The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Member.

**1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – confirmation of.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee confirmed the minutes of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 23<sup>rd</sup> June, 2015.

**2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee – action taken thereon.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee noted that the action is being taken on the minutes of the previous meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

The Committee noted that in the Item No. 126 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting held on 27/05/2015, the Committee had inadvertently mentioned the following deficiency:

*"All 06 Units have 02 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as teaching unit."*

As the department is having adequate Faculty the Committee decided that the decision of the Item No. 126 of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee meeting dated 27<sup>th</sup> May, 2015 be read corrected as under:

**126. Dr. NTR. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada - Renewal of recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) and compliance dated 27.04.2015 submitted by the college authorities on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally granted by Dr. NTR. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2013) along with compliance dated 27/04/2015 submitted by the College Authorities and decided to recommend that recognition of MS (General Surgery) qualification for 04 seats granted by Dr. N.T.R. University of Health Sciences, Vijayawada in respect of students being trained at Kamineni Institute of Medical Sciences, Narketpally be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**3. Sumandeeep Vidyapeeth, Vadodara - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 08 seats in respect of students being trained at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (March, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 08 seats at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara granted by Sumandeeep Vidyapeeth, Vadodara.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (March, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 08 seats granted by Sumandeeep Vidyapeeth, Vadodara in respect of students being trained at Smt. B.K. Shah Medical Institute & Research Centre, Vadodara be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**4. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualifications against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualifications against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualifications against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. OPD intake is only 47 which is inadequate.
2. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 13,845 in 2012 to 11,963 in 2014.
3. Stipend paid to Residents is only Rs. 10,000, Rs. 11,000 & Rs. 12,000 p.m. respectively to I /II / III year Residents which is much less than that paid to Residents by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
4. Shortage of Senior Residents: 1.
5. BERA investigation was NIL on day of assessment.
6. Weekly Major & Minor operations are 6 & 16 respectively which are inadequate.
7. Procedures like Stapedectomy, Laryngectomy, MLS have not been carried out in last 3 years.
8. Academic parameter like Group Discussion (10 in no.) is inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified on 21/07/2009 with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**5. University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 21 seats in respect of students being trained at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 21 seats at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 05 to 21 seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi because of the following facts:-



1. MRI is not available. There is no dialysis facility, No Echo/ Color Doppler facility.
2. Dr. A.K. Dutta, Former HoD of the same Institute was external examiner, which is not permitted.
3. Original certificates of PGs were not available during assessment.
4. Transport incubator is not available.
5. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (14 per year), Journal Club (8 per year) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

6. **Veer Narmad South Gujarat University - Renewal of recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Surat Municipal Institute of Medical Education & Research, Surat.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 04 seats at Surat Municipal Institute of Medical Education & Research, Surat granted by Veer Narmad South Gujarat University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to that recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification for 04 seats granted by Veer Narmad South Gujarat University in respect of students being trained at Surat Municipal Institute of Medical Education & Research, Surat be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

7. **Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualifications against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualifications against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize

MD(Paediatrics) qualifications against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. OPD on day of assessment was 95 which is inadequate.
2. Bed occupancy on day of assessment was 71 % which is inadequate.
3. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 18,490 to 17,903 over a period of 3 years.
4. Total IPD of last 3 years:

If this is IPD, it means 60 admissions per day against 65 beds, which is not feasible or non-deserving patients were admitted and discharged on the same day.

5. Stipend paid to Residents is only Rs. 10,000, Rs. 11,000 & Rs. 12,000 p.m. respectively to I /II / III year Residents which is much less than that paid to Residents by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
6. Shortage of Senior residents: 3. Dr. Aruna Thomas, DCH is not eligible. She has no 3 years experience prior to her appointment.
7. Data of average clinical material of previous 3 days are not provided.
8. Speciality clinics are not available in Paediatrics department. Cases are referred to respective specialty departments whenever required.
9. Thalassemia clinic is not available.
10. Transport Incubator is not available.
11. Blood used in entire hospital on the day of assessment was only 4 Units, which indicate inadequate clinical material.
12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**8. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualifications against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualifications against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD/MS(Ophthalmology) qualifications against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats

granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. There is no Asso. Prof. in the only Unit; Resultantly, faculty complement is incomplete.
2. Average OPD attendance is 49 / day which is inadequate.
3. OPD attendance on day of assessment was only 31 till 1:30 p.m.
4. Stipend paid to Residents is only Rs. 10,000, Rs. 11,000 & Rs. 12,000 p.m. respectively to I / II / III year Residents which is much less than that paid to Residents by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
5. There are no Senior Residents.
6. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 14,077 to 12,151 over 3 year period.
7. There is only 1 publication from the department in indexed journals during last 3 years.
8. Academic parameters like Journal Club (20/year) & Group Discussion (10/year) are inadequate.
9. One of the External Examiners, Dr. R. Srinivasan is from the same State – i.e. Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
10. IPD of year 3 was 10019, which means 33 admissions per day against 30 beds, which is not feasible or non-deserving patients were admitted and discharged on the same day.
11. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**9. Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar - Renewal of recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend that recognition of DPM qualification for 01 seat granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition.



Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**Note:** The Dean may be asked to clarify why MD permitted in 2010 is not yet recognized.

**10. Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghi Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar - Renewal of recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases/Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases/Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghi Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Tuberculosis & Respiratory Diseases/Pulmonary Medicine) qualification for 01 seat granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghi Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Several faculty members – (i) Dr. Nalin T. Shah, Asso. Prof.; (ii) Dr. Kiran Rami, Asst. Prof.; (iii) Dr. Ashish Chhatrawala, Asst. Prof. & (iv) Dr. Amit Patel, Asst. Prof. have been transferred into & out of the institute many times during this period.
2. Dr. Jitendra Sisodia, Asst. Prof. has also been presented at UG/PG assessments at Medical College, Vadodara during the period.
3. Dr. Nalin shah, Assoc. Professor has been transferred 14 times since 2007 and he has not stayed more than a few months at one place. How could he be participating in teaching and what has happened to the students registered under him as PG students?
4. There was one internal examiner from the Institute, which is not as per the Regulations. The second internal examiner was from Baroda.
5. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (14/year), Group Discussion (11/year) are inadequate.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

**11. Manipal University, Manipal - Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Forensic Medicine/Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal granted by Manipal University, Manipal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Forensic Medicine/ Forensic Medicine & Toxicology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**The Chairman of Postgraduate Medical Education Committee, Dr. S.B. Siwach recused himself from this Item since, he had been working with this institute sometime back. Dr. K.S. Sharma was the Chairperson for this item.**

**12. Maharishi Markandeshwar University, Mullana-Ambala, Haryana - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualifications increased against intake 03 to 06 seats in respect of students being trained at M.M. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Ambala.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualifications increased against intake 03 to 06 seats at M.M. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Ambala granted by Maharishi Markandeshwar University, Mullana-Ambala, Haryana.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualifications increased against intake 03 to 06 seats granted by Maharishi Markandeshwar University, Mullana-Ambala, Haryana in respect of students being trained at M.M. Institute of Medical Sciences & Research, Ambala be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**13. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College & Hospital, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College & Hospital, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College & Hospital, Pondicherry be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**14. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College & Hospital, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 03 seats at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College & Hospital, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(DVL) qualification for 03 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Sri Manakula Vinayagar Medical College & Hospital, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. Promotion of Dr. Karthikeyan, Professor & HoD is not as per Regulations, He has been Asst. Professor for 4 years against the requirement of 5 years and Assoc. Professor for 3 years against the requirement of 4 years without any publications.
2. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Shri B M Patil Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Bijapur granted by BLDE University, Bijapur.

3. Resultantly, there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1.
4. DSA is not available.
5. Academic parameter like Group Discussion (20/year) is inadequate.
6. All Senior Residents are with MBBS qualification and no 3 years teaching experience. Hence, they are not eligible. No proof of 3 years teaching experience enclosed.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 4 seats granted by Delhi University, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Army Hospital Research & Referral, New Delhi because of the following facts:-

1. From 2010 to 2014 only 2 students per year have been admitted and 2 seats are already recognized. Then why the Institute has requested for recognition of seats from 2 to 4.

2. R & R admits only in-service officers who are paid full salary as per their entitlement. How the Institution authorities have said that they are paying stipend at par with Delhi Govt. i.e. Rs. 72629 per month in IIIrd year.
3. It is surprising to note that total number of Major Surgeries are more than total IPD during the last 3 years, which is not feasible.

In addition, there were large number of Minor Surgeries and certainly some of them must have been done after admitting the patients. Clearly, the data is non-genuine and cannot be relied upon.

4. Part-III of SAF, which relates to Standard and Conduct of Examination has been left blank, which means examination was not shown to the Assessor without which, no recognition can be done.
5. Period and Place of posting of all Faculty members as Graded, Classified Specialist and Advisor signed by competent authority from the Office of DGAFMS has not been attached without which there equivalent academic designations cannot be calculated.
6. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 821 in 2012 to 774 in 2014.
7. Shortage of Senior Resident: 1.
8. Academic parameters like Theory Class (22/year), Journal Club (12 in no.) are inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. 1. Central Research Laboratory is under development.



2. Equipment like HPLC is not available.
3. PG training needs to be improved and number of Academic activities need to be enhanced as Academic parameters like Theory Classes (18/year), Clinical Seminars (19/year), Journal Club (7 in no.), Group Discussion (19/year) are inadequate.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. 1. Institute is paying stipend of Rs. 40,000; Rs. 41,000 & Rs. 42,000 p.m. to I / II / III year Residents which is less than that paid by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
2. OPD of 241 in DVL doesn't appear to be genuine.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. 1. There was NIL Minor Surgery on day of assessment.
2. Number of Minor Surgeries has decreased from 862 to 770 during 3 year period.
3. There has been a large changeover in teaching faculty since last assessment as detailed in the report.
4. Promotion of Dr. V.K. Gautam, Professor as Asso. Prof. is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 3 y 5 m as Asst. Prof. Moreover, Dr. V.K. Gautam has been transferred 13 times and he has stayed for less than 6 months at each station. How could he be participating in teaching and what has happened to the students registered under him as PG students?
5. There is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I; Resultantly, there are only 2 faculty in Unit I and it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
6. There are only 2 faculty in Unit II; Hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
7. There are only 2 faculty in Unit III; Hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
8. Dr. G.D. Tharadara & Dr. Nihar Patel, both of Unit II have also been presented at the assessment of B.J. Medical College, Ahmedabad during PG assessment on 12/11/2014.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Psychiatry) qualifications against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. OPD on day of assessment is only 45 which is inadequate. Average OPD attendance is only 39 which is inadequate.
2. Stipend paid to Residents is only Rs. 10,000, Rs. 11,000 & Rs. 12,000 p.m. respectively to I /II / III year Residents which is much less than that paid to Residents by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
3. There are no Senior residents. Deficiency of Senior Residents: 3.
4. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased drastically from 18,086 to 7,726 during 3 year period.
5. Although total number of OPD patients is shown at 7,726 in year 3, total number of patients in IPD is shown at 8,352 which is not feasible. There is data mismatch.
6. There are only 2 publications in indexed journals from the department in last 3 years, which are inadequate.
7. Facilities for chronic care are not available.
8. Academic parameters like Theory classes (21/year), Journal Club (10 in no.), case presentation (25/year), Group Discussions (12/year) & Guest Lectures (NIL) are inadequate.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. 1. Dr. S.R. Kulkarni, Asst. Prof. in Unit II & Dr. Avinash Kulkarni & Dr. Puneet Chamamakeri, Asst. Prof. in Unit III are not eligible since, they have no one year post DNB experience at the time of appointment. Consequently, Unit II & III left with only 2 faculty each & cannot be considered as PG Units.
2. Following Senior Residents are not eligible because they have no 3 years teaching experience:
  - i. Dr. Santhosha B.
  - ii. Dr. Srikant
 Consequently, there is no Senior Resident in Unit-I & III
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). 1. FNAC workload is only 400 samples/year –i.e. 1.1/day which is inadequate.
2. Although total number of Major Surgeries has decreased from 4,715 in 2012 to 3,760 in 2014, annual specimens processed for Surgical Pathology have increased from 4,541 to 6,477 during the same period. Further, number of annual specimens processed for Surgical pathology (6,477) far exceeds number of Major Surgeries (3,760). There is data mismatch.
3. Average daily Histopathological workload has decreased from 15 to 6 during 3 year period.
4. Stipend paid to Residents is only Rs. 5,000, Rs. 6,000 & Rs. 7,000 p.m. respectively to I /II / III year Residents which is much less than that paid to Residents by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
5. Dr. Susy S. Kurjan has been promoted as Professor without any experience as Asso. Prof. which is contrary to Regulations.
6. Although number of post-mortems are shown at 163, all of them are medico-legal & none is Pathological.
7. Number of US guided Cytology is only 10/year which is inadequate.
8. CSF & Sputum examinations are not carried out.
9. Academic parameter like Journal Club (12/year) is inadequate.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). 1. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 43,573 in 2012 to 38,183 in 2014. From above IPD numbers there will be 130 admissions per day against 140 beds, which is not feasible.
2. Stipend paid to Residents is only Rs. 10,000, Rs. 11,000 & Rs. 12,000 p.m. respectively to I /II / III year Residents which is much less than that paid to Residents by Central Govt. institute in Puducherry & is contrary to Regulations.
3. Shortage of Senior Residents: 3.

4. Speciality clinic like Haematology clinic is not run.
5. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (25/year), Clinical Seminar (21/year), Group Discussions (10 in no.) are inadequate.
6. One of the external examiners, Dr. R.P. Swaminathan is from the same State.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**26. Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 01 seat at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(ENT) qualification for 01 seat granted by Sri Balaji Vidyapeeth University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Mahatama Gandhi Medical College & Research Institute, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-



1. On inspection of O.T. register, data showed that they are operating 7-9 cases regularly under General Anaesthesia & 4-5 cases under Local Anaesthesia. These figures do not match as they are having only 1 O.T. table with G.A. from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. & with L.A. from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.. It does not look possible to operate 7-9 cases under G.A. in 6 hours.
2. During inspection of Histopathology sample receiving register, the number of samples received was found to be much less in comparison with Surgery register of O.T. majority of samples were of Tonsils & Nasal polyp.
3. Although 6 faculty are available, O.T. time available with General Anaesthesia is only 6 hours for 4 days/week which is inadequate for operations by total faculty & also training to Residents.
4. Number of books in Departmental library is 60-65 which is inadequate.
5. Promotion of Dr. S. Vijayasundaram, Asso. Prof. is not as per Regulations as he has been promoted with experience of only 4 y 1 m as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y as per Regulations. Out of 2 publications shown for promotion, 1 is a case report & therefore cannot be considered.
6. On the day of Assessment, total OPD has been stated as 223, which seems non-feasible in ENT department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Number of Caesarean sections are shown as 3-6/day while total LSCS for the year are shown as 324 which is not feasible. There is data mismatch.
2. There was NIL Major Obstetric operation on day of assessment as well as on 3 random days.
3. Academic parameters like Journal Club (20/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
4. IPD patients were 50 on 60 beds, then how occupancy was 100%?
5. Exact number of deliveries in 3 years has not been provided. Even if we take the minimum number of 7 per day (as stated in the Report), it doesn't tally with total births during the year.
6. Total number of Major Operations (1303) and Births (1793), total (3096), which is more than total IPD of the year 2014 (2956), which is not feasible. There must be some patients who were admitted for problems other than deliveries and surgeries and some Minor Operations must also have been done after admissions. Obviously, data is non-genuine.
7. Unit-I:
  - a. PG Degree of Dr. Rajamal B., Professor is not recognized and his promotion is not as per Regulations. He was Asst. Professor for 2 years against the requirement of 5 years.
  - b. Appointment of Dr. Chitra R., Assoc. Professor is not as per Regulations. She passed DNB in 2008 and has been appointed Asst. Professor in 2007, which is not permissible.
  - c. Dr. Sudha S., Professor passed DNB in 2000. She has no post DNB teaching experience at the time of appointment.
  - d. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. Sini S., Asst. Professor is not Recognized.
8. Unit-II:
  - a. Postgraduate Degree of Dr. K. Radhamani is not Recognized.
  - b. Dr. Rajashri, Senior Resident is not eligible. He has no 3 years teaching experience at the time of appointment. Consequently, there is a deficiency of Senior Resident: 1.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Regular monthwise salary statement of teachers was not provided. In all appointment orders, no details of payscale, allowances, service conditions – full time / practicing have been provided.
3. BERA investigations are inadequate (111/year).
4. Academic parameter like Journal Club (19/year) is inadequate.
5. Total IPD of the department for the years 2013 and 2014 was as below:

Total IPD of the entire Hospital was 43772 and of Surgery department was 2902, which means Major chunk of IPD of the entire hospital was from ENT department only and it was more than Surgery department, which is not possible. The data is non-genuine and fictitious.

2. At item # 25 on P. 5, it is shown that there are 3 Senior Residents. However in the faculty tables on P. 29 & 33, three Asst. Prof. are shown as Senior Residents which is not permissible. Resultantly, there is shortage of Senior Residents: 3.
3. Daily Major operations are shown as 3 but total weekly major operations are shown as 14 & yearly major operations are shown as 696, which is not feasible. There is data mismatch.
4. Speciality clinic like Hand Clinic, Arthroscopy Clinic are not run.
5. Investigative facilities like Nerve Conduction, EMG are not available.
6. Details of academic parameter like Theory Classes are not given. Academic parameter like Journal Club (11/year) is inadequate.
7. Dr. Minakshi Sundaram, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I passed DNB in 1999. Her appointment as Asst. Professor in 1999 is not regular since, she has no post DNB experience at the time of appointment. Consequently, there is no Assoc. Professor in Unit-I.
8. Dr. G. K. Kandasamy, Asst. Professor passed DNB in 2004 at the same time he was working as Tutor in some basic department, which is not permissible.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. 2. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (20/year), Clinical Seminars (15/year), Journal Club (12/year), Case Presentation (20/year), Group Discussion (12/year) are inadequate.
3. Total IPD of year 3 was 12007 and total IPD of entire hospital in 2014 was 39321. Out of these 12007 is of TB and rest of the hospital is left with 27314, which would mean inadequate clinical material in all other departments. The data is obviously non-genuine and cannot be relied upon.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Major operations in a year are shown as 1,691 in a year giving an average of 5.6/day while average daily consumption of blood units in the department is shown as 5-10 which does not appear to be feasible. There is data mismatch.
4. Academic parameter like Journal Club (12/year) is inadequate.

5. Except Dr. Venkateshan Ranganathan no other Senior Resident is eligible since, none has 3 years teaching experience before appointment as Senior Resident. Consequently, there is a deficiency of Senior Residents: 5.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). 3. It appears that there is no organized teaching programme in the department.
4. MRI facility is not available.
5. There are no special clinics.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Emergency Medicine) qualification for 2 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Kirupananda Variyar Medical College, Salem because of the following facts:-

1. There is no death reported in the department in the last year which indicates poor quality of teaching material.
2. Emergency O.T. is not available. It is done by the respective Surgical speciality which cannot be considered as for Emergency Medicine.
3. Minor Emergency O.T. workload is only 1-2/day which is inadequate.
4. Bed occupancy in two of preceding 3 years was only 60 – 61 % which was inadequate.
5. Dr. B.S. Dhanasekaran shifted from Anaesthesia department to Emergency Medicine at the level of Professor.
6. Dr. Dhandapani shifted from Medicine to Emergency Medicine at the level of Professor.
7. Dr. S. Ramrajan shifted from Orthopaedics to Emergency Medicine at the level of Professor.
8. Dr. Veerasigamani shifted from Surgery to Emergency Medicine at the level of Asst. Professor.  
None of them has super-speciality degree in Emergency Medicine nor 2 years special training at the time of their appointment. Hence, they cannot be considered as Faculty.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**86. Tripura University - Recognition of MD(General Medicine) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at Agartala Govt. Medical College, Agartala, Tripura.**

Medical College, Agartala, Tripura because of the following facts:-

1. There are 4 Units; each has 43 beds.
2. Unit IV has only 2 faculty; hence it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Speciality clinics like Endocrine clinic, Haematology clinic are not run.
4. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (11/year), Journal Club (06 in no.) are inadequate. Detail of parameter like Group Discussion is not provided.
5. IPD is more than OPD, which is not feasible. IPD of 99737 means 332 admissions per day against 171 beds, which is not feasible.
6. Date of joining of Dr. Anu Ghosh, Asst. Professor and 14 Senior/ Junior Residents are not filled up in the Faculty Table, which means they are not working in this department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

**88. Chettinad Academy of Research and Education ( Deemed University ) - Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education ( Deemed University ).

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (May, 2015) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(DVL) qualification for 2 seats granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education ( Deemed University ) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram because of the following facts:-

1. There are no Senior Residents.
2. In female ward, 12 patients were admitted only a day prior to examination at 5 p.m. In male ward, though sister i/c claimed 15 patients, on head count only 12 were observed. Most of the patients were of Scabies, Minor hand Eczema, Tinea, Alopecia Areata, stasis ulcer, etc. which are of minor relevance. Due to hurried admissions, incomplete history & case diagnosis were written on case sheets.
3. There was mismatch in data of patients. One patient, Ms. Vijaya was diagnosed as "Palmo Plantar Psoriasis" while her feet were totally free from lesion. One patient, Mr. Munirvel was admitted as EDV but he was not found in the ward. On enquiry it was revealed that he was in the examination hall; however, in the list of patients in the examination hall, his name did not appear.

4. In Central Library, library staff could not open any e Journal. Random checking failed for 4 foreign journals.
5. Out of 5 publications, 3 are case reports & 1 review article in their own journal, thus leaving only 1 publication in outside journal.
6. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (17/year), Journal Club (23/year); Case Presentation (04 in no.); Group Discussion (04 in no.) are inadequate.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. In case the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office (definitely, prior to next admission so that the same can be finally decided) but preferably within six weeks. Mandal University in respect of students being trained at Mata Gujri Memorial Medical College, Kishanganj because of the following facts:-

1. Almost all faculty have entered college campus address in their D.F. & have attached electricity bills as proof of residence. In spite of repeated requests, none of the faculty was able to produce any single original electricity bill.
2. There is discrepancy in Form 16 of PGs regarding stipend paid to them. Payment as claimed by the institute does not match with figure mentioned in Form 16 and actual amount paid to Residents as told by them.
3. Dr. Khalid Ansari showed as Tutor in D.F. but in SAF he is shown as Medical officer. No local address was mentioned in D.F.
4. PGs are shown as Tutors though their appointment orders show them as PG Residents.
5. Research Laboratory is ill equipped.
6. RHTC is not owned by the institute. There is no proper MOU for use of Dr. H.R.M. Medical Center, Mahadevdighi which was shown as RHTC. Dr. Sheeta Gupta is supposed to be working since as Medical officer since 05/05/2014 but this was not mentioned in SAF nor she presented for assessment. No activities pertaining to MCH & Family Welfare were observed to be carried out. Dr. Mohd. Khalid Ansari, claiming to work here was unable to name even a single staff of the center or of the department. No paramedical staff like MSW, PHN, HI, HE are posted here.

7. UHC is not owned by the institute. There is no proper MOU for use of Kishengunj Club which was shown as UHC. Nobody from the institute was willing to show UHC to assessor. It was just a makeshift arrangement, made for this assessment only, in a single room with Pharmacy on 1 table & Registration on 1 table. No paramedical staff like MSW, PHN, HI, HE are posted here.
8. There is no Central Research Laboratory.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats after the first batch appeared in Examination and prior to their recognition will not be in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government). This is also clarified in letter of permission issued for these seats i.e. as per provisions of section 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956, failure to seek timely recognition/ renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission against these postgraduate seats. **91. Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai - Recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Psychiatry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

3. EEG room needs to be air-conditioned for proper recording & to prevent artifacts.
4. Number of books in Central & Departmental Library need to be increased.
5. Paramedical staff needs to be formally trained in their respective work.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Candidate appearing at the examination has not presented any poster / read any paper at National/State conference during PG study period.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

7. Common hospital facilities are inadequate.
8. MRD facilities are not adequate.

Although in the table of data of clinical material on P. 20, workload of Skin Grafting Procedures & LASER Procedures is shown at 12 & 55 respectively, in the list of services provided by the department at item # 11 on P. 21, it is shown that these services are not provided. Also, at item # 22 on P. 22, it is shown that equipment for LASER procedures are not available. There is data mismatch.
7. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (15/year), Group Discussions (18/year) are inadequate.

**114. NITTE University, Mangalore - Recognition of MD(Anesthesiology) qualification increased against intake 04 to 10 seats in respect of students being trained at K S Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore.**

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (April, 2015) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anesthesiology) qualification increased against intake 04 to 10 seats granted by NITTE University, Mangalore in respect of students being trained at K S Hegde Medical Academy, Mangalore be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

(CVTS) course from this institute under Gujarat University is already recognized by MCI.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated 05/03/2015 received from Joint Secretary, Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, New Delhi forwarding therewith a copy of DO letter dated 10/02/2015 addressed to Union Health Minister from Sh. Parkash Singh Badal, Hon'ble Chief Minister of Punjab with regard to examining the suggestions and put up necessary amendments in PG Regulations for approval of the Ministry and noted that in view of the paucity of medical teachers in Psychiatry department and excessive demand due to National Mental Health Programme and problem of Drug abuse, the Committee decided to recommend amendment in PG Regulations to the extent that Teacher:Student ratio be 1:3 for Professors in Psychiatry as well on the pattern of Anaesthesia, Radio-Therapy and Forensic Medicine department.

Of Surgical Oncology, Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Kerala with regard to starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Oncology) course at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur under KUHS u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the letter dated nil received in the Council office on 21/05/2015 from Dr. Hari Kumar Unni, Deptt. Of Surgical Oncology, Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Kerala with regard to starting of M.Ch.(Surgical Oncology) course at Amala Institute of Medical Sciences, Thrissur under KUHS u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 for the academic year 2015-16 and decided to reiterate its earlier decision.

The rule quoted by the Institution has already been amended vide notification dated 20/10/2008, which reads as under:

*"(b) In a Department, training candidates for Super Speciality, there shall be a minimum of three faculty members with requisite Post Graduate qualification and experience, one shall be Professor, One Associate Professor / Reader and one Assistant Professor / Lecturer.*

*Provided that the second or subsequent unit may be headed by an Associate Professor along with two Assistant Professors /Lecturers."*

**119. Inclusion of prior required qualification for admission in super specialities and minimum qualification and experience for teaching faculty – req.**

Applications be returned to Central Govt. as being defective in documents.

(B) **Fee not Submitted:**

The Institution be informed about it and if they have not submitted, they may be asked to submit within a week.

(C) **Show Cause Notice Issued u/s 8(3)(1)(d):**

Applications be returned to Central Govt. stating they cannot be processed as per Regulation.

(D) **Show Cause Notice Issued u/s 8(3)(1)(c)**

Legal opinion from senior counsel be obtained whether these applications are to be considered or not. Status of the Show-Cause Notice be obtained from U.G. Section.

(E) **Request Withdrawn by Institute:**

Application be returned to Central Govt.
