The Chairman welcomed the members of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

Leave of absence was received from Dr. Raja Babu Panwar, Dr. Dhruba Jyoti Borah, Dr. Rani Bhaskaran, Member(s), Postgraduate Medical Education Committee.

1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - confirmation of.

No objection/observation made by any member of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. The minutes of the last meeting confirmed.

2. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - action taken thereon.

Action is being taken on the minutes of the meeting dated 22/09/2016. Minutes of the remaining meetings dated 16/09/2016, 29/09/2016, 05/10/2016, 13/10/2016, 19/10/2016 and 03/11/2016 are still not received from the Oversight Committee. Action will be taken on receipt of the Minutes from the Oversight Committee.

3. **Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th August, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th August, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Biochemistry) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at SRTR Medical College, Ambajogai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. **Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29th to 30th August, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats at SMS Medical College, Jaipur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29th to 30th August, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Community Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 4 to 6 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at SMS Medical College, Jaipur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Govardhan Meena is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Monika Rathore is promoted as Professor with experience of only 2 years 2 months as Asso. Prof. against requirement of 3 years; further although the promotion is after cut-off date, in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Mahesh Chand Verma; Dr. Dileep Raj; Dr. Rajeev Yadav are promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence their promotion is not as per Regulations & they cannot be considered.
4. Epidemiologist cum Lecturer & Statistician cum lecturer are not available.
5. LMO was absent during assessment.
6. RHTC & UHC are not under full control of Dean.
7. Residential facility at RHTC is in a hall at RHTC which is not as per norms.

8. NIL new books have been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
9. Faculty deficiency: (a) Asst. Professor: 1; (b) Statistician: 1; (c) Epidemiologist: 1.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 4 to 6 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

5. **West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of DM(Rheumatology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23rd & 24th August, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Rheumatology) qualification for 2 seats at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23rd & 24th August, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Rheumatology) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Institute of Postgraduate Medical Education & Research, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

1. No faculty is having DM qualification or 2 years special training. Hence, not eligible.
2. Dr. Alkendu Ghosh is not eligible. She has been shifted straight away as Professor in Rheumatology from Medicine and all her earlier experience is in Medicine.
3. Experience of Dr. Prasar Ghosh is in which subject is not given without which, his eligibility cannot be decided.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the

concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

6. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of DM(Clinical Haematology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (9th & 10th August, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Clinical Haematology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (9th & 10th August, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Clinical Haematology) qualification against increased intake from 2 to 3 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Nilratan Sircar Medical College, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. P. Chakrabarti, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of research publications are not provided in faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not. All his experience is at IHTM Medical College. We could not find any college by this name.
2. Dr. T.K. Dolai is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of research publications are not provided in faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Dr. Rajib De is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, it is stated "No" implying NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. There is no Senior Resident.
5. The only Unit has 35 beds which is not as per Regulations.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 2 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (19th & 20th August, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of M.Ch (Cardio Thoracic Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (19th & 20th August, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize M.Ch (Cardio Thoracic Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 03 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Armed Forces Medical College, Pune because of the following facts:-

1. The only Unit has 60 beds which is not as per Regulations.
2. There is no Senior Resident.
3. Dr. S.K. Jha is shown as "Asso. Prof." in the column of "Designation" in faculty table; however in the column of "Teaching Experience" he is shown as "Professor" w.e.f. 01/10/2015 till date, which is not feasible. Further, details of his research publications are not provided in the faculty table.
4. Dr. Jaswinder Singh is promoted as Professor after cut-off date on 08/04/2015; however details of research publications are not provided in faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
5. Details of External Examiners (Designation, Institution, Place) not given (only names given).
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. increased intake from 1 to 3 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10.08.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that M.Ch (Urology) qualification for 1 seat granted by SRM University, Chennai in respect of students being trained at SRM Medical College Hospital & Research Centre, Kancheepuram be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

9. King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow - Renewal of recognition of M.Ch (Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at King George's Medical University, Lucknow, U.P..

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29.07.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of M.Ch (Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 2 seats at King George's Medical University, Lucknow, U.P. granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29.07.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of M.Ch (Paediatrics Surgery) qualification for 2 seats granted by King George's Medical University, U.P. Lucknow in respect of students being trained at King George's Medical University, Lucknow, U.P. because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Shiv Narain Kureel is shown as Professor & HOD. However in the faculty table, he is not shown in either of two Units, which is not feasible.
2. There is NIL Asso. Prof. in Unit I; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. Jiledar Rawat is promoted as Professor with experience of only 2 years as Asso. Prof. against requirement of 4 years; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. There is no Senior Resident.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated

21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (22.07.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 1 seat granted by Kerala University of Health Sciences, Thrissur in respect of students being trained at Dr. Somervel Memorial CSI Hospital & Medical College, Karakonam, Thiruvananthapuram be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

11. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (18th July, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats at Command Hospital, Kolkata granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18th July, 2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 2 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Command Hospital, Kolkata because of the following facts:-

1. The Institute is running only PG course; hence as required for 50 MBBS intake + PG is required implying 1 Professor, 2 Asso. Prof., 3 Asst. Prof. & 4 Tutors are required. As against 1 Professor, 2 Asso. Prof., 1 Asst. Prof. & 1 Senior Resident are available, there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Assoc. Professor: 1; (b) Asst. Professor: 2; (c) Tutor: 3.
2. Dr. Majid A. Khan is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Workload of CT guided FNAC & USG guided FNAC is NIL in 2015.
4. Workload of TT investigation in 2015 is NIL.
5. Total number of Major Surgeries has decreased from 4,928 to 4,294 during preceding 3 years.
6. Equipment like HPLC is not available.
7. Departmental Library has only 65 books.
8. Year of passing PG qualification is not given in Faculty Table about any Faculty Member.
9. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25th July, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that Diploma in Diabetology qualification for 1 seat granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Seth G.S. Medical College & King Edward VII Memorial Hospital, Parel Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

13. Homi Bhabha National Institute (Deemed University), Mumbai - Recognition of MD (Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29th July, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD (Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 3 seats at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai granted by Homi Bhabha National Institute (Deemed University), Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29th July, 2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Immuno Haematology & Blood Transfusion) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 3 seats granted by Homi Bhabha National Institute (Deemed University), Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Tata Memorial Hospital, Mumbai be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

14. West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata - Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 7 seats in respect of students being trained at Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (25th July, 2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 7 seats at Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25th July, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MS(General Surgery) qualification against increased intake from 5 to 7 seats granted by West Bengal University of Health Sciences, Kolkata in respect of students being trained at Bankura Sammilani Medical College, Bankura because of the following facts:-

1. There are 6 Units requiring total 18 faculty @ 3/Unit for PG department; however total 15 faculty are available; hence there is deficiency of faculty:
(a) Asst. Prof.: 3.
2. Shortage of Senior Residents: 4 (Only 2 Senior Residents eligible).
3. Unit 1 which is the Unit of HOD does not have Asso. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete & it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
4. Units 2, 3 & 5 have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.

5. 3. There is no Senior Resident in Units IV & VI.
4. Dr. Rennis Davis, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however in 1 publication out of 4 cited in the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table, he is 3rd author which cannot be considered; there are only 3 research publications to his credit against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Only 7 new books have been purchased from Departmental Library in last 3 years.
3. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Dr. Subraya Bhat is shown having worked as Asso. Prof. at this institute from 14/09/2012 to 27/06/2015 in the faculty table. Hence his status as faculty in this institute on day of assessment – viz. 23/07/2016 is not clear.
3. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 25,778 in 2014 to 22,597 in 2015.
4. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 1,668 in 2014 to 1,071 in 2015.
5. Total number of Major Operations in 2015 was only 791 in 2015 implying daily average of 2.64 which is inadequate.
6. Total number of Minor Operations in 2015 was only 437 in 2015 implying daily average of 1.46 which is inadequate. It has decreased from 729 in 2014 to 437 in 2015.
7. Specialty clinic like Hand clinic is not run.
8. MRI is not available.
9. Departmental Library has only 62 books.
10. Dr. Manoj Kumar, Senior Resident, Unit-II was Tutor in which subject is not provided. He has no 3 years experience as Junior Resident in Orthopaedics in a Medical College. Hence, not eligible.
11. Academic Parameters in last 12 months:
 - a. Clinical Seminars: 4
 - b. Journal Club: 4
 - c. Case Presentation: 10
 - d. Group Discussions: Nil

They are grossly inadequate.

12. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

1. Dr. Govind Singh, Senior Resident in Unit I does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident.
2. Dr. Ajay Kumar Rajput, Senior Resident in Unit II has passed DNB from DDU Hospital, Delhi, which is a non-teaching Hospital. He has no 3 years experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College. Hence, not eligible. There is no other Senior Resident in Unit-II.
3. Dr. MukeshParmar, Senior Resident in Unit II does not have any experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not eligible to hold the post.
4. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 02 on day of assessment.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

4. Dr. Nisha, Senior Resident does not have any experience as Resident in medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. Details of Academic qualification & Experience as Resident are not shown in respect of Dr. Hitesh Sharma; Dr. Richa Vashney, Dr. Sourabh Sharma; Dr. Neha Agarwal; Dr. Ambika, all Senior Residents.
6. Six faculty have appeared at assessment at RNT Medical College, Udaipur on 07/10/2015.
7. Departmental Library has only 54 books.

5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr. Kishore Raichandani, Professor & HOD is promoted as Professor with experience of only 3 years as Asso. Prof.; however the column of "Benefit of publications" in the faculty table is left blank implying NIL publications against requirement of 4; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Unit A which is the Unit of HOD has NIL Asso. Prof.; hence faculty complement is incomplete. Further there are only 2 faculty in the Unit; resultantly it cannot be considered as PG Unit.

6. Units B, C & D have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
7. Resultantly, there is NIL Unit which qualifies as PG Unit.
8. Equipment like DHS set, Interlocking Nail set are not available.
9. Details of PG examination in Part III are not filled, which means there was no examination.
10. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. None of the faculty possesses D.M. qualification or 2 years Special Training in Neonatology.
4. None of 6 Senior Residents possesses 3 years experience as Resident in Neonatology before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
5. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 7,623 in 2013 to 6,723 in 2015.
6. Details of beds occupied in NICU on day of assessment are not provided.
7. Payment of stipend to Residents is not given in the SAF.

2. Dr. C. Arumugam is promoted as Professor on 09/07/2016 after cut-off date; however details of his research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
3. Dr. M. Chokalingam is promoted as Asso. Prof. on 02/06/2015 after cut-off date; however details of his research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
4. Dr. NagoorMeeran, Senior Resident does not have experience of 3 years as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior resident in the only Unit.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 2. Dr. Saumya Das is promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however only 1 research publication is cited in the list of publications in the faculty table against requirement of 2; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Chanchal Dutta, Senior Resident has no experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post. There is no other Senior Resident in the Unit.
4. DLCO is not available.
5. Only 09 new books have been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
6. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. The only Unit has 35 beds trifurcated into 3 segments of 12, 16 & 7 beds which is not as per Regulations as none of the segment has minimum 20 beds required for the Unit.
4. NIL books have been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

2. Dr. Rohit Paryani is shown as "Senior Resident Asst. Prof." in the column of "Designation" in the faculty table which is not a permissible designation. He can be either Senior Resident or Asst. Prof. which needs to be clarified.
3. There is deficiency of 1 Unit & 30 beds.
4. Total number of Minor Operations is 643 in 2015 implying daily average of 2.14 which is inadequate.
5. Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular & Thoracic Surgery clinic, Neuro Surgery clinic, Paediatric Surgery clinic are not run.
6. MRI on the Assessment Day was 8.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. OPD runs 2 days/week.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

3. Dr. Darawade Sameer, Assoc. Professor, Unit-I promoted on 13/01/2016 after the cut-off date. No Author names given in the publications quoted. It is not known that he was first or 2nd Author in these publications or not without which, his eligibility cannot be decided.

2. No Senior Resident in Unit-II, III & IV.
3. Dr. P.A. Jatgaonkar, Professor was promoted in 2016 after cut-off date. No publications quoted in Faculty Table. One of the 4 publications is a Case Report (checked from list in Summary).
4. There are 4 Units requiring total 12 faculty @ 3/Unit; however there are only total 11 faculty are available; resultantly there is deficiency of faculty: (a) Asst. Prof.: 1.
5. Units III & IV have only 2 faculty each; hence they cannot be considered as PG Units.
6. There is NIL Senior Resident in Unit II, III & IV.
7. Dr. Tushar Nagtode, Senior Resident in Unit I does not have any experience as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.

90. MGM Institute of Health Sciences (Deemed University), Navi Mumbai - Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (13.08.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Nephrology) qualification for 1 seat at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences (Deemed University), Navi Mumbai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (13.08.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that DM(Nephrology) qualification for 1 seat granted by MGM Institute of Health Sciences (Deemed University), Navi Mumbai in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Mission's Medical College, Aurangabad be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

91. Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur - Recognition of DM (Cardiology) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Dr. S.N Medical College, Jodhpur.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (02.09.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM (Cardiology) qualification for 2 seats at Dr. S.N Medical College, Jodhpur granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (02.09.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM (Cardiology) qualification for 2 seats granted by Rajasthan University of Health Sciences, Jaipur in respect of students being trained at Dr. S.N Medical College, Jodhpur because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Rohit Mathur & Dr. Pawan K. Sarada are promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however the details of research publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it is not possible to verify whether their promotion is as per Regulations or not. Unit left with 1 faculty.
2. None of 4 Senior Residents has any experience as Resident in Cardiology in a medical college affiliated hospital; hence not qualified to hold the post.
3. The only Unit has 32 beds which is not as per Regulations.
4. Details of beds occupied in ICUs on day of assessment are not provided.
5. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.09.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Physiology) qualification for 2 seats granted by Aryabhatta Knowledge University, Patna in respect of students being trained at Shri Krishna Medical College, Muzzaffarpur be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

93. Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai - Recognition of DM(Neuro Radiology) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28.09.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of DM(Neuro Radiology) qualification for 1 seat at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.09.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize DM(Neuro Radiology) qualification for 1 seat granted by Sri Ramachandra University, (Deemed University), Porur, Chennai in respect of students being trained at Sri Ramachandra Medical College & Research Institute, Porur, Chennai because of the following facts:-

1. It is shown in SAF that the Department has 1 Unit and 20 beds. What they do with these beds. In Neuro-Radiology patients come from all departments for procedures.
2. Dr. Santhos Joseph, Professor & HoD is MD (Radiology). All his experience as Asst. Professor, Assoc. Professor and Professor is in Radiology. Directly shifted as Professor & HoD in Neuro-Radiology on 07/05/2012. Hence, not eligible.

3. Senior Resident is MD (Radio-Diagnosis). No 3 years experience as Junior Resident in Neuro-Radiology. Hence, not eligible.
4. Average Daily OPD: 12-14 (twice a week).
5. DSA not available in the department. It is in Cariology department.
6. Designation (subject) of External Examiners have not been given. It is not known whether the institutions from where External Examiners came, have department of Neuro-Radiology.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (16.09.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that M.Ch (Neuro Surgery) qualification for 1 seat granted by Chettinad Academy of Research and Education (Deemed University) in respect of students being trained at Chettinad Hospital & Research Institute, Kanchipuram be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

95. Magadh University - Recognition of MD(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats in respect of students being trained at A N Magadh Medical College, Gaya.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26.09.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats at A N Magadh Medical College, Gaya granted by Magadh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26.09.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Anatomy) qualification for 2 seats granted by Magadh University in respect of students being trained at A N Magadh Medical College, Gaya be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

96. Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik - Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats in respect of students being trained at Padmashri Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundations Medical College, Ahmednagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (10.08.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats at Padmashri Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundations Medical College, Ahmednagar granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (10.08.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 1 to 2 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Padmashri Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundations Medical College, Ahmednagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

97. Ch. Charan Singh University - Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat in respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (20.09.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar granted by Ch. Charan Singh University.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (20.09.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radiodiagnosis) qualification for 1 seat granted by Ch. Charan Singh University in

respect of students being trained at Muzaffarnagar Medical College, Muzaffarnagar because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. P.K. Sharma, Senior Resident has only 6 months experience as Resident in the department before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not qualified to hold the post.
2. Workload of DSA is NIL on day of assessment as well as on randomly selected days.
3. Total number of CT Scans has decreased from 5,189 in 2013 to 4,436 in 2015.
4. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (09.08.2016 for Degree and 14.07.2016 for Diploma) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(ENT) & DLO qualifications for 1 seat each granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Dr Vaishampayan Memorial Medical College, Solapur because of the following facts:-

1. Blood Component Separation Facility is not available, which is essential requirement as per Regulations.
2. Workload of BERA & Speech Therapy was NIL on day of assessment.
3. Total number of Major Operations has decreased from 554 in 2013 to 368 in 2015. Workload of 368 in 2015 implies daily average of 1.23 which is inadequate.

4. Total number of Minor Operations has decreased from 227 in 2013 to 190 in 2015. Workload of 190 in 2015 implies daily average of 0.63 which is inadequate.
5. Total workload of Operations like Laryngectomy, Laryngo/Tracheoplasty, Rhinoplasty is NIL during preceding 3 years.
6. Equipment like OAE, BERA are not available in the department.
7. Services like Hearing Aid Trials, Speech & Voice Analysis are not available.
8. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 01 seat each for degree and diploma till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (09.08.2016 for Degree and 14.07.2016 for Diploma) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 2 seats & DGO qualification for 4 seats granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha because of the following facts:-

1. There was Obstetric Minor Operation on day of assessment. Average Operations on randomly selected days is 1 Minor/day, which is inadequate.
2. There were 2 Gynaec Major & 3 Gynaec Minor Operations on day of assessment, which is inadequate.
3. Total workload of Major Operations in 2015 is 705 implying daily average of 2.35 which is inadequate.
4. Services like Colposcopy/Cancer Screening Programme are not available.

5. LEEP is not available.
6. ART is not available.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 degree and 04 diploma seats till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (27.08.2016 for Degree and 22.07.2016 for Diploma) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD(Radiodiagnosis) & DMRD qualifications for 2 seats each granted by Maharashtra University of Health Sciences, Nashik in respect of students being trained at Mahatma Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences, Sevagram, Wardha because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. A.T. Tayade, Professor & HoD passed MD in 1991. He cannot be Lecturer from 1988. Resultantly, deficiency of Assoc. Professor: 1 and Asst. Professor: 1.
2. On the day of Assessment, MRI were 8 and DSA Nil.
3. Deficiency of faculty: (a) Asso. Prof.: 1; (b) Asst. Prof.: 1.
4. Workload of Mammography, DSA, CT guided FNAC, USG guided FNAC is NIL on day of assessment.
5. CT Scan is 8 slice against minimum 16 slice required.
6. DSA is not available in this department.
7. Other deficiencies as pointed out in the Assessment Report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 02 seats each for degree and diploma till renewal of their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide

notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admissions to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of recognition granted u/s 11(2) of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"...the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course."
