**1. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> November, 2014.

**2. Minutes of the last meeting of The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted & approved the action taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

As per the decision of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee at its meeting held on 14/11/2014, the Council vide letter dated 18/11/2014 requested the Dean, Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar to appear before the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee on 28/11/2014 at 10:30 A.M.

The representatives of the College came and explained their view point on the issues raised in the letter dated 18/11/2014 sent to them. Their reply was highly unconvincing and the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to issue them Show-Cause Notice for recommending stoppage of PG admissions for next 2 years.

**3. Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at ACPM Medical College, Dhule, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at ACPM Medical College, Dhule, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at ACPM Medical College, Dhule, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. OPD on the day of Assessment was only 15-16. Bed occupancy was 67% on the day of Assessment.
2. There are no publications from the Department in Indexed Journals in the preceding 3 years.
3. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
4. Principal of the College, Dr. B.G. Patil is on medical leave since July 2014 upto 06/11/2014.
5. Weekly workload of major operations was shown as 15 indicating daily workload of major operations as less than 3, which is inadequate.
6. No new books have been added in Departmental Library in the preceding 3 years.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**4. Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) course at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (28th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (28th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Forensic Medicine) course at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Clinical material for Sexual offences (Victim & Accused), Subject Age Estimation and Pregnancy certification are not available.

2. Except for Post-mortems, no other medico-legal work has been done in the preceding 3 years.
3. There was no medico-legal autopsy on the day of Assessment.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. **Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Azeezia Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Meeyannor, Kerala under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (19th September 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Azeezia Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Meeyannor, Kerala under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (19th September 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Azeezia Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Meeyannor, Kerala under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Equipment like Yag LASER, Green LASER & B scan are not available.
2. Wet laboratory, Observer scope & CCTV facilities are not available.
3. No O.T. list was observed on the day of Assessment.
4. Offices for Faculty are not available.
5. Speciality services were not upto the mark.
6. Septic beds are shared with Surgery Department, which may create complications & potential threat of cross infection.
7. No information is provided regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Kerala or to be paid by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
8. Average OPD attendance of 3 randomly selected days was 40.
9. In Departmental Museum, there was not a single specimen.
10. Retinal surgery was performed occasionally. There was no full time Vitreo Retinal Surgeon.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. **Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (14th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai for Starting of MD (Pathology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (14th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Pathology) course at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No information is provided regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Tamil Nadu or to be paid by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
2. Frozen section is not available. Freezing Microtome is not installed. Cryostat is not available.
3. Only PAS stain is available. No other special stain is available.
4. There is no autopsy work – either medico-legal or Pathological.
5. Blood component separation facility: License is available but activity has not started yet.
6. There are no Paediatric blood bags.
7. Immunohistochemistry: No slides or records were available.
8. Histopathology: Reporting is nonstandardized. There are no clinical details. No gross findings are shown.
9. There is practically no work in Central or Departmental Research Laboratory.
10. There is no single reference book for Histopathology or Cytopathology.
11. Daily average Histopathological workload is only 9. Number of specimens of urine and other fluids processed is only 2.
12. From year-wise data average Histopathology was 6 per day, which is very inadequate.
13. The SAF has been altered. Column of publications have been deleted.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. **Starting of MD (Physiology) course at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (16th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai for Starting of MD (Physiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (16th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Starting of MD (Physiology) course at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2015-2016 restricting the number of admissions to 2(Two) students per year, till the first batch admitted appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification at the time of first available examination, as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality Course students shall be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Teaching Institution be located.

The recommendation/ permission is subject to condition that the College will give an Undertaking to implement the above decision regarding payment of stipend to the Postgraduate Students.

**8. Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (15th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai for Starting of MD (Microbiology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (15th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Microbiology) course at Dhanalakshmi Srinivasan Medical College & Hospital, Perambalur, Tamil Nadu under The Tamilnadu Dr. MGR Medical Univeristy, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Facilities like Molecular Diagnostic Aids & Mycobacterial culture are yet to be established.
2. No information is provided regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Tamil Nadu or to be paid by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
3. Anaerobic culture facilities are not available.
4. As per the data provided, 136 Virology samples were received on Assessment day, which does not appear to be realistic.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**9. Starting of MD (DVL) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Starting of MD (DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (DVL) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of patients in OPD have increased from 12,902 in 2010-11 to 23,034 in 2013-14 but total number of patients at IPD have decreased from 6,438 to 3,415 during the same period.
2. Although total number of patients at IPD have decreased from 6,438 in 2010-11 to 3,415 in 2013-14. Weekly clinical workload for IPD was shown to have increased from 35 to 48 during the same period, which is not feasible. There is thus data mismatch.
3. No information was provided regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Tamil Nadu or to be paid by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
4. Bed occupancy was 40% on the day of Assessment.
5. Procedures like Skin Grafting, Nail Surgeries & LASER procedures have not been carried out in the preceding 3 years.

6. Speciality clinics like Autoimmune Disease clinic & Vesticulobullous Diseases clinic are not run.
7. Dr. Mariam Philip, Professor & HoD has been Assoc. Professor for 3 years 6 months without any publications in Indexed Journals. He had no Post DNB experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence, not eligible.
8. Dr. John Felicita Samson, has no post DNB experience at the time of appointment as Asst. Professor. Hence, not eligible.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**10. Starting of MD (General Medicine) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (28th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Starting of MD (General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (28th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (General Medicine) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There is only 1 paper accepted for publication from the Department in Indexed Journals in the preceding 3 years.
2. IPD of entire Hospital during the last year has been reported as 1,53,000. At the same time, total IPD of Medicine and Surgery was more than that, which is not feasible.
3. Total IPD of the Hospital is 1,53,000, which means 511 admissions per day, which is not feasible as against the total beds of the Hospital. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**11. Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of USG (Colour Doppler) studies & USG guided procedures have remained stagnant over the preceding 3 year period.
2. There are no physical Journals at Central Library.
3. Shortage of Senior Residents: 4.
4. In the table at Point # 6 on Page 5, number of DSA shown is 28 for the year 2012-2013, while in the table at Point # 9 on Page 29, it is shown as 7. There is thus data mismatch.
5. Details of AERB approval are not provided.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**12. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Variety of cases (clinical material) needs to be more for the PG training.
2. Number and type of major operations in elective OT are very few.
3. There are no publications from the Department in Indexed Journals in the preceding 3 years.
4. Shortage of Senior Residents: 2.
5. Speciality clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic clinic, Plastic surgery clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology & Surgical Oncology clinic are not run.
6. Details of speciality services provided by the Department are not given.
7. Details of theory PG classes conducted in last 12 months are not provided.
8. Total IPD for 2010-11 was 30900, 2011-12 was 31500 and for 2012-13 was 32100, which means about 105 admissions per day as against 120 beds, which is not feasible.
9. OPD figures and IPD figures on page 2 and page 27 are different. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
10. Unit-II has only 2 Faculty. Hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
11. Dr. Pradeep Somraj, Asst. Professor, Unit-IV, passed DNB from the same College in 2013. He cannot be Asst. Professor from 15/10/2012. This also means that the College is admitting DNB candidates simultaneously,

which is not permissible. Consequently, Unit-IV has only 2 Faculty, which cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.

12. The College obtained LoP in 2002. Dr. Punithan, Professor has been given Teaching Experience from 02/11/2001, which is not permissible.
13. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**13. Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (27th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Orthopaedics) course at Dr. Somervell Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College Thiruvananthapuram under Kerala University of Health & Allied Sciences, Thrissur u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Asst. Professor: 2.
2. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
3. Unit II has only 2 Faculty; hence, it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Average daily operations (from 3 years data) 1.6 per day and average daily Minor Operations 2.7 per day, which is very inadequate.
5. Average daily Histopathology is 6-9, which is not feasible.
6. Unit-II has only 2 Faculty. Hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
7. Dr. Charles Abraham, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I passed his DNB in 2006. He cannot be considered as Asst. Professor from 30/03/2005. Consequently, there are 2 Faculty and wrong information has been supplied in the SAF.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**14. Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (29th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (29th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (Ophthalmology) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil



Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Bed occupancy is only 60% on the day of Assessment.
2. There are no publications from the Department in Indexed Journals in the preceding 3 years.
3. No details are given regarding stipend paid to Residents either by the Govt. of Maharashtra or proposed to be paid by the Teaching Institute.
4. Shortage of Junior Resident: 1.
5. Dr. S.A. Malik, shown as Professor & HoD, had not attached any residence proof. When insisted upon, Dean provided an address proof showing her residence in a hostel room. She was not aware of her date of joining in the Teaching Institution. On enquiry, she told it was 15/09/2014 while on D.F. it was shown as 01/08/2014. There was not even a single entry in her name in the O.T. Register. She does not seem to be a regular employee of the Teaching Institute and cannot be considered as Professor & HoD.
6. Resultantly, there is no Professor to head the Department as the second Professor is also Dean and therefore cannot be HoD of the Eye Department.
7. Specialized services are inadequate.
8. Average number of admissions do not tally with number of major & minor surgeries performed.
9. Equipment for Retinal surgery & Ophthalmic LASER are not available.
10. Major operations during the years 2011, 2012 and 2013 are more than the total IPD in the corresponding year, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

**15. Starting of MS (OBG) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (29th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (OBG) course at Dr. Ulhas Patil Medical College & Hospital, Jalgaon, Maharashtra under Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. OPD attendance was only 20 & Bed occupancy only 51% on the day of Assessment. All the patients were Obstetric patients in I trimester. There was no patient on IV fluids. There was no Gynaecological patient.
2. There was no delivery, either Normal or Caesarean on the day of Assessment.
3. Number of major & major operations on the day of Assessment was only 1 each, which is inadequate.
4. The operative data of major & minor Surgery submitted by the College could not be verified from OT/ Anaesthesia Registers. None of the patients purportedly operated on previous days were found in any ward on the day of Assessment.

5. Specialized services provided are inadequate.
  6. Specialized equipment was inadequate.
  7. Copies of Birth registration forms sent by the Teaching Institute to the Registrar of Births & Deaths were not available for verification.
  8. No details are given regarding stipend paid to Residents either by the Govt. of Maharashtra or proposed to be paid by the Teaching Institute.
  9. Form 16 submitted by the Faculty have been issued by the College itself and their authenticity could not be verified. Majority of teachers have not had their TDS deducted according to the documents submitted.
  10. O.T. was shared with other Departments.
  11. There is no USG with Colour Doppler in the Department.
  12. On the day of Assessment, local server linking the Teaching Institute to the MUHS was not functional.
  13. Segregation of Biomedical Waste was not done at the generation sites.
  14. Ten years of administrative experience as required under Regulations of MCI, Dr. C.A. Kante, Medical Superintendent was not evidenced.
  15. Unit 3 has only 1 Faculty, who was present at verification; hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit at all.
  16. There was no Gynaecology patient at OPD on the day of Assessment.
  17. Average of OPD patients on 3 randomly selected days was only 42/ day, which is inadequate.
  18. Some consultants mentioned as incharge of speciality clinics were absent on the day of Assessment.
  19. OPD: Arrangement for examination of patients and equipment were inadequate.
  20. Out of the Faculty Table submitted, 21 persons were absent, which means all data was false and fictitious.
  21. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.
16. **Starting of MD (Emergency Medicine) course at Era's Lucknow Medical College & Hospital, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. R.M.L Avadh University, Faizabad, U.P. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (28th October 2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Era's Lucknow Medical College & Hospital, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. R.M.L Avadh University, Faizabad, U.P. for Starting of MD (Emergency Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (28th October 2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Emergency Medicine) course at Era's Lucknow Medical College & Hospital, Lucknow, Uttar Pradesh under Dr. R.M.L Avadh University, Faizabad, U.P. u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Jayant Bajpai, Professor attained age of 70 years on 18/11/2014; hence, he cannot be considered as Teaching Faculty. Consequently, there were only 2 Faculty Members. Hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
2. All the Faculty & Residents have been posted to the Department only from August 2014 onwards; however the data of clinical material for years 2012 & 2013 for the Department have been submitted, which is not feasible. There is thus data mismatch.
3. Two beds each were at ICCU, MICU, SICU & NICU and 1 bed at PICU were shown for the Department of Emergency Medicine. It is not clear

who was looking after these beds and the remaining beds at these ICUs. It is also not clear how many beds have been shown for other Departments.

4. In Departmental Library, total number of books were shown as 109, but the number of new books purchased in the preceding 3 years have been shown as 135, which is not feasible. There is thus data mismatch.
5. Total IPD of 2013 was 8692, which means 29 admissions per day as against 30 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
6. There were no Publications from the Department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Data of clinical material on the day of Assessment have not been provided in the Summary of SAF.
2. Average number of Caesarean delivery was less than 1, which is inadequate.
3. There are only 2 publications from the Department in Indexed Journals in the preceding 3 years.
4. No death is shown to have occurred amongst O.B.G. patients in the whole of last year, which is not feasible at the Tertiary Care Hospital. There is thus data mismatch. It is also indicative of poor quality of Teaching material.
5. Shortage of Senior Residents: 3.
6. Gynaecology workload is relatively less.
7. The following Faculty have appeared in Assessments of other Colleges, after 01/03/2014:

10. Many of the Senior Residents are not eligible for appointment to the post of Senior Resident.
11. Daily Blood used was only 1 Unit, which means inadequate clinical material.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

  7. Details of space at OPD & IPD are not provided.
  8. List of available & functional important equipment are not provided.
  9. Major operations in 2013 were 4680 on page 2 and 1220 on page 16.
  10. Total IPD of the entire Hospital was 38983 and total IPD of Surgery Department was 39420, which is more than the entire hospital and hence, not feasible.
  11. Total IPD of Surgery was 39420, which means 131 admissions per day as against 120 beds and hence, not feasible.
  12. Data of IPD on page 2 and page 11 was different.

7. Unit-IV, V, VI has only 25 beds each, which is not as per the Regulations.
8. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. G.S. Bhattacharya, Asst. Professor, Unit-II is not recognized. Consequently, there are only 2 Faculty Members in Unit-II.

9. Details of speciality clinics like Spine clinic, Arthroplasty clinic are not provided.
10. Speciality clinics like Hand clinic, Arthroscopy clinic are not run.

3. Dr. A.A. Iraqi, Professor & HoD is more than 69 years old and due to complete 70 years in June 2015; hence, he cannot be considered as a PG teacher for 2015 batch.
4. Dr. P.K. Aggarwal, Asst. Professor has not produced Relieving Order from the previous Teaching Institute where he was working; hence, he cannot be considered as a Faculty Member.
5. Academic parameters like PG Theory classes (23 in number), Clinical seminars (21 in number), Journal Club (only 7) are inadequate.
6. Total IPD of the entire Hospital last year was 197161, which means 657 admissions per day as against 630 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
7. Total IPD of the Department of Orthopaedics is 18720, which means 63 admissions per day as against 60 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
8. Total Blood used was only 2 units per day.

9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Although total number of IPD patients has been shown as 25,674 in 2013, total number of major & minor operations were shown as 1,044 & 3,751 - i.e. 4,795. Total number of deliveries were shown as 2,826. Thus 70% of cases were admitted for non-operative non-delivery causes.
3. Academic parameters like Journal club (only 14) are inadequate.
4. Wrong SAF has been used and SAF has been altered.
5. Total IPD of the entire Hospital last year was 197161, which means 657 admissions per day as against 630 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
6. Total IPD of the Department of OBG is 25674, which means 85.5 admissions per day as against 80 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

6. Out of all the publications, 2 are in Dental and 3 in Public Health. None were related to Radio-Diagnosis.
7. College obtained LoP on 14/07/2006. However, Dr. Pradeep Prakash, Professor has been given teaching experience from 01/04/2006.

6. Total IPD of the Department of Psychiatry 9720, which means 32 admissions per day as against 30 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Total number of major surgeries in 2013 was shown as 8,481 while annual specimens processed for Surgical Pathology in 2013 were shown as 9,258, which was not feasible. There was thus data mismatch.
3. Space for Faculty was inadequate.
4. At the Museum, specimens were less. Brain specimens were not seen.
5. Stipend paid by the Govt. of U.P. to Residents was Rs. 15,600 p.m. while the Teaching Institute was paying Rs. 8,000; Rs. 9,000 & Rs. 10,000 p.m. to I/ II/ III year Residents respectively, which was less and not as per the Regulations.

7. Resultantly, there was deficiency of Faculty: (a) Asso. Professor: 1.
8. Total IPD of the entire Hospital last year was 197161, which means 657 admissions per day as against 630 beds, which was not feasible. The data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
9. Total Deaths in the Hospital 673 and total Autopsy 1681, which was neither feasible nor possible. Data was non-genuine and fictitious.
10. Daily Major Operations as per this Assessment Report was 28 per day. As per Anaesthesia Report 21 per day and Histopathology 31 per day, this is thus data mismatch.
11. Annual Specimen processed for Histopathology 9528 i.e. 32 per day, which is more than daily Major Surgeries.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Clinical Material at other Departments has been found to be non-genuine and they are the feeding Departments to Microbiology. If their clinical material be non-genuine then it will reflect the clinical material of Microbiology, as well.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Central Research laboratory is not well equipped.
3. PICU has 3 beds.
4. Speciality services like Paediatric Cardiology clinic, Diarrhoea clinic, Thalassaemia clinic are not functional/ existent.
5. Promotion of Dr. Dayanand, Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years and Assoc. Professor for 3 years.
6. Promotion of Dr. Ritu Jain, Professor is not as per the Regulations. She has been Assoc. Professor for 3 years as against the requirement of 4 years.
7. College obtained LoP on 15/07/2008. Dr. Daya Chand, Professor has been given Teaching experience from 01/08/2007, which is not permissible.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

10. Nursing station in wards needs improvement. Monitoring of patients in wards was poor.
11. Space for Asst. Professor was inadequate.
12. Speciality clinic like Cardiovascular & Thoracic clinic, Surgical Gastroenterology clinic, Neurosurgery clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic were not functional.
13. Colonoscopy was not available.

2. Total IPD of the Medicine Department for 2013-14 was 56571, which means 188 admissions per day as against 180 beds, which was not feasible.
3. Total IPD of the entire Hospital, last year was 256274, which means 857 admissions per day, which was more than total bed strength of the Hospital.
4. Promotion of Dr. Paneer Selva, Professor was not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 11 months as against the requirement of 5 years.
5. All Senior Residents are MBBS and no experience Certificate as Junior Resident had been attached from the concerned HoD.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

3. Total IPD of the DVL Department for 2013-14 is 9623, which means 31 admissions per day as against 40 beds, which is not feasible.
4. Postgraduate degree of Dr. A.A. Buvana Ratchagan, is not recognized. Consequently, he cannot be considered as Faculty. There are only 2 Faculty at the Unit. Hence, it cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
5. The College obtained LoP on 05/06/2006. Dr. M. Basavraj, Professor & HoD had been given Teaching experience from 20/12/2005, which was not permissible.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Number of deliveries for the whole year 2013-14 were 520 giving an average of 1.4/ day (Normal: 384; Operative Vaginal: 34; Caesarean: 102), which were inadequate.
2. Number of Caesarean Sections for the whole year 2013-14 was only 102 giving an average of 0.27/day, which was inadequate.
3. No information was provided regarding stipend paid to Residents by Govt. of Puducherry or proposed to be paid by the Teaching Institute.
4. Deficiency of Faculty: (a) Asst. Professor: 1.
5. Shortage of Junior Resident: 2.
6. Seminar room was small.
7. Use of component separation product was not found from the record.
8. MRD is poorly maintained even if it was partly computerized.
9. Unit III has only 2 Faculty; hence, it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
10. On the day of Assessment, there was no operation in Obstetric – either major or minor. In Gynaecology, number of major operations were only 2 and no minor operation was performed.
11. No delivery was conducted, either normal or Caesarean, on the day of Assessment.
12. No bed was occupied in Obstetric ICU on the day of Assessment.
13. Prenatal diagnosis services were not provided.
14. CPC was not held.
15. Total IPD of the entire Hospital, last year was 256274, which means 857 admissions per day, which is more than total bed strength of the Hospital.
16. On the day of Assessment, there were no delivery, no caesarians and only 3 Major Operations.

17. Promotion of Dr. Nirmala Jaget is not as per the Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years 3 months.
18. No Senior Resident is eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident. They do not have 3 years Teaching Experience. No certificate of experience has been attached from concerned HoD as Junior Resident.
19. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Departmental Library was inadequate.
2. Audiologist/ Speech Therapist was not available.
3. Clinical material was inadequate. Admitted patients were not ENT patients but were having complaints pertaining to other Departments, as if they were admitted just to fill up the beds.
4. Adequate reference books were not available at the Library.
5. Total number of IPD patients in 2013-14 was 12,321 while number of major operations was 659 & minor operations was 1,124- i.e. total operations was 1,783. As many as 85% patients were admitted for non-operative causes, which was not feasible.
6. Average consumption of blood units in the Department was shown as 1/day, which was not feasible.
7. Procedures like Laryngectomy, Laryngo/ Tracheoplasty, Rhinoplasty, Maxillectomy had not been performed at the preceding 3 years.
8. Equipment like Flexible fiberoptic Nasopharyngolaryngoscope/ Bronchoscope were not available.
9. Academic parameter like Group discussion (only 9) was inadequate.
10. No information was provided regarding stipend paid to Residents by Govt. of Puducherry or proposed to be paid by the Teaching Institute.
11. Total IPD of the entire Hospital, last year was 256274, which means 857 admissions per day, which was more than the total bed strength of the Hospital.
12. Total IPD of ENT Department for 2013-14 was 12321, which means 41 admissions per day as against 40 beds, which is not feasible. The data is thus non-genuine and fictitious.
13. Both the Senior Residents were not eligible. They have no 3 years Teaching experience as Junior Resident, and certified by the HoD.
14. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

3. Promotion of Dr. Samir Inamdar, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 3 years 5 months as against the requirement of 5 years.
4. There are gaps in the service of Dr. Anita S. Date, Professor in the same College. It seems, she has been joining at the time of Assessment and then leaving the College.
5. 8 Senior Residents are MBBS only. There are no certificate of experience as Junior Residents from concerned HoD.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Total IPD of Surgery Department during year 2012, 2013 and 2014 were 5791, 6631 and 5011. Major Surgeries during corresponding year were 6975, 7248 and 5890, which was more than total IPD and not possible. The data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
3. College obtained LoP on 30/07/2004. The following Faculty Members have been given experience on dates mentioned as against their name, which was prior to establishment of the College and hence, not permissible:

6. Promotion of Dr. Vishal Jain, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor 4 years 4 months as against the requirement of 5 years.
7. Promotion of Dr. Rajeev Jain, Assoc. Professor is not as per the Regulations. He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years as against the requirement of 5 years.
8. 8 Senior Residents were MBBS and no experience certificate as Junior Residents were attached from the HoD.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (29/10/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

Total number of patients in IPD for 2014 till September are shown as 2,927 while total number of major & minor operations during the same period are shown as 3,596 & 4,750 – i.e. total 8,346, which is not feasible. Even the number of major operations at 3,596 is more than number of IPD patients at 2,927, which was not possible. There was thus data mismatch.
2. Attendance in speciality clinics like Glaucoma clinic, Retina clinic, Squint clinic, Cornea clinic, Paediatric Ophthalmology clinic, Oculoplasty clinic

was very poor and not commensurate with the number claimed to be attending OPD.

3. College obtained LoP on 30/07/2004. Dr. Lubakhon, Professor had been given experience from 23/02/2004, which was prior to establishment of the College and hence, not permissible.
4. Promotion of Dr. Shreya Thatte, Professor is not as per the Regulations. She has been Asst. Professor for 4 years and Assoc. Professor for 3 years as against the requirement of 5 years and 4 years, respectively.
5. Promotion of Dr. Neeti Nima, Professor is not as per the Regulations. She has been Assoc. Professor for 3 years as against the requirement of 4 years.
6. Total IPD of Ophthalmology Department during year 2012, 2013 and 2014 were 3107, 3990 and 2927. Major Operations during corresponding year were 3950, 4228 and 3596, which was more than the total IPD and not possible. The data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Total number of patients in IPD for 2014 till September are shown as 1,395 while total number of major & minor operations during the same period was shown as 1,508 & 3,596 – i.e. total 4,904, which was not feasible. Even the number of major operations as 1,508 was more than the number of IPD patients as 1,395, which was not possible. There was thus data mismatch.
2. Procedures like Maxillectomy & Laryngo/Tracheoplasty had been performed only once in 3 years.
3. Attendance at speciality clinics like Rhinology related clinic, Otology related clinic & Cancer related clinic are very poor and not commensurate with the number claimed to be attending OPD patients.
8. Academic parameters like Journal Club (only 12), Group discussion (only 11) are inadequate for PG Teaching Programme.
9. College obtained LoP on 30/07/2004. The following Faculty Members have been given teaching experience on dates mentioned as against their name, which was prior to establishment of the College and not permissible:
  - i. Dr. Vishal Munjal, Professor: 01/09/2003
  - ii. Dr. Shailender Karnwat, Assoc. Professor: 26/01/2004

10. Total IPD of ENT Department during year 2012, 2013 and 2014 were 1371, 1897 and 1395. Major Operations during corresponding year were 1350, 1661 and 1508, which was more than total IPD and hence, not possible. The data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided to issue Show-Cause Notice to the Institute for giving experience to the Faculty Members prior to establishment of the College.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (02/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Psychiatry) course at VSS Medical College, Burla, Odisha under Sambalpur University, Burla u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. OPD attendance on the day of Assessment was only 20.
2. No stipend is being paid by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
3. There is no Professor or Asso. Professor in the only Unit. Resultantly, Faculty complement was incomplete.
4. Department was headed by Asst. Professor, which is not as per the Regulations.
5. Junior Residents working at this Department were posted at General Medicine Department.
6. Clinical Psychologist was absent on the day of Assessment. There was no document about his leave or absence.
7. Department Library was not available.
8. Teaching Beds are only 20; Resultantly, there was shortage of 10 Teaching beds.
9. There was no sanction for post of social worker.
10. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
11. No speciality clinic was functional.
12. Details of space in OPD & wards were not provided.
13. No details of CPC had been provided.
14. The College has been admitting 2 Students per year from 2011 onwards without any Letter of Permission. The Dean may be asked to explain the circumstances under, which, these 2 Students are being admitted.
15. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Bed occupancy is 50% on the day of Assessment.
2. Special clinics like Neuro Psychiatry clinic for the elderly, Psychomotor clinic, Memory clinic are not functional.
3. The Teaching Institute was granted 6 seats, 4 Degree and 2 Diploma. The request for increase is from 2 to 6 is thus not permissible.

4. In Unit-V, Dr. Baint Singh Bali was an Academic Arrangement, which was not acceptable.
5. No experience details of Faculty were provided.

7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. There are 2 Units but each Unit had only 15 beds as against requirement of 30 beds for each PG Unit.
2. Bed occupancy was 20% on the day of Assessment.
3. Phototherapy Unit was not functional on the day of Assessment.
4. Unit I had no Asso. Professor; hence, Faculty complement was incomplete in the Unit I.
5. Unit II had only 2 Faculty Members; hence, it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
6. Resultantly, no Unit can be considered as a PG Unit.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (12/09/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (Ophthalmology) course at RajaRajeswari Medical

College Medical College & Hospital, Bangalore under Rajiv Gandhi University of Health Sciences, Karnataka u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. 10 beds were shared with Skin & VD, which was objectionable in view of potential cross infection.
2. Equipment like FFA, B scan were not available.
3. Clinical material was inadequate. It does not have any variety, which would be useful for PG training.
4. Speciality clinics were not upto the mark. There was no evidence of documentation in the form of clinical photographs, FFA, OCT images, etc.
5. O.T. statistics provided by the Teaching Institute for the period 06/08/2014 to 10/08/2014 do not match with the entries in the original O.T. Register of Ophthalmology O.T. There was disparity between provided O.T. statistics & actual workload.
6. OPD was only 80 & Bed occupancy was 70% on the day of Assessment.
7. There were no operations on the day of Assessment.
8. Total number of IPD patients in 2013 was shown as 2,194 while the number of major & minor operations in 2013 is shown as 1,572 & 6,295 – i.e. total 7,867, which was not possible. There was thus data mismatch.
9. There was disparity between data of clinical material submitted and actual data as verified.
10. Dr. Professor & HoD was from Army Teaching Institution. No experience details as Graded Specialist, Classified Specialist and Advisor has been provided from, which, his Teaching experience could be calculated.
11. Bed Occupancy was 70% only, which is not permissible.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Out of total Faculty, the names of Dr. Alok Soni & Dr. Pradip Bhargava, both Professors were not found in O.T. Registers. Dr. Narayan Masand was entered afterwards in different handwriting & pen, which indicates that probably he is not a full timer and not participating in O.T., Teaching & training.
2. On the day of Assessment, there were only 41 patients.
3. Total number of IPD patients in 2013 was shown as 2,987 while number of major & minor operations was shown as 3,926 & 7,248 – i.e. total of 11,174, which was not feasible. Even total number of major operations as 3,926 was more than the total number of IPD patients as 2,987, which was not possible. There was thus gross data mismatch.
4. On the day of Assessment, there were only 2 patients in one ward of 20 beds while other wards of 100 beds had 84 – i.e. total occupancy was 86 out of 120 (71%).

5. Both Central & Departmental libraries were grossly deficient. There were no latest edition books or sub-speciality books for P.G.s at both these libraries. There were only 2-3 recent (not latest) edition textbooks in both these libraries combined.
6. There was only a small room for 6 Asst. Professor. Space for Faculty was inadequate.
7. Total IPD of Orthopaedics Department for 2012, 2013 and 2014 were 2376, 2987 and 2641. Major Operations for the corresponding years were 3610, 3926 and 3335, which was more than the total IPD, which was not possible.

8. There was no Asso. Professor in Unit I; Resultantly, Faculty complement was incomplete in Unit I. On Page 4, it was shown that Unit I had 1 Professor, 1 Asso. Professor & 1 Asst. Professor but at Faculty table on Page 30-32, 1 Professor & 2 Asst. Professor was shown. There was thus a discrepancy in Faculty complement.
9. All Senior Residents were MBBS without any Certificate of 3 years experience of Junior Resident from concerned HoD.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (26/08/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (TB & Chest Disease) course at Mahatma Gandhi Medical College and Research Institute, Puducherry under Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No details were provided regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Puducherry or by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
2. There was no X-ray view box in procedure room.
3. RICU had 4 beds.
4. Treatment for MDR Tuberculosis was not available.
5. Academic parameter like Theory lecture (only 12) was inadequate.

6. For the PG Degree seats as against surrender of diploma seats. The College has to approach for Notification by Government of India for deleting Diploma seats from the schedule.
7. 1 Professor, Dr. Narsingh was absent on the day of Assessment. Consequently, Unit-II left with only 2 Faculty and this cannot be considered as a Teaching Unit.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**141. Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Puducherry under Bharath University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (30/10/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Puducherry under Bharath University, Chennai for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (30/10/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MD (Paediatrics) course at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Puducherry under Bharath University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No details are given regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Puducherry or by the Teaching Institute to Residents.
2. Total IPD in 2014 in the Department of Paediatrics was 28382, which means 95 admissions per day as against 90 beds, which was not feasible.
3. Total IPD of entire Hospital last year was 256274, which means 854 admissions per day, which was more than total Hospital Beds. The data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
4. Total MRI in the entire Hospital only 8 per day, which was inadequate.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**142. Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Puducherry under Bharath University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (28/10/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Puducherry under Bharath University, Chennai for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (28/10/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Starting of MS (General Surgery) course at Sri Lakshmi Narayana Institute of Medical Sciences, Puducherry under Bharath University, Chennai u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No details were given regarding stipend paid by Govt. of Puducherry or by the Teaching Institute to Residents.

2. Total IPD in 2014 in the Department of Surgery was 49102, which means 163 admissions per day as against 180 beds, which was not feasible.
3. Total IPD of entire Hospital last year was 256274, which means 854 admissions per day, which was more than total Hospital Beds. The data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
4. Daily blood used only 5 Units.
5. Daily MRI 7 per day, which indicates inadequate clinical material.
6. All Senior Residents are MBBS. No experience certificate for 3 years as Junior Resident had been provided from the concerned HoD.
7. Dr. Sreenivasulu Reddy, Asst. Professor with DNB qualification was not eligible. He had no Teaching Experience with DNB qualification.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**143. Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (28/10/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (28/10/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Services like Parenteral nutrition for Neonates was not available.
2. Thalassaemia day care center was not available.
3. Child counseling & HIV services were not provided.
4. Investigative facility like PFT was not available.
5. Equipment like Upper GI Endoscope, Dialysis machines, Echo colour Doppler, CPAP, Resuscitation kit, Computerized PFT, Bronchoscope were not available.
6. Academic parameter like Group discussion (only 4) was inadequate.
7. Last year OPD, IPD of entire Hospital and Paediatrics Department was same, which means the data was thus non-genuine and fictitious.
8. Promotion of Dr. Jyoti Sanghvi, Professor was not as per the Regulations. She had been Assoc. Professor for 3 years 2 months as against the requirement of 4 years.
9. Promotion of Dr. Sanchi Yaran, Assoc. Professor was not as per the Regulations. She had been Asst. Professor for 4 years as against the requirement of 5 years.
10. College had obtained LoP on 30/07/2004. Experience given to following Faculty was prior to LOP, which was not permissible:
  - i. Dr. Usha Nuvaid, Professor: 03/03/2004
  - ii. Dr. Swati Mulyae, Professor & HoD: 23/02/2004
11. NICU beds were not specified.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided to issue Show-Cause Notice to the Institute for giving experience to the Faculty Members prior to establishment of the College.

**144. Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (30/10/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (30/10/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Radio-Diagnosis) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Shortage of Senior Resident: 4.
2. College had obtained LoP on 30/07/2004. Experience given to following Faculty was prior to LOP, which is not permissible:
  - i. Dr. Nitin Wadnere, Professor: 01/04/2004.
  - ii. Dr. Ajit Ahuja: 02/09/2003
3. Promotion of Dr. Sudheer Gokhale, Dr. Kailash Patel, Dr. Kaushalendra Soni & Dr. Chandrajeet Yadav was not as per the Regulations.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided to issue Show-Cause Notice to the Institute for giving experience to the Faculty Members prior to establishment of the College.

**145. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (28/10/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (28/10/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at Sri Aurobindo Institute of Medical Sciences, Indore under Devi Ahilya Vishwavidhyalaya, Indore u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. No information regarding stipend was provided in the report.
2. Daily average of blood consumption was 13 in the Department, which seems unrealistic.
3. Experience given to Dr. Sujata Bhargava, Professor was from 01/09/2003 (Prior to first LOP i.e. 30/07/2004), which was not permissible.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided to issue Show-Cause Notice to the Institute for giving experience to the Faculty Members prior to establishment of the College.

**146. Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (13/11/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (13/11/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to issue Letter of Permission for Increase of seats in MD (General Medicine) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the I.M.C. Act, 1956 prospectively i.e. from the academic session 2015-2016 from 10(Ten) to 12(Twelve) students per year till the first batch admitted as against the increased number appears in the final examination of the said course. The Teaching Institution be advised to apply for recognition of the qualification for the additional increased intake at the time of first available examination, as per the provision of Section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956.

As per Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000; sub-clause 13.3; Amendment dated 20/10/2008, Postgraduate Degree/ Diploma/ Super-Speciality Course students shall be paid stipend at par with the stipend being paid to the Postgraduate students of State Government Medical Institutions/ Central Government Medical Institutions in the State/ Union Territory, where the Teaching Institution be located.

The recommendation/ permission is subject to condition that the College will give an Undertaking to implement the above decision regarding payment of stipend to the Postgraduate Students.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**147. Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (11/11/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (11/11/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (DVL) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There were no publications from the Department in Indexed Journals at the preceding 3 years.
2. Procedures like Nail Surgeries & LASER procedures had not been performed in the preceding 3 years.
3. LASER procedures like Hair removal, Scar revision & Pigment removal were not available.



4. Academic parameters like Clinical seminars (only 19), Journal club (only 15), Case presentation (only 17) & Group discussions (only 5) are inadequate.
5. Dr. R. Subba Rao, Professor & HoD and Dr. P. Kavita, Assoc. Professor had been joining the College during Assessments and leaving repeatedly. Dr. P. Kavita left this College 4 times. It seems both the Faculty are thus non-genuine.
6. Already 3 seats, commensurate with clinical material (Yearly IPD-891, less than 3 admissions per day)
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**148. Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (10/11/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (10/11/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MD (Paediatrics) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. OPD on the day of Assessment was only 20, which was grossly inadequate.
2. Details of Beds occupied in PICU & NICU on the day of Assessment are not provided.
3. CPC & Death review meetings were not held.
4. Academic parameters like Theory classes (only 20), Group discussions (only 10) were inadequate.
5. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. M. Shobha Mohan, Professor & HoD and 2 other Professors, Dr. B. Vijaya Lakshmi & Dr. Pratap Kumar and 2 Assoc. Professors, Dr. R. Chandra Shekhar & Dr. R. Venkateswara Rao was not recognized. Consequently, there was a deficiency of Faculty Members.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**149. Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (11/11/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (11/11/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the

scheme for Increase of seats in MS (General Surgery) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. There were no publications from the Department in Indexed Journals during the preceding 3 years.
2. Details of beds occupied in ICU on the day of Assessment were not provided.
3. Academic parameter like Journal club (only 8) was inadequate.
4. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. Basava Purnima was not recognized.
5. Dr. Bala Durga Rao, Assoc. Professor had been given Teaching experience from 27/04/2003 (Prior to first LOP i.e. 30/09/2003), which was not permissible. Consequently, there was a deficiency of Faculty in 2 Units.
6. All Senior Residents were MBBS. No experience Certificate for 3 years experience as Junior Resident from the concerned HoD had been provided.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.

**150. Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.**

Read: the Assessment Report (10/11/2014) on the physical and other Teaching facilities available at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Assessment Report (10/11/2014) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to disapprove the scheme for Increase of seats in MS (OBG) course at NRI Medical College, Guntur under Dr. NTR University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16, because of the following facts:-

1. Bed occupancy was 65% on the day of Assessment.
2. Stipend paid by Govt. of A.P. to I/ II/ III year Residents is Rs. 23,000; Rs. 24,000 & Rs. 25,000 p.m. respectively while the Teaching Institute was not paying any stipend to Residents, which was not as per the Regulations.
3. Daily average of major operations in Gynaecology was only 2-3.
4. Prenatal diagnostic services were not provided.
5. Academic parameters like Clinical seminars (only 6), Journal club (only 6), Group discussions (only 16) & Guest lectures (NIL) were inadequate.
6. Experience given to Dr. Sheikh Mastan, Professor & HoD from 01/09/2003 (Prior to first LOP i.e. 30/09/2003), which was not permissible. Consequently, his promotion becomes irregular because he was Asst. Professor for 4 years 11 months as against the requirement of 5 years.
7. Dr. G. Srinivas Rao, Professor with DNB qualification was not eligible at the time of Asst. Professor.
8. Dr. M. Nageshwar Rao, Assoc. Professor had been given experience from 01/09/2003 (Prior to first LOP), which was not permissible. Consequently, his promotion becomes irregular because he was Asst. Professor for 4 years 11 months as against the requirement of 5 years.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

However, the Central Govt. (Ministry of Health & F.W.) may issue LoP or consider their Compliance Report, after taking final decision on the CBI complaint.
