1. Minutes of the last meeting of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee - confirmation of.

3. **Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar - Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (11.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MS(ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MS (ENT) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Maharaja Krishnakumarsinghji Bhavnagar University, Bhavnagar in respect of students being trained at Government Medical College, Bhavnagar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

4. **Siksha O Anusandhan, Bhubaneswar - Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar.**

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar granted by Siksha O Anusandhan, Bhubaneswar.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Pathology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 04 seats granted by Siksha O Anusandhan, Bhubaneswar in respect of students being trained at Institute of Medical Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD/MS (Anatomy) qualification for 02 seats granted by Siksha O Anusandhan, Bhubaneswar in respect of students being trained at Institute of Medical

Sciences & SUM Hospital, Bhubaneswar be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

6. JSS University, Mysore - Renewal of recognition of DDVL qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of DDVL qualification for 01 seat at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore granted by JSS University, Mysore.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of DDVL qualification for 01 seat granted by JSS University, Mysore in respect of students being trained at J.S.S. Medical College, Mysore because of the following facts:-

1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- P.M. to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amounts to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
2. Both Degree & Diploma PG examinations were conducted by the same set of examiners on the same day.
3. Pigment Removal LASER & Hair Removal LASER are not available.
4. Data submission to National Authorities for STD clinics & STD cases is not seen.
5. Workload of the following procedures in 2015 was inadequate as under:
 - (a) Skin Grafting Procedures: 27;
 - (b) Nail Surgeries: 12.
6. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (18/year) is inadequate.
7. Prof. G.R. Kantharaj was promoted on 11.05.2015 after the cut-off date without 4 publications which is not as per Regulations.
8. Evaluation of theory answer books has not been done upto the conduct of practical examination which is not as per Regulations.
9. Bed occupancy on inspection day was 41.6%(25/60).
10. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against this seat i.e. 01 seat after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

Medical College, Mysore because of the following facts:-

1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- P.M. to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
2. Dr. H.T. Srinivas was promoted as Associate Professor on 21.01.2016 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 04 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
2. Promotion of Dr. S.K. Prabhakar be verified with regard to eligibility of publications.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Paediatrics) qualification against increased intake from 03 to 05 seats granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum because of the following facts:-

1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; P.M. Rs. 35,000/- P.M. and Rs.40,000/- P.M. to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amount to providing

misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.

2. Promotion of Prof. Mahesh Kamate, Unit-C is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 2 years 8 months and promoted on 01.08.2014 after the cut-off date without any publication.
3. Promotion of Dr. Manisha Bhandankar, Professor is not as per Regulations. She was promoted on 01.08.2014 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations. Resultantly, Unit-D left with 2 faculty.
4. Specialty clinic like Paediatric Gastroenterology clinic is not run.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. 05 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats and renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (DVL) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats and renewal of recognition of MD(DVL) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum because of the following facts:-

1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- per month to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.

2. History taking, management & treatment protocols need to be improved. E.g. irrespective of clinical condition & status, all are receiving iron, Calcium & Vitamin supplement. Acne Vulgaris patients are receiving Soframycin as Topical application case files seem to have been prepared by unqualified person.
3. Ward side laboratory & equipment in it are makeshift arrangements. Entry in the log book does not match with name of patient in the ward.
4. In both male & female wards, patients of this department and TB & Chest department are kept together without any separation.
5. Histopathology workload is only 3-4 Skin Biopsies/month.
6. Workload of Nail Surgery is minimal.
7. Microbiology department could not provide any data regarding fungal culture specimens.
8. Workload of Skin Grafting Procedures is only 42 in 2015.
9. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (09 in no.) is inadequate.
10. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. from 02 to 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Read: the Council Assessor's Report (23.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(TB & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats and recognition of MD(TB & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (23.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (TB & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats and recognition of MD(TB & Respiratory Diseases / Pulmonary Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 03 seats granted by KLE

University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum because of the following facts:-

1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
2. Dr. Sujay J. is postgraduate student. He cannot be counted as Senior Resident simultaneously. The institution has not provided when was the postgraduate session started and when Dr. Sujay J. was enrolled as postgraduate student.
3. Promotion of Dr. Bhagyashri B. Patil is not as per Regulations. She was Assistant Professor for 4 years 8 months and promoted Associate Professor on 01/04/2016 after the cut of date, which is not as per regulations.
4. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. from 02 to 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (18.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD (General Medicine) qualification against increased intake from 11 to 15 seats granted by KLE University (Deemed Univ.), Belgaum in respect of students being trained at Jawaharlal Nehru Medical College, Belgaum because of the following facts:-

1. The institution is paying stipend to the postgraduate students @ Rs. 25,000/- per month and they have also stated that same is the rate in Govt. Medical Colleges which is not correct. The stipend paid to postgraduate students in Govt. Medical Colleges is Rs.30,000/-; Rs. 35,000/- and Rs.40,000/- per month to 1st year, 2nd year and 3rd year students respectively. This amount to providing misleading information by the institution and matter be referred to Ethics Committee.
2. Two Junior Residents are not drawing their stipend. No explanation or reason is provided.
3. Dr. Prakash Babliche, Professor in Unit F has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
4. Dr. Anjali Metgudmath, Professor in Unit G has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
5. Dr. Raju H. Badiger, Asso. Prof. in Unit G has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date; however details of publications are not provided in the faculty table; hence it cannot be verified whether his promotion is as per Regulations or not.
6. Academic parameters like Theory Classes (20/year), Group Discussions (20/year) are inadequate.
7. Dr. Pournima S. Patil, Associate Prof. Unit-A was promoted on 01.08.2014 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations. There is no other Associate Prof. in Unit-A.
8. Dr. Arif D. Maldar, Associate Prof. Unit-D was promoted on 01.08.2014 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations. Resultantly, Unit-D is left with 2 faculty.
9. Dr. Jayaprakash Appajigol, Associate Prof. Unit-E was promoted on 01.08.2014 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations.
10. Dr. Madhav Prabhu, Associate Prof. Unit-F was promoted on 01.08.2014 after the cut-off date without any publication which is not as per Regulations.
11. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats i.e. from 11 to 15 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. 3. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 66,632 in 2013 to 63,662 in 2015.
4. Total number of Major operations has decreased from 1,854 in 2013 to 1,682 in 2015.
5. Total number of Histopathology specimens sent has decreased from 34 in 2013 to 11 in 2015.
6. Details of facility for Retinal Surgery are not provided.
7. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (11/year) is inadequate.
8. Data of 2 hospitals is not provided separately.
9. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Dr. P. Sarlabai, Senior Resident in Unit I does not possess experience of 3 y as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident, Hence she was not eligible to be appointed as Senior Resident.
2. Workload of Major Obstetric operations was NIL on day of assessment.
3. Total number of Major operations in 2015 is only 521 implying daily average of 1.7 which is inadequate.
4. Pre-natal Diagnosis services, IUI, Artificial Reproduction services are not available.
5. There are NIL publications from the department in indexed journals in last 3 years.
6. Present hospital building is very old & infrastructure is not maintained properly.
7. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminar (12/year), Journal Clubs (12/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
8. Major and minor operations conducted during the last 3 yrs. were as under:-

Which means less than 2 major as well minor operations per day were performed which is grossly inadequate.

9. There were 6 MRI's in entire hospital on the day of inspection which indicates inadequate clinical material.
10. There are no publications from the department during the last 3 yrs.
11. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) for 03 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

30. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University, Chennai - Recognition of MD (Anaesthesia) qualification for 3 seats in respect of students being trained at Coimbatore Medical College, Coimbatore.

1. Appointment orders of some faculty members show designation as "Asst. Prof. / Senior Resident" which is not permissible. It has to be either Asst. Prof. or Senior Resident.
2. Dr. D. Senthil Kumar has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however NIL research publications are shown in the faculty table against requirement of 2 publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
3. Dr. Rajesh Rathnam has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however NIL research publications are shown in the faculty table against requirement of 2 publications; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Dr. G. Manimzhi Selvan, Dr. A. Nakkeran, Dr. R. Venkatachalam, Dr. S. Muthiah, Dr. S. Saravana Kumar; all Senior Residents, do not possess experience of 3 y as Resident before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
5. Resultantly, shortage of Senior Residents: 3.
6. There is no ICU with Anaesthesiology department.
7. Academic parameter like Clinical Seminars (12/year) is inadequate.
8. The college got LOP in 2013. However, many faculty members have been shown that they passed M.D. from this college in 2000 and earlier which is not feasible.
9. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Dr. Santosh Dafale, Senior Resident in Unit I does not possess experience of 3 y as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
2. Dr. S.R. Rawal, Senior Resident in Unit III does not possess experience of 3 y as Resident in medical college hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
3. Gynaecology OPD on day of assessment is only 46 which is inadequate even to start PG course.
4. There was only 1 Normal Delivery & 1 Caesarean Section on day of assessment which is inadequate.
5. Prenatal Diagnosis services, IUI services & Artificial Reproduction services are not available.
6. On the day of assessment MRI workload of entire hospital was only 06 and CT scan 10 which indicates inadequate clinical material.
7. Academic parameter like Theory Classes (20/year), Group Discussions (12/year) are inadequate.
8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

33. The Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical College University, Chennai - Renewal of recognition of MS(General Surgery) qualification for 4 seats in respect of students being trained at K A P Viswanathan Government Medical College, Trichy.

1. Dr. R.R.A. Selvi has been promoted as Asso. Prof. after cut-off date; however in the faculty table no research publications are shown to her credit; hence it cannot be verified whether her promotion is as per Regulations or not.
2. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 52,912 in 2013 to 41,456 in 2015.
3. Specialty clinic like Cardiovascular & thoracic Surgery clinic, Surgical Oncology clinic are not run.
4. Upper GI Endoscopy, Colonoscopy are not available.
5. NIL books have been purchased for Departmental Library during last 3 years.
6. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (06 in no.), Journal Clubs (20/year), Case Presentations (20/year) are inadequate.
7. Promotion of Prof. A. Thulasi is not as per Regulations. He was Assoc.Prof. for 3 yrs. 11 months and there are no publications to his credit.
8. Promotion of Dr. R. Rosy Adhaline Selvi, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was promoted on 12.12.2015 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations.
9. Promotion of Dr. R. Yeganathan, Assoc. Prof. is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs. 1 month and he has no publications to his credit. Hence, his promotion is not as per Regulations.
10. There are no publications during the last 3 yrs. No reference of any of the publications quoted has been given, without which they cannot be considered.
11. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. Prof. on 31/03/2014 which is not feasible. If she is promoted on 31/03/2014, then her experience as Asst. Prof. is only 4 yrs 10 months against requirement of 5 yrs; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Academic parameters like Clinical Seminars (05 in no.), Journal Clubs (14/year), Group Discussions (11/year) are inadequate.
3. Total IPD (number of patients admitted) in 2015 were 13275 which means 44 admissions per day on 30 beds which is not feasible. The data is non-genuine.
4. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. 12. There is no separate Eclampsia room. There is only 1 Eclampsia cum HDU room which is not as per norms.
13. Specialty clinic like Gynaec Endocrine clinic is not run. Details
14. Other Specialty clinics were not provided during assessment.
15. Services like IUI, ART are not available.
16. Promotion of Dr. (Mrs.) Deshpande S.A., Assoc. Prof. Unit-II is not as per Regulations. She was promoted after 4 yrs. 3 months as Asstt. Prof. without any publications.
17. Promotion of Dr. Kharde P.S., Associate Prof. Unit-IV is not as Regulations. She was Asstt. Prof. for 4 yrs. 2 months and promoted without any publications.
18. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Dr. P. Jacob Verghese has been appointed as Professor after cut-off date on 14/12/2013 without any publication. Resultantly there is a deficiency of Associate Professor -1.
2. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (16/year) is inadequate.
3. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats for 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in

accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. Johnson & Dr. Rajasekar, all Senior Residents, do not possess 3 yrs. experience as Resident in the department in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post; resultantly there is no eligible Senior Resident.
2. Workload of MRI was only 01 on day of assessment.
3. Academic parameter like Case Presentations (12/year) is inadequate.
4. Professor & HOD Dr. A. Vasukinathan was promoted on 16.08.2013 after the cut-off date without any publications which is not as per Regulations. There is no other Professor in the Department.
5. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28th April, 2016) and decided to recommend not to recognise MS (General Surgery) qualification for 02 seats granted by North-Eastern Hill University in respect of students being trained at North Eastern Indira Gandhi Regional Institute of Health & Medical Sciences, Shillong because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. AnupJyotiBaruah, Unit I has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 1 y 1 m as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 4 y & 2 research publications; hence he cannot be considered.
2. Resultantly, there is no Asso. Prof. in Unit I & faculty complement is incomplete; resultantly it cannot be considered as PG Unit.
3. Dr. RamendraHajong, Asso. Prof. in Unit II has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 4 y 6 m against requirement of 5 y; further in the column of "Benefit of publication", nothing is stated implying there are none; hence his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
4. Resultantly, Unit II is headed by Asst. Prof. & it cannot be considered as a teaching Unit at all.
5. Resultantly, there is NIL Unit which can qualify as a PG Unit.
6. There are only 2 Units against requirement of 3 Units.
7. OPD on day of assessment is only 60 which is inadequate & less than minimum 100 required even to start PG course.
8. Total number of Major Operations in 2015 were 668 implying daily average of 2.2 which is inadequate.
9. Due to shortage of Anaesthesiology faculty, General Surgery department has only 2 tables on Thursday & 1 table on Friday - i.e. O.T. runs twice a week only which is inadequate.
10. No details are provided regarding posters presented, papers read or sent for publication by candidates appearing at the examination.
11. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (11/year), Case Presentations (19/year), Group Discussions (15/year) are inadequate.
12. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (28.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS (ENT) qualification for 04 seats granted by Manipal University in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Mangalore because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Kiran M. Bhojwani, Professor & HOD has been promoted as Professor after cut-off date on 10/07/2014; however, in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No" implying there are no research publications against 4 required; hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Suja Sreedharan, Professor has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of only 2 y 6 m as Asst. Prof. against requirement of 5 y as per Regulations; hence she cannot be considered.
3. Dr. VijendraShenoy has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of 4 y as Asst. Prof. on the basis of publications; however, in the list of publications, out of 3 publications, he is 1st or 2nd author only in 1 publication; hence remaining 2 publications cannot be accepted; resultantly, there is only 1 research publication to his credit against requirement of 2 as per Regulations and hence his promotion is not as per Regulations and he cannot be considered.
4. Total number of OPD patients has decreased from 65,194 in 2013 to 59,558 in 2015.
5. Total number of patients in IPD has decreased from 3,185 in 2013 to 2,757 in 2015.
6. Total number of Major operations has decreased from 954 in 2013 to 703 in 2015.
7. Total number of specimens sent for Histopathology has decreased from 684 in 2013 to 621 in 2015.

1. There is no Senior Resident in Units B & C.
2. Dr. B. Prasantha, Senior Resident in Unit F & Dr. Syma Jose, Senior Resident in Unit I do not possess 3 y experience as Resident in a medical college affiliated hospital before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
3. Separate data of clinical material for 2 hospitals are not provided.
4. Incharge of Specialty clinics like Cardiovascular clinic, Nephrology, Gastroenterology & Neurology are not faculty of department of General medicine. Incharge of Haematology clinic, Dr. B. Prashanth is only a Senior Resident and not a faculty.
5. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (12/year) is inadequate.
 - (a) Dr. Harish Rao shown Associate Prof. in column of designation and Prof. in column of experience. He is last shown to be working at Srinivas Instt. of Medical Sciences.
 - (b) Promotion of Dr. Pawan MR Assoc.Prof. Unit-I is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. 4 years 1 month, no author names of two publications quoted has been given.
 - (c) Promotion of Dr. Venugopal D Prof. Unit-II, is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. 4 yrs. 10 months, promoted Prof. on 01.09.2015. He has no publication to his credit.

- (d) Promotion of Dr. Basava Prabhu, Assoc. Prof. Unit-II, is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. 4 yrs., out of two publications quoted none related to General Medicine and no Author names given in any publications.
 - (e) No Senior Resident in Unit-B.
 - (f) Promotion of Dr. Arichith Bolor, Assoc. Prof., Unit-C, is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. 4 yrs, no Author names given to two publications quoted.
 - (g) No Senior Resident in Unit-C.
 - (h) Promotion of Dr. Girish M., Assoc. Prof. Unit-F is not as per Regulations. He is shown Assoc. Prof. in column of designation and Asstt. Prof. in column of experience.
 - (i) Promotion of Dr. Deepak Modi, Assoc. Prof., Unit-F is not as per Regulations. He was Asstt. Prof. 4 yrs., no author names given to 2 publications quoted.
 - (j) Promotion of Dr. Hyma Jose, Senior Resident, Unit-J is not as per Regulations. He was not eligible. No 3 yrs. experience as Junior Resident in a Medical College.
6. None of the faculty members has signed the faculty table.
 7. Journal club 12 in a year which are grossly inadequate.
 8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

1. Dr. Anuragh has been promoted as Asso. Prof. with experience of 4 y as Asst. Prof. and 2 publications; however out of 2 publications, 1 is in medical discipline & another is in Engineering discipline which cannot be considered; hence there is only 1 research publication to his credit against requirement of 2 as per Regulations; resultantly his promotion is not as per Regulations & he cannot be considered.
2. Promotion of Dr. Prakashini K is not as per Regulations as she was promoted Professor on 14.04.2014. Out of the 4 publications quoted 2 are case reports which cannot be considered. Hence, her promotion is not as per Regulations.
3. Dr. Satish Babu Maddukuri cannot be considered because he is working outside the state.
4. Promotion of Prof. Smiti S is not as per Regulations. She was Associate Prof. for 3 yrs. 9 months and promoted Professor on 14.04.2014. Out of 4 publications quoted one is case report which cannot be considered.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification against increased intake from 08 to 12 seats at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal granted by Manipal University, Manipal.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (25.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Anaesthesia) qualification against increased intake from 08 to 12 seats granted by Manipal University, Manipal in respect of students being trained at Kasturba Medical College, Manipal be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition.

Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

65. University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats in respect of students being trained at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Biochemistry) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 04 seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

66. University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 07 seats in respect of students being trained at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (26.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 07 seats at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (26.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government that MD (Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 07 seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

67. University of Delhi, Delhi - Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats in respect of students being trained at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (21.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Physiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats at Lady Harding Medical College, Delhi granted by University of Delhi, Delhi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (21.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Government

that MD (Microbiology) qualification against increased intake from 02 to 05 seats granted by University of Delhi, Delhi in respect of students being trained at Lady Hardinge Medical College, Delhi be recognized and included in the 1st Schedule to the I.M.C. Act, 1956.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

68. Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot - Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (24.05.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Recognition of MD(Radio Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot granted by Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (24.05.2016) and decided to recommend not to recognize MD(Radio-Diagnosis/Radiology) qualification against increased intake from 01 to 02 seats granted by Saurashtra University, University Road, Rajkot in respect of students being trained at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Medical College, Rajkot because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. ChetnaDodiya, Senior Resident does not possess 3 y experience as Resident in the department before appointment as Senior Resident; hence not eligible to hold the post.
2. DSA is not available.
3. Workload of CT guided FNAC is 1/week.
4. Workload of MRI has decreased from 2,893 in 2013 to 2,759 in 2015.
5. Workload of US guided FNAC/Biopsy has decreased from 899 in 2013 to 845 in 2015.
6. There is no full reference of any of the 9 publications quoted has been given. There are no author names.
7. Part-III of SAF pertaining to exam details not provided.
8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

Admissions done (if any) against these seats from 01 to 02 seats after the first batch appeared in Examination till their recognition will be irregular/ illegal and not in accordance with MCI regulations (notified with prior permission of Central Government vide notification dated 21/07/2009) and will not be recognized. As per provisions of the Postgraduate Medical Education Regulations, 2000, failure to seek timely recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the concerned Post Graduate Course. This is also clarified in the letter of permission granted u/s 10A of the IMC Act, 1956 issued for these seats, which reads as under:

"This permission for starting/ increase of seats in the above course and admission of students will be till such time the first batch of students admitted against the above course appears for the first final examination in the subject."

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no

compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

69. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (07.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (07.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD (Psychiatry) qualification for 01 seat granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of patients in OPD has decreased from 19,619 to 12,459 during last 3 years.
2. In the column of stipend paid by the State Govt. to Residents, institute has stated "Not Applicable". This is not correct. It is located in Puducherry where Central Govt. institute - viz., JIPMER & State Govt. institute are located. Stipend paid by these institutes should be mentioned in this column to verify whether it is paying stipend at those rates or not.
3. There are serious space problems in OPD and ward. Waiting area is inadequate. Residents have very little space for work up of cases.
4. Special clinics are poor in services and documentation.
5. Average OPD attendance is 45-50 which is bare minimum to start the course.
6. Average Bed Occupancy is 70-75 %.
7. Only 2 books have been purchased in Departmental Library in last 3 years.
8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

70. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (06.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(OBG) qualification for 02 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (06.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS (OBG) qualification for 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. Dr. Mary David, Professor & HOD, has been promoted as Professor with experience of only 3 y 3 m against requirement of 4 y as per Regulations. Further, in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No". Hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
2. Dr. Satish K. Kuruvila, Professor, has been promoted as Professor with experience of only 3 y against requirement of 4 y as per Regulations. Further, in the column of "Benefit of publications", it is stated "No". Hence her promotion is not as per Regulations & she cannot be considered.
3. OPD on day of assessment is only 103 which is bare minimum just to start PG course.
4. Total Number of Major operations in 2015 was 687 implying daily average of 2.3 which is inadequate.
5. In the column of stipend paid by the State Govt. to Residents, institute has stated "Not Applicable". This is not correct. It is located in Puducherry where Central Govt. institute - viz., JIPMER & State Govt. institute are located. Stipend paid by these institutes should be mentioned in this column to verify whether it is paying stipend at those rates or not.
6. OPD space is not sufficient for different Specialty clinics conducted.
7. Faculty space is inadequate.
8. Obstetric OPD on day of assessment was only 41. Daily average is 47.
9. There was NIL Major Obstetric operation on day of assessment.
10. Pre-natal diagnosis services, Oncology services are not available.
11. From 3 yrs. data average daily major operations are 2-3 which is inadequate.
12. Indoor beds are spread over on different floors.
13. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

71. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 03 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (05.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Anaesthesiology) qualification for 03 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (05.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD (Anaesthesia) qualification for 03 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. Total number of Major operations has decreased from 4,264 in 2013 to 4,130 in 2015.
2. Total number of Major operations was 4,130 in 2015 implying daily average of 13.75 for the whole hospital which is inadequate.
3. In the column of stipend paid by the State Govt. to Residents, institute has stated "Not Applicable". This is not correct. It is located in Puducherry where Central Govt. institute - viz., JIPMER & State Govt. institute are located. Stipend paid by these institutes should be mentioned in this column to verify whether it is paying stipend at those rates or not.

4. Number of Major operations on day of assessment was only 07. Average of 3 randomly selected days was only 09.
5. It is not clearly stated which ICU is with Anaesthesiology department.
6. Academic parameter like Group Discussions (12/year) is inadequate.
7. There is only one publication during the last 5 yrs. Publication quoted at serial No. A - Journal name has not been given and those quoted at serial No. B-D are in non-indexed journals.
8. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

72. Pondicherry University, Puducherry - Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (06.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MS(Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (06.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MS (Orthopaedics) qualification for 02 seats granted by Pondicherry University, Puducherry in respect of students being trained at Pondicherry Institute of Medical Sciences, Pondicherry because of the following facts:-

1. OPD on day of assessment is 91 which is less than minimum 100 required even to start PG course.
2. Number of Minor operations in 2015 was only 156 implying daily average of < 0.6 which is grossly inadequate.
3. MRI workload on day of assessment was only 05.
4. In the column of stipend paid by the State Govt. to Residents, institute has stated "Not Applicable". This is not correct. It is located in Puducherry where Central Govt. institute - viz., JIPMER & State Govt. institute are located. Stipend paid by these institutes should be mentioned in this column to verify whether it is paying stipend at those rates or not.
5. In the table of Clinical material at § 7 on P. 2, number of Major & Minor operations in 2015 is shown as 849 & 156 respectively; while in the table on P. 27 at § 10, they are shown as 667 & 49 respectively. There is data mismatch. This discrepancy needs to be clarified.
6. Specialty clinic like Hand clinic is not run.
7. Death during the last year were only 3 out of 2337 admissions. In a department like Orthopaedics which deals with polytrauma indicates inadequate clinical material and no serious patients admitted.
8. It is not clarified whether Govt. Hospital dindigal is a teaching hospital or not.
9. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

73. Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati - Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Pathology) qualification for 02 seats at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati granted by Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (29.04.2016) and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. that the recognition of MD (Pathology) qualification for 02 seats granted by Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences (Deemed University), Tirupati in respect of students being trained at Sri Venkateswara Institute of Medical Sciences, Tirupati be renewed.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee further decided that the recognition so granted shall be for a maximum period of 5 years from the date of Notification upon which the Institute shall have to apply for renewal of recognition. Failure to seek timely renewal of recognition as required shall invariably result in stoppage of admission to the Postgraduate Course.

74. Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem - Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(OBG) & DGO qualifications for 02 seats each in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal, Puducherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (12.04.2016 (for Degree) & 13.04.2016 (for Diploma)) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD/MS(OBG) & DGO qualifications for 02 seats each at Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal, Puducherry granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (12.04.2016 (for Degree) & 13.04.2016 (for Diploma) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD/MS (OBG) & DGO qualifications for 02 seats each granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal, Puducherry because of the following facts:-

1. Bed occupancy is only 56 % on day of assessment.
2. There were only 2 Major operations on day of assessment.
3. Total Major & Minor operations in 2015 were 331 & 510 respectively implying daily average of 1.1 & 1.7 respectively which is grossly inadequate.
4. MRI workload for the whole hospital is only 03 on day of assessment.
5. There were only 2 research publications from the department in indexed journals in last 5 years.
6. In the column of stipend paid by the State Govt. to Residents, institute has stated "No". This is not correct. It is located in Puducherry State where Central Govt. institute - viz., JIPMER & State Govt. institute are located. Stipend paid by these institutes should be mentioned in this column to verify whether it is paying stipend at those rates or not.
7. OT design for proper sterilization needs to be changed.
8. Operative work for Gynaec Oncology is less.
9. Gynaec OPD on day of assessment is only 43 which is inadequate.
10. There was NIL Normal Delivery & NIL Caesarean Section on day of assessment.

11. In the table of Clinical material at § 7 on P. 2, number of Minor operations in 2015 is shown as 510; while in the table on P. 19 at § 10, it is shown as 210. There is data mismatch.
12. Details of beds occupied in HDU are not provided.
13. Prenatal Diagnosis services are not available.
14. Academic parameter like Journal Clubs (10 in no.) is inadequate.
15. Publications during the last 5 yrs. are Nil. No reference of 2 publications quoted has been given.
16. Deaths during last 5 yrs. are Nil.
17. Total births during last year were 74 which means one delivery in 4 days.
18. Number of major and minor operations performed and data of deliveries during last 3 years is reproduced below:-

In view of above, the Postgraduate Committee considered that virtually there is no clinical material for training of postgraduate students and decided to recommend to the Central Govt. to stop admissions.

19. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

75. Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem - Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal, Puducherry.

Read: the Council Assessor's Report (11.04.2016) on the standard of examination and other teaching facilities for Renewal of recognition of MD(Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats at Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal, Puducherry granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the Council Assessor's Report (11.04.2016) and decided to recommend not to renew the recognition of MD (Biochemistry) qualification for 02 seats granted by Vinayaka Mission's University, Salem in respect of students being trained at Vinayaka Mission's Medical College & Hospital, Karaikal, Puducherry because of the following facts:-

1. In the column of stipend paid by the State Govt. to Residents, institute has stated "No". This is not correct. It is located in Puducherry State where Central Govt. institute - viz., JIPMER & State Govt. institute are located. Stipend paid by these institutes should be mentioned in this column to verify whether it is paying stipend at those rates or not.
2. Candidates appearing at the M.D. examination have not presented a poster or read/sent a paper.

3. There is no periodic appraisal of candidates.
4. Only 5 books have been purchased for Departmental Library in last 3 years.
5. Details of Academic Parameters like Theory Classes are not provided.
6. Academic parameters like Journal Clubs (09 in no.), Group Discussions (08 in no.) are inadequate.
7. There are no Tutors.
8. Appointment orders of examiners were not provided to the Assessor.
9. Other deficiencies pointed out in the assessment report.

In case, the college authorities desire to submit compliance, same should be received in this office preferably within four weeks of issue of this letter but definitely, prior to next admission so that the matter of recognition can be finally decided. If no compliance is received within this period or compliance/ compliance verification is found unsatisfactory, it will result in stoppage of admission to the postgraduate course against the above mentioned seats.

76. Consideration of clarification submitted by Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences, Kochi.

The Postgraduate Medical Education Committee considered the clarifications given by college authorities of Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences, Kochi and decided as under:

Virology:

Dr. Jampala Srinivas: In the compliance report he was shown Asst. Professor in Virology from 01/11/2012 to 31/12/2014 and Assoc. Professor in Virology from 01/01/2015 to 31/12/2015 (sabbatical leave) and working from 01/01/2016 till date as Assoc. Professor in Virology. Now in the clarification, the college authorities have stated that he was Asst. Professor in Microbiology from 2007 to 2013 and Associate Professor in Microbiology from 2013 to till date and "he holds a Dual Designation as Asst. Professor in Virology from 01/11/2012 to 31/12/2014 and Assoc. Professor in Virology from 01/02/2015 onwards." It is not understandable that how a faculty member can be given Dual Designation. It is clearly an attempt to mislead the MCI.

Reproductive Medicine:

Dr. B. Rajammal: In the initial inspection report, she was shown as Professor of OBG at Amrita Institute of Medical Sciences from 01/06/2002 to 31/07/2015. In the compliance, she was shown Asst. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 01/06/2002 to 01/06/2007, Assoc. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 02/06/2007 to 02/06/2011 and Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 03/06/2011 till date.

Now, in the clarification, the Dean has stated that she was Professor of OBG from 01/06/2002 but simultaneously, she was appointed Asst. Professor, Assoc. Professor and Professor in Reproductive Medicine during the same period. It is unimaginable that how a person can be appointed on two posts simultaneously. At the same time it is pertinent to mention here that department of Reproductive Medicine did not exist in the Institution in 2002 when she was appointed Asst. Professor in Reproductive Medicine. The information supplied is clearly false and with intention to mislead MCI.

Dr. Jaya Binny: She was shown Assoc. Professor in OBG in initial report from 16/06/2014 to 31/07/2015 and Assoc. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 01/08/2015 till date. Since, she was not found eligible because she had no experience as Asst. Professor in Reproductive Medicine, her experience details were changed in the compliance and she was shown Asst. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 16/06/2014 to 16/06/2015 and Assoc. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from

17/06/2015. Now, the college authorities have 3rd time changed their stand in clarification and they have said that she was Asst. Professor in OBG from 2001 to 2004 and 2005 to 2007 and appointed Assoc. Professor in OBG on 16/06/2014 and also worked in Division of Reproductive Medicine. The information supplied in the compliance that she was Asst. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 16/06/2014 to 16/06/2015 and Assoc. Professor in Reproductive Medicine from 17/06/2015 till date is false and clearly intended to mislead the MCI.

Infectious Disease:

Dr. Dipu T.S.: Dr. Dipu T.S was shown Asst. Professor in General Medicine in original report from 07/10/2013 to 03/05/2015. Since, there was a deficiency of Senior Resident in the department of Infectious Diseases, the college authorities changed his designation to Senior Resident in Infectious disease from 07/10/2013 to 06/10/2015 in the compliance. Now, the college authorities are changing their stand 3rd time and they have said that he is Asst. Professor in General Medicine and was transferred to Infectious Diseases as Asst. Professor w.e.f. 07/10/2015.

It clearly shows that the information supplied in compliance is false and amounts to misleading the MCI.

Dr. Vidya P. Menon :

In the Assessment report she was shown Assistant Professor from 08/02/13 to /31/08/2014 (no subject mentioned) and Associate professor from 01/09/2014 to 31/07/2015 in General Medicine/Infectious Diseases (which she can not be in both) and Associate professor from 01/08/2015 in Infectious Diseases. Since, her promotion was not found as per Regulations because she was Asst. Professor for less than 2 years required, the college authorities (to make her promotion as per Regulations) changed here dates retrospectively in the compliance as Asst. Professor in Infectious Disease from 08/02/2013 to 31/07/2015 and Assoc. Professor from 01/08/2015 in Infectious Disease. Now, in the clarification, the Dean has changed his stand again and stated that she was promoted Assoc. Professor in General Medicine w.e.f. 01/08/2015 and posted in Department of Infectious Disease. This obviously is not permissible and amounts to supplying misleading information.

Hepatology:

Dr. Prem Kumar Nair : As per the compliance submitted by the college authorities, Dr. Prem Kumar Nair was shown Asst. Professor in Hepatology from 01/01/2002 to 31/12/2003, Assoc. Professor in Hepatology from 01/01/2004 to 01/05/2011 and Professor in Hepatology from 02/05/2011 till date. Now in the clarification, the institution authorities have said that he was Asst. Professor in Gastroenterology and I/c Hepatology division from January, 2002 to December, 2003; Assoc. Professor in Gastroenterology and I/c Hepatology division from 2004 to 2007 and Professor in Gastroenterology and I/c Hepatology division from 2008 onwards.

Thus, his subject as well as promotion dates have been changed in the clarification. How could his designation be changed as Asst. Professor, Assoc. Professor and Professor in Hepatology when neither the independent department of Hepatology was existing nor Dr. Nair was appointed in Hepatology. This clearly amounts to supplying false and misleading information in the compliance submitted by college authorities. If at all the institution could say that by virtue of the fact that he was looking after Hepatology Division he may be considered eligible for shifting to Hepatology department when it was started in 2011 but he could not be retrospectively designated as Asst. Professor and Assoc. Professor in Hepatology from 2002.

Rheumatology:

Dr. Suman Balan: The college authorities have admitted that Dr. Suman Balan worked as Asst. Professor in Paediatrics from 01/07/2009 to 05/07/2014 and Assoc. Professor in Paediatrics from 06/07/2014 onwards. It is unimaginable that how could she be appointed retrospectively Asst. Professor from 06/07/2009 to 06/07/2011 and Assoc. Professor from 07/07/2011 to 06/07/2015 and Professor from 07/07/2015 onwards in the department of Rheumatology (as per compliance). Now, as per clarification, the college authorities have stated that she was appointed Asst. Professor from 06/07/2009 to 06/07/2011, Assoc. Professor from 07/07/2011 to 06/07/2015 and Professor from 07/07/2015 in Rheumatology. Clearly the experience given in Rheumatology is non-genuine and fabricated and an attempt to mislead MCI.

Paediatric Nephrology:

Dr. Anil Mathew: Contention of the college authorities cannot be accepted. They themselves have accepted that Dr. Anil Mathew worked in Adult Nephrology and appeared in MCI inspections as a faculty working in Adult Nephrology. Now how his experience can be changed w.e.f. 01/08/2007 (9 years retrospectively) to Paediatric Nephrology when neither the department of Paediatric Nephrology was existing in the Institution nor Dr. Anil Mathew ever worked in Paediatric Nephrology from 2007 to August, 2015. The Experience given is clearly non-genuine and an attempt to mislead the MCI.

These are deliberate attempts to mislead the Council & Postgraduate Medical Education Committee decided to refer the matter to Ethics Committee along with the following enclosures:

- (i) Faculty Tables in initial inspection report.
- (ii) Faculty Tables in Compliance submitted by the college authorities.
- (iii) Clarifications sought by the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee from college authorities during personal hearing.
- (iv) Clarifications supplied by college authorities.

The minutes are subject to approval of the Hon'ble Oversight Committee/Govt. of India, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.
