 4 publications are in house journal – i.e. Al Ameen Journal of Medical Sciences, which is non-indexed
13. Dr. B.A. Sasnur, Asso. Prof. & HoU of Unit II was absent on the day of Assessment; resultantly, Faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit. There was no leave application for reasons acceptable to MCI.
14. There is no proof of payment of stipend (Form-16) to the Postgraduate students. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/

Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, the Institution has not submitted any proof of payment of stipend at Government rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16).

15. Promotion of Dr. Gururaj R. Deshpande, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years without any publications in Indexed Journals. Retrospective rectification in promotion dates cannot be accepted.
16. Dr. Rajeshree Yaliwal, Assoc. Professor, Unit-C was absent on the day of Assessment. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-C.
17. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (06/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (06/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is no proof of payment of stipend (Form-16) to the Postgraduate students. As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality course students will be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Institution is located. However, the Institution has not submitted any proof of payment of Stipend at Government rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16).
2. There are no publications from the department in Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years. The College Authorities have not supplied with compliance any photocopies of the published Articles (not case Reports).
3. Blood Consumption suddenly increased from 3 to 15 units per day in 2013, when OPD & IPD has remained almost unchanged.
4. All Senior Residents (Except 1) are with MBBS or DCH qualification without the required teaching experience. No Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department/ Dean of having worked as Junior Resident in Paediatrics Department for a period of 3 years has been submitted and there is no proof of payment of Salary (Bank Transfer and Form-16) for the period of JR ship.
5. The column on Daily OPD, IPD, Admissions, Bed Occupancy is left blank, despite specifically writing in the SAF that no Annexures were to be used. Rectification of data retrospectively cannot be accepted.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and Diploma in Radio-Diagnosis (DMRD) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (09/09/2014) and compliance dated 17/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and Diploma in Radio-Diagnosis (DMRD) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (09/09/2014) and compliance dated 17/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) and Diploma in Radio-Diagnosis (DMRD) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is wide variation in data related with workload at different places in the report.
2. At Item 8, Part II, number of daily conventional X-rays is shown as 180-190 while in the table in summary at item 6, total number of conventional X-rays have been shown to be 55, 279 for the year 2013 indicating daily average of 151; however, at Item 9, Part II, total number of conventional X-rays has been shown as 6, 553 for the year 2013 indicating daily average of less than 22. There is thus data mismatch. Retrospective rectification of data is not allowed.
3. At Item 8, Part II, number of daily CT scan is shown as 22-25 while in the table at Item 9, Part II, total number of CT scan has been shown as 725 for the year 2013 indicating daily average of less than 3. There is thus data mismatch.
4. At Item 8, Part II, number of daily special investigations like Ba, IVP is shown as 10-15 while in the table at Item 9, Part II, total number of special investigations has been shown as 24, 501 for the year 2013 indicating daily average of more than 67. There is thus data mismatch. Further, such high incidence of special investigations is not feasible. Retrospective rectification of data is not allowed.
5. There are no publications from the Department in Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years.
6. Details of films in museum have not been provided.
7. Appointment of Dr. Mohd. Atik Ahmed, Asst. Professor with DNB qualification is not as per Regulations. He has no post DNB experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Promotion dates cannot be changed retrospectively.
8. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. Ranjana D. Valvi, Asst. Professor is not recognized. Consequently, there is a deficiency of 1 Asst. Professor.
9. 7 Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification only and no Experience Certificate of 3 years Junior Residency from concerned HoD/ Dean has been submitted and no Proof of payment of salary during the period of Junior Residency has been attached. The College Authorities have not provided proof of payment of Salary for the period of Junior Residency – Bank Transfer of Salary/ TDS/ Form-16.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

8. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) and Diploma in Orthopaedics (D.Ortho) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10/09/2014) and compliance dated 17/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) and Diploma in Orthopaedics (D.Ortho) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10/09/2014) and compliance dated 17/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to verify compliance by way of Assessment including proof of payment of Stipend at Govt. rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16/ Receipt from Postgraduate Students).

9. Starting of MD (DVL) course at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (04/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Al-Ameen Medical College, Bijapur under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Starting of MD (DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (04/09/2014) and compliance dated 12/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to verify the compliance by way of Assessment including proof of payment of Stipend at Govt. rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16/ Receipt from Postgraduate Students).

10. Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

11. Increase of seats in MD (Microbiology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Microbiology) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.

12. Increase of seats in MD (Community Medicine) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27-28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Community Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27-28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Community Medicine) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Epidemiologist cum Lecturer: 1; (b) Statistician cum Lecturer: 1; (c) Tutors: 2.
2. Paramedical staff like Medical Social Worker are not available.
3. RHTC is located at District Hospital, Jagatsinghpur, which is at a distance of 45 kms. and more than one hour's commuting time, which is not as per the Regulations. It is not under the control of the Dean. There are no specialist visits from the Medical College. Paramedical staff like Medical Social Worker, Health Educator are not available. Fixed population is not assigned to the hospital.
4. UHC: There is no LMO. There is neither Medical Social Worker nor Health Educator.
5. There is no vehicle for transport of Faculty.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

13. Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (27/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
2. Bed occupancy on the day of Assessment was 9 on 60 beds – i.e. 15%. Out of these 9 patients, 4 had only minimal Dermatological problem.
3. OPD is congested. There is no proper waiting area for patients.
4. There is not enough arrangement to assign all PGs for their clinical training.
5. Equipment like PUVA Chamber, Hand & Foot Unit are not available.
6. Arrangements for Dark Ground Microscopy, LASER, Wood Lamp, Cryotherapy are not available.
7. Departmental library does not have any new book and has only 40 books. Central library is no better. PG reading room is actually a corridor. Faculty reading room is a small conference room.
8. There is no Central Research Laboratory.
9. PG degree of Dr. Monalisha Nanda, Asst. Prof. is not recognized.
10. Unit II has only 2 Faculty Members; hence it cannot be considered as a PG Unit.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

14. Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Already maximum permissible seats as per available Faculty has been permitted. There are already 5 Professors in the Department and there are no vacancies. Hence, Assoc. Professors with 7 years experience cannot be counted as Professor regarding allotment of PG seats as has been suggested by the College Authorities.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

15. Increase of seats in MD (Transfusion Medicine) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar for Increase of seats in MD (Transfusion Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28/08/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Transfusion Medicine) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There are no Senior Residents.
2. There are only 22 books in the departmental library.
3. Already 2 permitted seats commensurate with the clinical work.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

16. Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at SCB Medical College, Cuttack under Utkal University, Bhubaneswar u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

2. As telephone bill has no user charges, its validity as proof of residence is doubtful. Office order copy for allotment of quarters does not have diary or dispatch numbers.
3. Functioning of ventilators in ICCU was in doubt, when working was observed.
4. PG Residents are not maintaining log books.

5. Blood Bank apparently has all the entries in one handwriting. When asked, how many Units have been cross matched for O.T. for elective surgery on the day of Assessment, no cross match list was shown; rather it was mentioned in the register that blood was issued to OPDs.
6. In ward, although occupancy was > 80%, IPD register showed only one hand writing of all entries, in all months / days and even backwards also.

Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Mangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of patients has remained stagnant over preceding 3 years at 25-30.
2. The Teaching Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 8, 000 per month to Residents, which is less than the Government rates (Rs. 25000 per month).
3. Dermatopath facility needs to be strengthened.
4. Promotion of Dr. Girish P.N., Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 3 years 10 months without any publications at Indexed Journals.
5. Promotion of Dr. Vilma H. Shetty, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 2 months as against the requirement of 5 years.
6. As per table page 7, column 17, total IPD of the Department last year was 11927, which means 39 admissions per day against 40 beds, which is not feasible.
7. Similarly, as per the above table, total IPD of the entire Hospital during last year was 259242, which means 864 admissions per day, which is more than the Hospital beds and hence, it is not feasible.

IPD of the year means number of patients admitted in that year. At the time of admission each patient is given an IPD number, which remains the same even if the patient stays in hospital for many days. Total IPD numbers given in a year is the total IPD of that year, which is same as the total number of patients admitted in that year.

The contention of the College Authorities in the Compliance to call Average Bed Occupancy multiplied by 365 as total IPD of the year is not correct. It is an afterthought to justify false data already provided. Percentage Bed Occupancy have been provided elsewhere in SAF.

8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

78. Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10/09/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities on the physical and other teaching facilities available at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10/09/2014) and compliance dated 14/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided that the College Authorities have not provided proof of Bank Transfer of Salary to the Postgraduate Students at Govt. rates. Instead of this they have sent a list of all expenditure from their Accounts. The information asked for should be clearly supplied by 26/12/2014, till then deferred:

- i. Proof of actual payment of Stipend to PG Students for the last 3 months.
 - ii. Mode of payment – Bank Transfer Proof
 - iii. Receipt of payment from PG Student.

IPD of the year means number of patients admitted in that year. At the time of admission each patient is given an IPD number, which remains the same even if the patient stays in hospital for many days. Total IPD numbers given in a year is the total IPD of that year, which is same as the total number of patients admitted in that year.

The contention of the College Authorities in the Compliance to call Average Bed Occupancy multiplied by 365 as total IPD of the year is not correct. It is an afterthought to justify false data already provided. Percentage Bed Occupancy have been provided elsewhere in SAF.

4. There is no Surgeon in the Department, who operates on Surgical emergencies.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

80. Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at Vydehi Institute of Medical Sciences & Research Centre, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 – consideration of compliance.

No Experience Certificate from concerned Head of the Department/ Dean of having worked as Junior Resident in General Medicine Department for a period of 3 years has been submitted and there is no proof of payment of Salary (Bank Transfer/ Form-16) during the period of JR ship.

It is surprising that the Dean has issued a single Experience Certificate on 13/11/2014 for all the 16 Junior Residents for the period upto 2007. Experience Certificates are always obtained by the Person concerned at the end of his tenure from HoD and counter signed by the Dean. This Certificate is not acceptable.

The Committee decided to summon the Dean along with Certificate of experience of all the Senior Residents and proof of payment of Salary for the period of their Junior Residency (3 years in their College).

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Out of 6 Senior Residents, 1 was absent on the day of Assessment; Hence, only 5 were present; Resultantly, there is shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
5. All types of Radiological investigations have decreased from 2011 to 2013 as under:

This is very less for a college of 200 UG seats.

6. Only one CT Scan done on inspection day.
7. No MRI done on inspection day.
8. Three years data of OPD, IPD, Major & Minor surgeries, and Histopathologies not provided.

10. Promotion of Dr. Savita Devdhar, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 5 months against the requirement of 5 years without any publications in Indexed Journals.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

8. Pathology services are not available after 5 P.M.

9. No collateral evidence of patients registered in speciality clinics was available.

4. Assoc. Professor Dr. G. Ray has been given teaching experience from 02/03/2005, which is not permissible. Consequently, his promotion as Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations and there are only 2 faculty left in the Unit, which cannot be considered a PG Teaching Unit.
5. 3 Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification. No Certificate of 3 years experience as Junior Resident in the department of Surgery signed by the HoD or the Dean has been attached and no proof of payment of Salary (Bank Transfer/ Form-16) for the period of JRship has been provided. Hence, they cannot be considered as Senior Residents.

Holiday and Medical College works for half day and this was the reason for less OPD on the day of Assessment. Both the contentions are contradictory and non-genuine.

5. Gynaecological Workload is very less.
6. 2 Tables in 1 O.T. is not permissible.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Kuppam, Andhra Pradesh under Dr. NTR University of Health

Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There are no publications from the Department at the Indexed Journals in preceding 3 years.
2. The Teaching Institute has cited the provisions of Andhra Pradesh G.O. No. 36 dt. 28/01/2004 stating that "No stipend will be paid to the PG Students admitted in private Medical/Dental College, by the Management". This is contrary to Section 13.3 of PG Medical Education Regulations which reads as under:

"The Post Graduate students undergoing Post Graduate Degree/Diploma/Super-Specialty Course shall be paid stipend on par with the stipend being paid to the Post Graduate students of State Government Medical Institutions / Central Government Medical Institutions, in the State/Union Territory where the Institution is located."

These Regulations being Mandatory in character are required to be followed by all and would take precedence over any State Govt. Order; hence any State Govt. Order, which is not in conformity with the Central Regulations is void *ab initio*. Resultantly, the action of the Teaching Institute in not paying stipend to their Residents is contrary to the PG Medical Education Regulations. The College is still not paying Stipend at Govt. rates.

3. Promotion of Dr. Chandrakala, Assoc. Professor, Unit-III is not as per the Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years as against the requirement of 5 years, without any publications in Indexed Journals.
 4. All Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification. Their Experience Certificate of having worked for 3 years as Junior Resident in Paediatrics signed by the HoD/ Dean was neither submitted at the time of Assessment nor supplied with compliance. Hence, they are not eligible and cannot be considered as Senior Residents. Consequently, there is a deficiency of 5 Senior Residents.
 5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22/09/2014) and compliance dated 18/11/2014 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Pathology) course at Sri Siddhartha Medical College, Tumkur under Sri Siddhartha University (Deemed to be University), Tumkur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Average daily Histopathological workload is only 8 which is inadequate.
2. Annual specimens processed for Surgical Pathology are 1370 giving an average of less than 4 / day.

3. Annual specimens processed for Cytology are 717 giving an average of less than 2 / day.

The data asked for was for previous 3 years. Predicted values for 2014 cannot be accepted.

4. Stipend being paid by the Teaching Institute is Rs. 18000 per month, which is less than the Government rates (Rs. 25, 000 per month). No proof of payment of Stipend to Postgraduate Students at Government rates (Bank Transfer/ Form-16/ receipt from Postgraduate Students) have been provided.
5. A few specialized investigations need to be added in Haematology.

9. Occupancy & cleanliness of SICU is poor. 50% of Ventilators are not functional.
10. Library remains unused by teachers & PGs.
11. No new books have been added in last 5-6 years in Departmental library.
12. Log books are not used or maintained by Residents.
13. Address proof of some doctors is doubtful as telephone bill shows zero use and accommodation certificates given by the Teaching Institute do not have issue number or date.
14. In the list of equipment on page 25, at item # 4 Invasive monitors, they are shown to be "Not Available", but also shown as "functional", which is not feasible.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The calculation given by the College Authorities gives total bed occupancy in the year and not IPD. It is an after thought to justify erroneous data already provided. Each patient when admitted is given an IPD number, which is not changed even if he stays for a week. Years IPD is total IPD numbers given in that year. As per your calculation bed occupancy should be 80% (24 out of 30) but as per your report bed occupancy was 92%. This is a data mismatch.

2. There is discrepancy in IPD figures of the year 2013 i.e. on page 2 of the Assessment Report total IPD is 8761, whereas on the Page 3 of the Assessment Report total IPD is 10051. The data is thus non-genuine and imaginary.

6. All staff with MD (pathology) qualification without any special training in Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion. The Certificate of Experience submitted about 3 Faculty Members do not give any dates of their training period. At the same time they have not been away from the department of Pathology for 2 years at any time, which is evident from the details of their experience given. Hence, the present Certificates cannot be accepted.
